Summary and Analysis

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# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

## About this Report

This report shares the 2021 results of each of Florida's state-approved teacher preparation program's annual progress on established performance measures, as well as each program's current approval status.<sup>1</sup> Programs receive summative score ratings, as well as ratings on five performance metrics: placement rate, retention rate, student performance on state assessments, student subgroup performance on state assessments, and teacher evaluation. Teacher preparation programs educating future teachers in critical shortage subjects may also earn a bonus rating.

Recognizing teacher quality as the in-school factor with the greatest impact on student achievement, Florida has implemented new policies to strengthen teacher preparation and certification in recent years, including:

- **Investing in Florida's teachers**, \$500 million in state funds to raise minimum teacher salaries to an average of \$47,500, and investing another \$50 million to support recruitment and retention of effective educators.
- **Passing two new pieces of legislation in 2021** (House Bill 7011 and House Bill 1159) that will further strengthen the state's commitment to improving teacher preparation and will support the state's bold goal of having 90% of all students performing at or above grade level by the end of grade three on the state's reading and language arts assessment by 2024.
- **Engaging in an audit of teacher preparation programs**, focused on reviewing the current teacher preparation accountability system metrics to identify if programs are currently meeting the demands of Florida's public schools as well as the impact of programs on the production of quality teachers.

## Report Finding Highlights

- **Summative Scores** - Only 105 of 325 programs (32%) have enough performance data to receive a 2021 summative score ranking.
- **Progress Trends** - More programs' summative scores decreased than increased between 2020 and 2021. Twenty programs improved their summative scores, while 29 programs' scores went down.

- **Placement Rate** - 178 of 325 programs (55%) received a placement rate score in 2021. Among the programs receiving a score, the average placement rate score was 2.9, a continuation of the downward trend that began in 2020.
- **Retention Rate** - Only 180 of 325 programs (55%) received a retention rate score for 2021. All but five rated programs received a score of 3.0 or 4.0. The average retention rate was 3.3, down slightly from 3.4 last year.
- **Student Performance** - Just 119 of 325 (37%) programs received a score for student learning growth for 2021. The average program score for performance of students on statewide assessments was 2.87, slightly higher than the average of 2.86 last year.
- **Student Subgroup Performance** - Of the 119 programs receiving a score for student subgroup performance on statewide assessments, the average program score for 2021 was 2.70, reversing a downward trend since 2018.
- **Teacher Evaluations** - 242 of 325 programs (74%) received a teacher evaluation score for 2021. The average teacher evaluation score was 3.79, continuing an upward trend since 2014.
- **Bonus Metric—Critical Shortage Areas** - 23 of 179 eligible programs (13%) received the critical shortage area bonus.

## Recommendations

The recommendations below clearly indicate the need for a significant overhaul of the teacher preparation accountability system to improve the quality of teacher education programs and to ultimately improve outcomes for Florida’s PK-12 students:

- **Increase the number of programs that can be ranked** by addressing the causes of unscored metrics and reevaluating the number of subscores required.
- **Consider alternative weighting formulas** based on evaluation data quality, rigorousness, and differentiation between programs.
- **Rethink the application of the critical shortage area bonus metric** to ensure it is meeting the objective of incentivizing and rewarding the production of the most needed teachers.
- **Modify teacher preparation program accountability system business rules** that may make resulting data less meaningful.
- **Develop and disseminate model surveys** with a set of required items for all programs to meet the new accountability requirement, facilitate implementation, and maximize comparability across programs.
- **Continue to develop a dissemination strategy** that ensures these findings reach the intended audiences.



# INTRODUCTION

For half a century, teacher quality has been recognized as the single in-school factor that has the greatest impact on student achievement. Studies on teacher quality have consistently demonstrated that an effective teacher produces additional student learning gains compared to an average teacher.<sup>2</sup>

According to Chetty, Friedman, and Rockoff,<sup>3</sup> the probability of a student attending college increases for students assigned to an effective teacher in a single grade. Furthermore, teacher preparation and certification have been demonstrated to be the strongest correlates of student achievement in reading and mathematics.<sup>4</sup>

Considering these findings, ensuring that every teacher completes a high-quality teacher preparation program and attains certification is critical to meeting Florida's goals for student achievement and academic success. To that end, the state of Florida has implemented teacher quality policies, including Florida's Teacher Preparation Accountability System, focused on ensuring that every student has an effective teacher every year. Additionally, in the 2020-2021 fiscal year, Florida's leadership made a historic investment of \$500 million in state funds to raise minimum teacher salaries to an average of \$47,500. An additional \$50 million was added in the 2021-2022 school year to support Florida's efforts to recruit and retain the nation's most effective educators.

On January 31, 2019, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 19-32, outlining a path for Florida to improve its education system by eliminating Common Core and paving the way for Florida students to receive a world-class education to prepare them for jobs of the future. In response, the Florida Department of Education undertook an aggressive effort to revise and implement new English language arts and mathematics academic standards. These revised standards, known as Florida's Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking, or B.E.S.T. Standards, were approved by the Florida State Board of Education along with an aggressive three-year

implementation plan that ensures that all B.E.S.T. Standards are fully implemented and new assessments to measure their success are in place by 2023. Since that time, the Florida Department of Education has developed and delivered summer institutes and other professional learning opportunities to equip K-12 educators with literacy instructional practices grounded in the Science of Reading as they transitioned to the B.E.S.T. Standards in the 2021-2022 school year. These efforts are continuing as the state prepares to expand implementation of the B.E.S.T. English language arts and mathematics standards to all grade levels in the 2021-2022 school year.

Additionally, Florida has prioritized literacy development since the State Board of Education in November 2019 established a bold goal to have 90% of all Florida students performing at or above grade level by the end of grade three on Florida's state assessment for reading and English language arts by 2024. This commitment to improving reading and literacy skills has been further cemented following a slight decline in Grades 3-10 English Language Arts (ELA) scores on spring 2021 yearend assessments. To combat these declines and ensure that the goal is met, Florida has invested in establishing regional literacy directors and teams to support districts and schools in meeting the needs of their most vulnerable students.

With the passage of House Bills 7011 and 1159 in the 2021 legislative session, Florida has taken steps to further strengthen the state's commitment to high-quality teacher preparation and improving literacy outcomes for students. House Bill 7011 introduces the required completion of the state's reading endorsement in certain program areas<sup>5</sup> of all teacher preparation programs, revises qualifications for district personnel supervising these programs, and modifies entry requirements for Initial Teacher Preparation Programs (ITPs). Additionally, House Bill 1159 expands options for the Florida Department of Education to issue a professional certificate, modifies the Uniform Core Curricula (UCC), requires Educator Preparation Institutes (EPIs) to expand training to district personnel, and permits certain qualifications to satisfy the Professional Educational Test requirement.

This report is presented to fulfill the requirement of Section 1004.04, Florida Statutes, detailed in the State Board of Education Rule 6A-5.006, Florida Administrative Code. This rule requires the Florida Department of Education to report the results of each approved teacher preparation program's annual progress on established performance measures<sup>6</sup> as well as each program's current approval status. In accordance with the statute, this report must be made available to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the State Board of Education, the Board of Governors, the Commissioner of Education, Florida teacher preparation programs, school district superintendents, and the general public. As the 2021 edition, this report generally reflects data corresponding to teacher preparation program completers employed in the 2018 – 2019 school year. It provides comparative data<sup>7</sup> from Florida's Teacher Preparation Accountability System to support

programs in efforts to continuously improve their content, delivery, and outcomes and to inform policymakers and consumers, including school districts and prospective teacher candidates, about individual program strengths and weaknesses. This report also includes an analysis of the Florida Teacher Certification Examination (FCTE) performance data on the Elementary Education Examination and its subtests. FCTE performance data for other subject areas with significant numbers of teacher candidates are also provided.

No statutory or regulatory changes that directly impact teacher preparation programs and how their performance is measured have been enacted since the last report; however, the Florida Department of Education has continued to engage programs in understanding the B.E.S.T. Standards and the changes required of teacher preparation programs by House Bills 7011 and 1159.

This report provides a brief overview of teacher preparation in Florida and the state's Teacher Preparation Accountability System, followed by:

- Summative findings ranking the overall performance of programs with sufficient data;
- Analysis of each metric used to measure program performance;
- Recommendations for further developing and enhancing the accountability system for consideration by Florida policymakers; and
- Analysis of the FTCE data.

# TEACHER PREPARATION IN FLORIDA

There are three types of state-approved programs for new teacher certification in Florida: Initial Teacher Preparation Programs (ITPs), Educator Preparation Institutes (EPIs), and Professional Development Certification Programs (PDCPs).

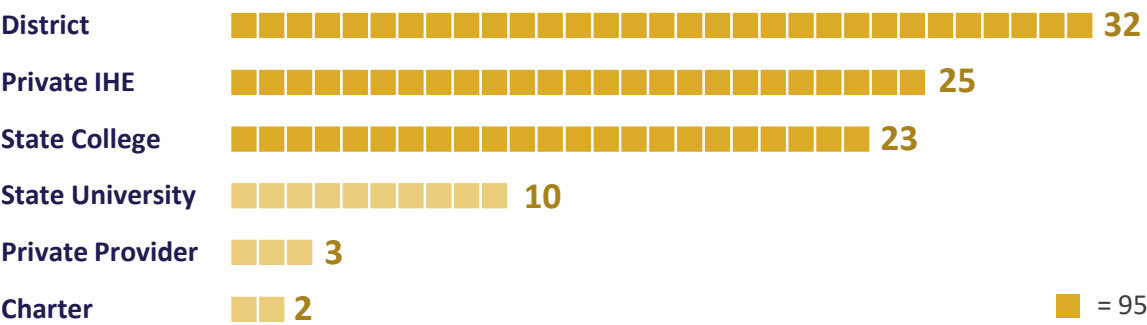
**Initial Teacher Preparation Programs** are offered at postsecondary institutions and typically culminate in a bachelor's or master's degree. This is the more traditional pathway to a teaching license.

**Educator Preparation Institutes** provide an alternate route to educator licensure for prospective teachers including career changers and college graduates who already hold a bachelor's degree. EPI candidates may work as teachers of record while earning their full certification. EPIs are provided by postsecondary institutions and private providers.

**Professional Development Certification Programs** are an alternate route offered by school districts, charter schools and charter management organizations that allow teachers with temporary licenses to work as teachers of record while earning their full certification.

In 2021 there were 95 providers of teacher preparation programs in Florida. Per Rule 6A-5.066, Florida Administrative Code, eligible providers of teacher preparation programs are Florida postsecondary institutions, private providers, school districts, charter schools, and charter school management organizations. Of the 95 providers, 32 districts and two charter schools run their own PDCPs. Most other providers are institutions of higher education (IHEs), including 33 public IHEs and 25 private IHEs. There are also three non-IHE private providers.

Florida has 398<sup>9</sup> teacher preparation programs. Thirty-two are offered by local school districts, 70 by the Florida College System, 171 by the State University System, 120 by private IHEs, three by private providers, and two by charter school systems. Of the 398 included programs, 26 are EPIs and 32 are district-run PDCPs. The majority of programs in the state, 338, are ITPs. Twelve institutions provide both EPIs and at least one ITP: Broward College, Daytona State College, Florida Gulf Coast University, Florida State College at Jacksonville, Indian River State College, Miami Dade College, Polk State College, Saint Leo University, St. Johns River State College, St. Petersburg College, University of Florida, and University of West Florida.

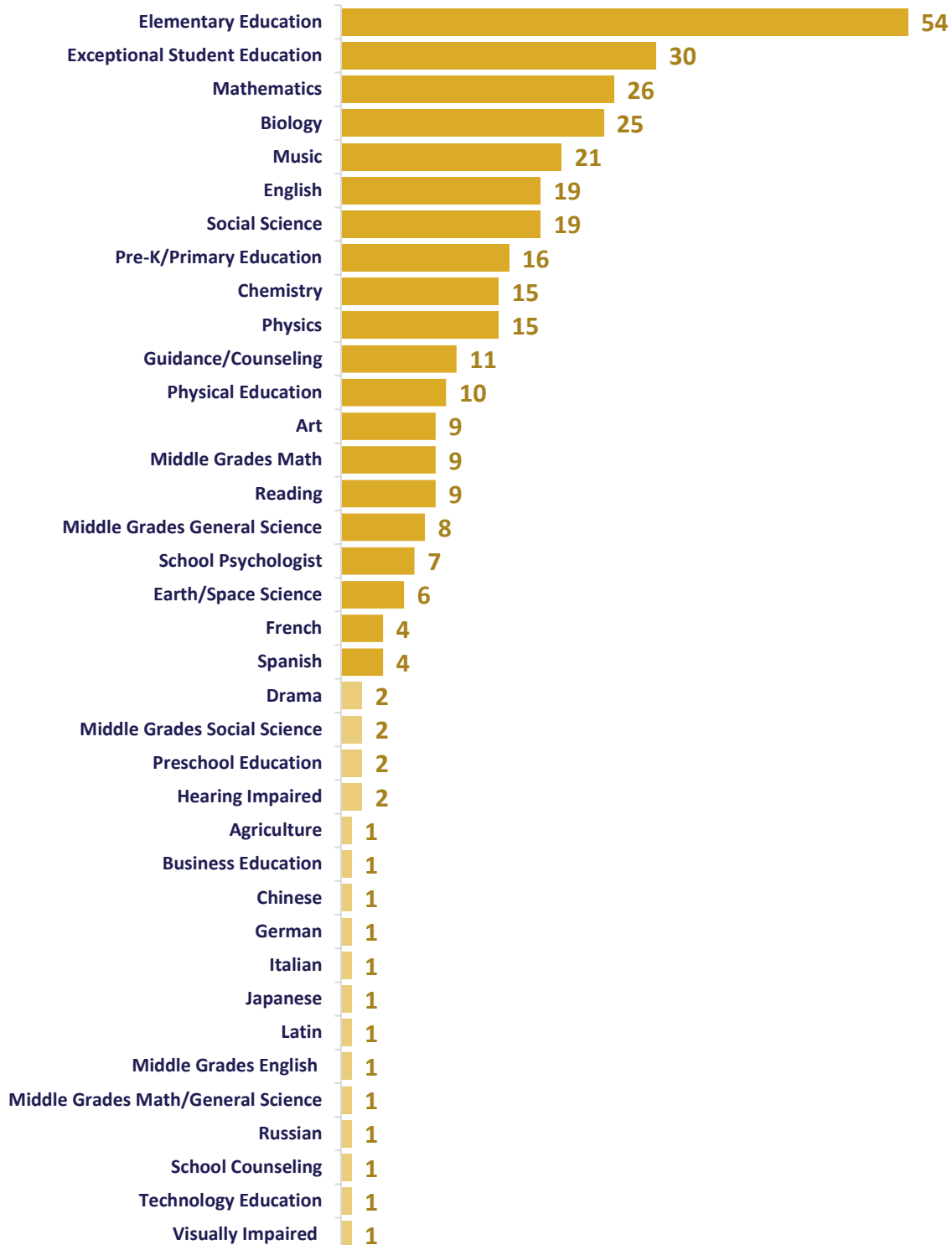

## Florida's Teacher Preparation Accountability System

Florida sets and holds programs to performance standards as outlined in Florida statute and State Board of Education rule with the goal of improving teacher preparedness and ultimately leading to increased outcomes for Florida's students. The state publishes annual reports on individual preparation programs and their performance against these standards. Importantly, Florida evaluates providers at the program level as institutional scores can mask individual program performance in the aggregate. Program-level scores reported by the state<sup>10</sup> allow prospective students and school districts to make more informed choices. Institutions are also provided annual continuous improvement information.

To measure program performance, the Florida Department of Education annually reviews the following data for each program, in accordance with Section 1004.04(4)(a), Florida Statutes:

- Placement rate of program completers into instructional positions in Florida public schools.
- Retention rate for employed program completers in instructional positions in Florida public schools.<sup>11</sup>
- Performance of students in PK through Grade 12 who are assigned to in-field program completers on statewide assessments using the results of Florida's student learning growth formula.
- Performance of students in PK through Grade 12 who are assigned to in-field program completers aggregated by student subgroup.
- Results of program completers' annual teacher evaluations.
- Production of program completers in statewide critical teacher shortage areas.

The Annual Program Performance Report (APPR) is a yearly public report card issued by the Florida Department of Education for state-approved teacher preparation programs that include the performance metrics outlined in section 1004.04, F.S., in Figure 6. Programs receive a performance level score ranging from 1 (lowest) to 4 (highest) for the first 5 performance metrics. In addition, programs can receive bonus points for producing program completers in statewide critical teacher shortage areas.<sup>12</sup> Each APPR report provides a summative rating score, between 1 and 4, that is an average of the first 5 performance level scores received. If the program is eligible for the critical teacher shortage area bonus, the summative rating score is calculated by multiplying the bonus score of 4 by 0.2 and adding it to the product of 0.8 and average of all other scores.

Teacher preparation programs in Florida are granted an initial program approval for a period of seven years. At the end of this period, a Continued Approval Summative Score (CASS) is calculated for each program, consisting of three components. The first component is the average of all annual APPR summative rating scores within the current approval period. The second consists of scores from the Continued Approval Site Visit, conducted in the final year of the initial approval period. The third and final component is the score from an Evidence of Programmatic Improvement Rating, which is based on progress towards goals set in a provider's improvement plan. The final score is determined by weighting the APPR Average Summative Rating 50%, the Continued Approval Site Visit Rating 20%, and the Evidence of Programmatic Improvement Rating 30%. Full approval is granted to programs achieving a score of 2.4 or greater, with those 3.5 or greater receiving full approval with distinction.

Satisfaction surveys of program completers and their employers is a program approval requirement added in 2019 through the legislative process. Program completers are asked to provide feedback on their satisfaction with the preparation for the realities of the classroom. Employers provide feedback on their satisfaction with the program and the program's responsiveness to local school districts.

In January 2020, teacher preparation programs submitted their plans for these surveys, including timeline, desired response rate, and a description of how the surveys would be used for program improvement. In November 2020, a process was established for teacher preparation programs to submit their survey templates, their completed forms and a summary and analysis of the feedback, including any actions to be taken as a result of the findings. These submissions are reviewed annually by the Florida Department of Education, and feedback is provided to programs when necessary. The Florida Department of Education will develop recommendations for State Board of Education consideration about how to incorporate the survey results into the continued program approval process and formula. When that has been determined, the survey data will be included, as appropriate, in future editions of this report.

## Teacher Preparation Programs Audit

Based on the findings and recommendations in this report, there is evidence for a significant overhaul of the teacher preparation accountability system to improve the quality of teacher education programs and to ultimately improve outcomes for Florida's PK-12 students. In order to achieve this goal, Florida is engaged in an audit of Florida's teacher preparation programs, evaluating the following:

- An analysis of Florida's state-approved teacher preparation programs to understand if they are currently meeting the demands of Florida's public schools.
- An analysis of Florida's state-approved teacher preparation programs to understand their impact on the production of quality teachers.

- An analysis of Florida's teacher preparation accountability system to ensure metrics identify strengths and opportunities for programs to improve.
- A review to determine and reevaluate the impact of the initial and continued approval processes for Florida's state-approved teacher preparation programs.

# 2021 FLORIDA TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAM PERFORMANCE

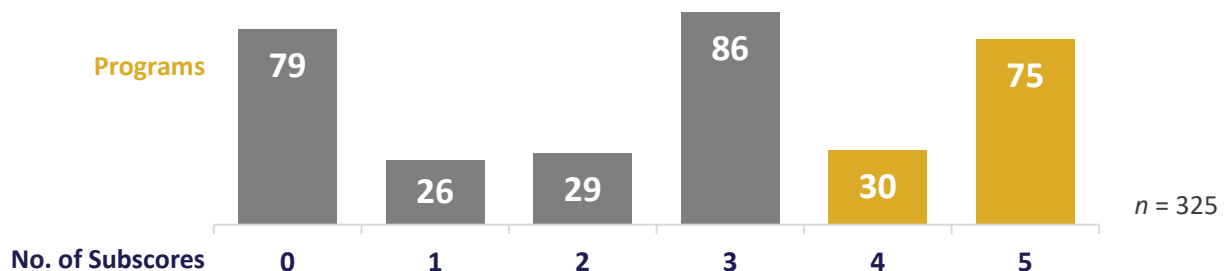
## FINDING

**Only 105 out of 325 programs (32%) have enough performance data to receive a 2021 ranking.**

As previously noted, in some instances similar programs within an institution are combined to increase the amount of available performance data that can be considered. These aggregations result in the analysis of 325 programs in this report. (See Appendix B for program aggregations.)

For the purposes of this report, programs must have a minimum of four subscores to be ranked. Only 105 programs have the minimum of four subscores necessary for their summative ratings and resulting rankings to be presented here. Thus, rankings are provided for just 32% of analyzed programs. This is an increase from last year's report, in which only 22% of programs had at least four subscores. This relatively low percentage of 32 is due in large part to the lack of student growth data for teachers in many programs. In prior versions of this report, no student growth data for EPIs and PDCPs were available. However, for this year, 34 EPIs and PDCPs have at least four subscores, including a rating for the student growth measure, and are thus included in the 2021 rankings. The Florida Department of Education elected to require at least four subscores, so programs with associated student performance measures are highlighted.

**FINDING**

Five programs share the top ranking in the state of Florida for 2021: (1) Elementary Education/ESOL/Reading at Flagler College, (2) Elementary Education/ESOL and Elementary Education/ESOL/Reading at Florida Atlantic University, (3) Elementary Education/ESOL/Reading at Florida Southwestern State College, (4) Middle Grades Mathematics and Middle Grades Mathematics (MAT) at University of South Florida, and (5) Middle Grades Math/Middle Grades General Science at University of North Florida.

Full program ratings, including all subscores, can be found in Appendix C. The average summative rating for ranked programs in 2021 is 3.1, which is the same as in 2020. The average summative rating score for the four years preceding 2020 was 3.0. Prior reports have noted that some of the largest programs in the state generally have below average performance ratings. In 2021, four of the five largest programs are below the state average summative rating of 3.1. However, the fourth largest program, Elementary Education/ESOL/Reading and Elementary Education/ESOL (aggregated programs) at Florida Atlantic University, has a higher than average summative rating of 3.8, and has maintained a rank of one since 2020.

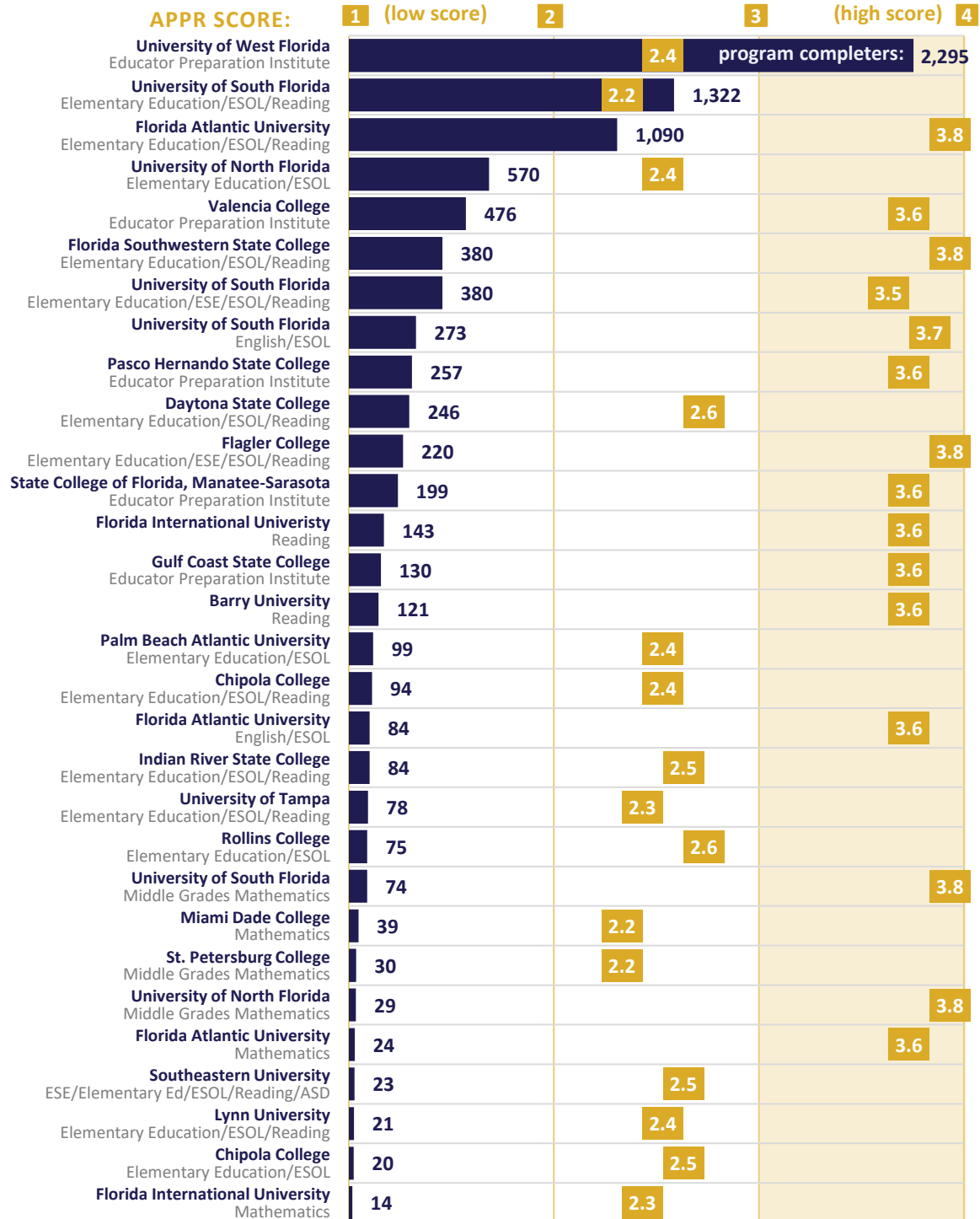

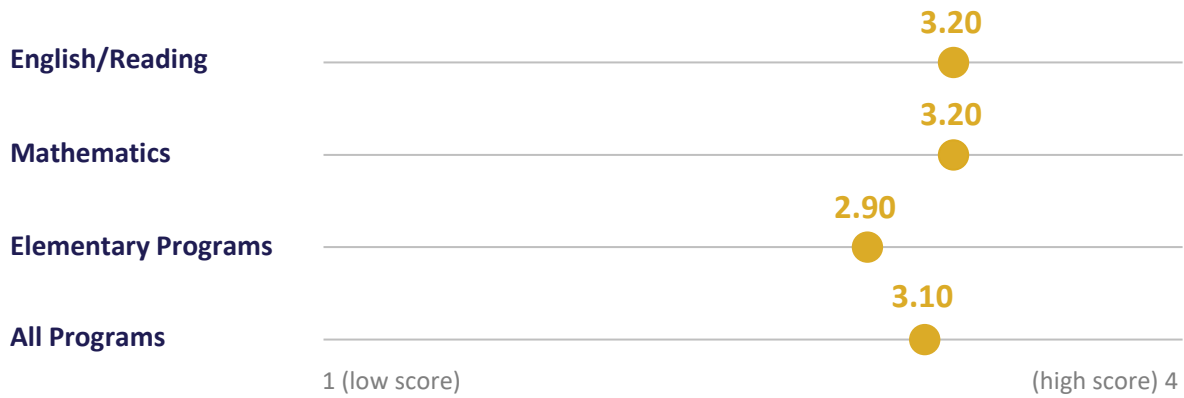

**Average Summative Score by Program Type 2021**

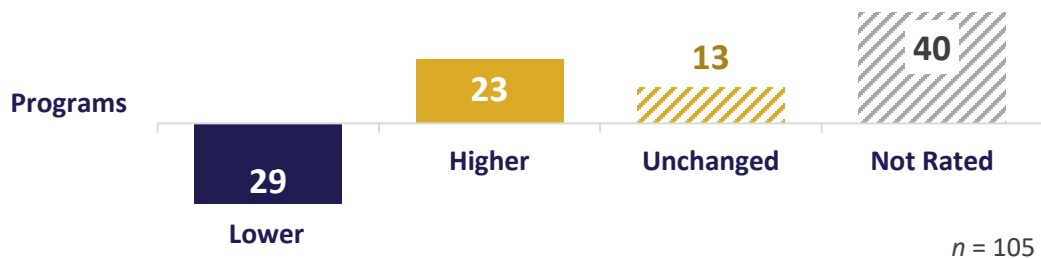


## Progress Trends

### FINDING

**Elementary/ESOL/Reading at Florida Southwestern State College had the greatest increase in summative score, rising from a 2.8 in 2020 to a 3.8 this year. Middle Grades Mathematics at St. Petersburg College had the greatest decrease of any program, dropping from a 3.4 in 2020 to a 2.2 in 2021.**

# ANALYSIS OF PERFORMANCE METRICS

## Performance Metric 1—Placement Rate

Placement rate is defined as the number of program completers reported annually as employed in a full-time or part-time instructional position in a Florida public school district in either the first or second academic year subsequent to program completion.

In general, a high placement rate may indicate that program completers have little difficulty finding employment. A low placement rate may indicate that there is little demand for the new teachers produced by a given program. This could be a reflection of the perceived quality of new teachers trained by that program or could result from little demand in general for teachers of particular grades and subjects or regional variations in hiring. Additionally, a low placement rate may indicate that a program’s completers are working as teachers out of state or in private schools or other settings that are not tracked by their institutions. Institutions have the option to complete forms for the inclusion of out-of-state and privately employed completers, but not all choose to do this.

The implicit differences in demand for certain types of teachers are addressed in the scoring of this metric by comparing each program's placement rate to the average placement rate for all programs producing teachers of those grades and subjects. For example, programs producing elementary teachers are compared to the average placement rate for elementary teachers; programs producing secondary mathematics teachers are compared to the average placement rate for secondary mathematics teachers.

FINDING

178 out of 325 programs (55%) received a placement rate score for 2021. Among the programs receiving a score, the average placement rate score was 2.9, a continuation of the downward trend that began in 2020.

Average Placement Rate Score 2014-2021

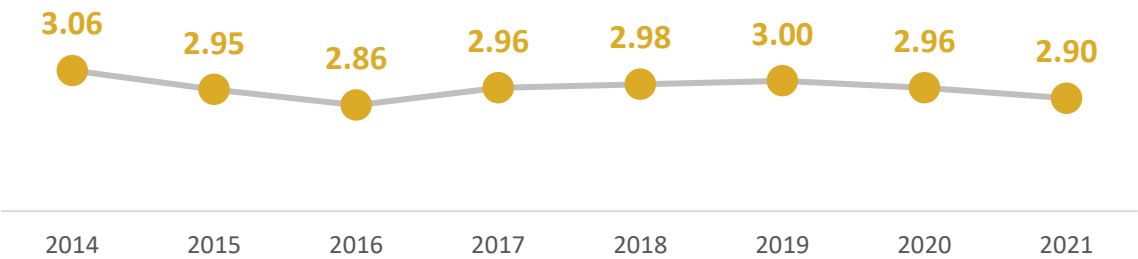
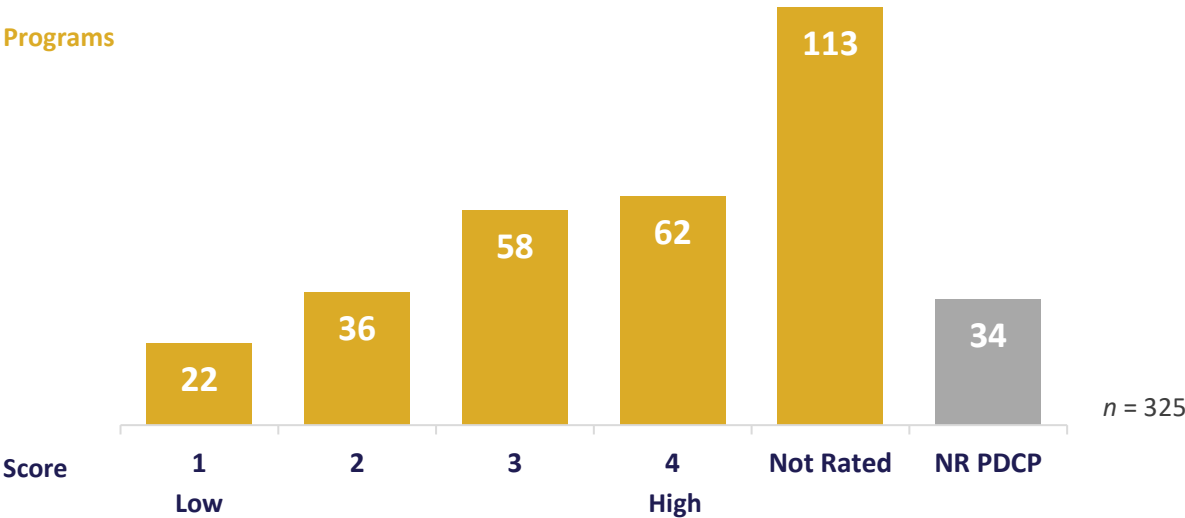

Placement rate is not applicable to PDCPs, since candidates in these programs are already employed as teachers. This contributes to the high percentage of programs not rated on this metric, but 113 non-PDCPs are also not rated. The percentage of non-PDCP programs not rated increased this year to 34% from 33% in 2020.

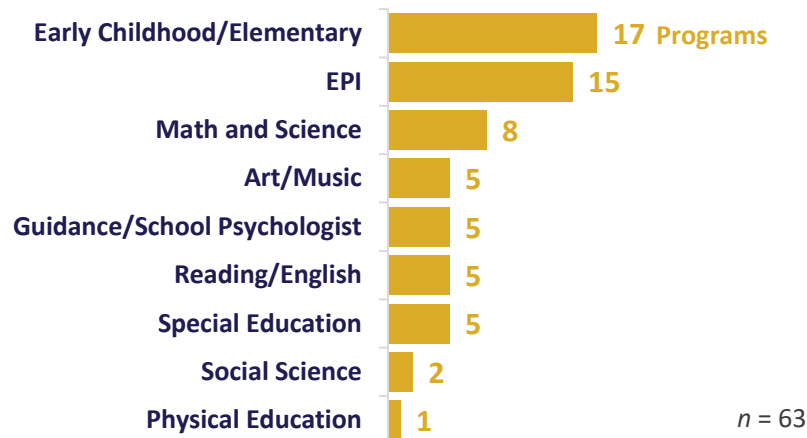

All of the 63 programs that received the highest score for new teacher placement placed at least ten teachers. Interestingly, given the national focus on the need for more STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) teachers, the average placement rate of programs producing these teachers is 2.81, lower than the average placement rate of all programs (2.90).

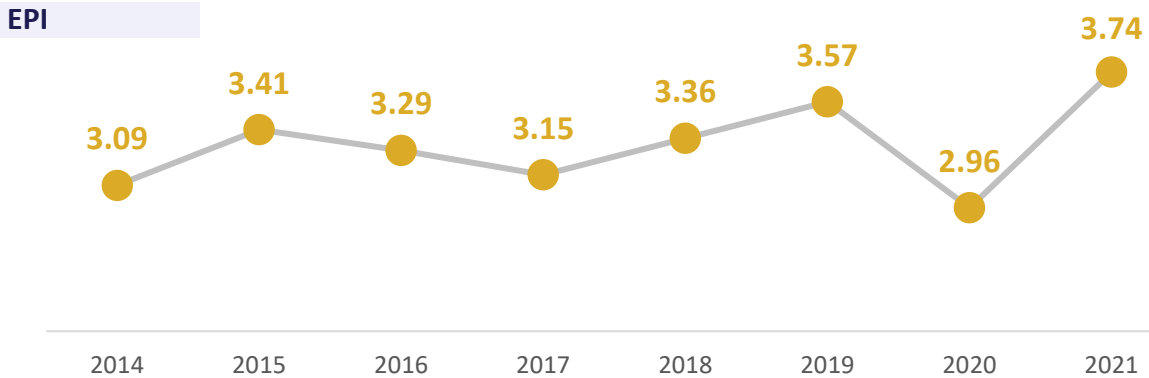

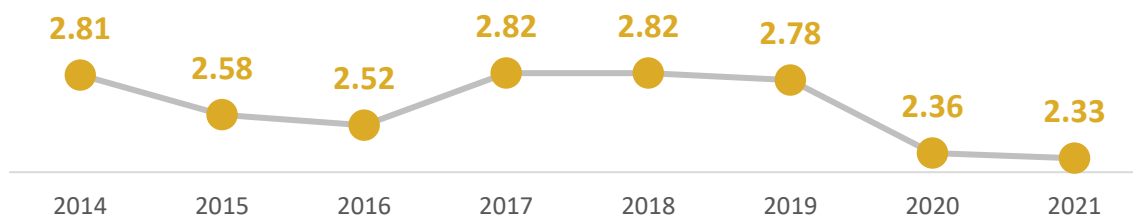
**Exhibit 22**  
**Subject Matter of Programs Receiving Highest Placement Scores**



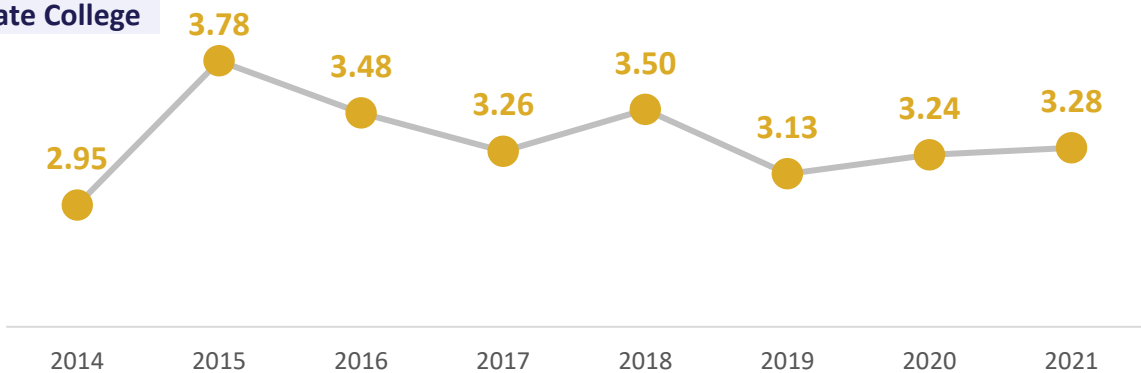
**Exhibit 23**  
**Average Score for Placement Rate by Program Type 2014-2021**



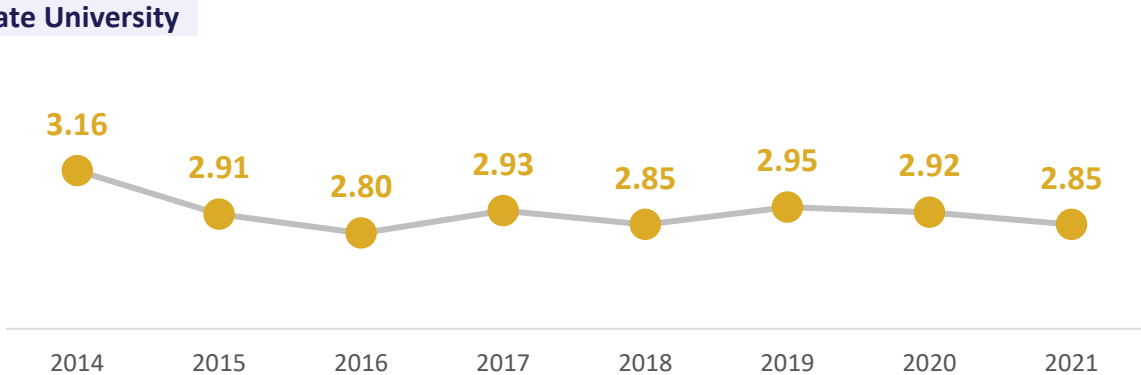

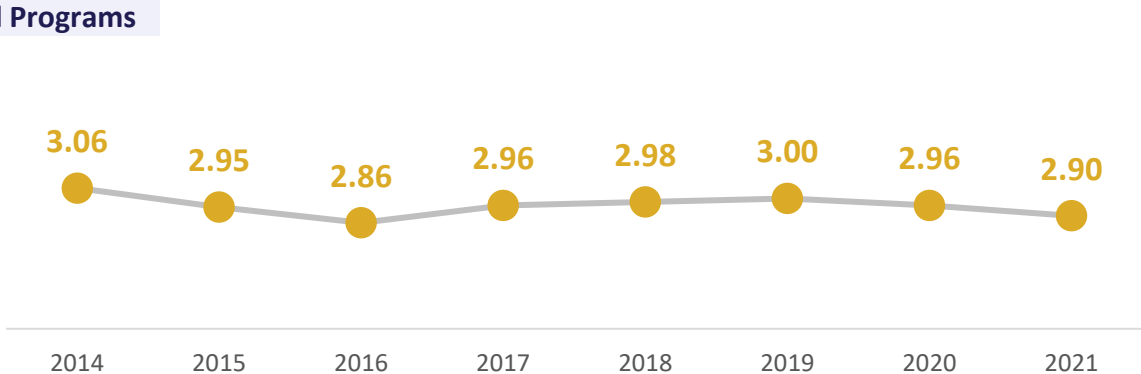
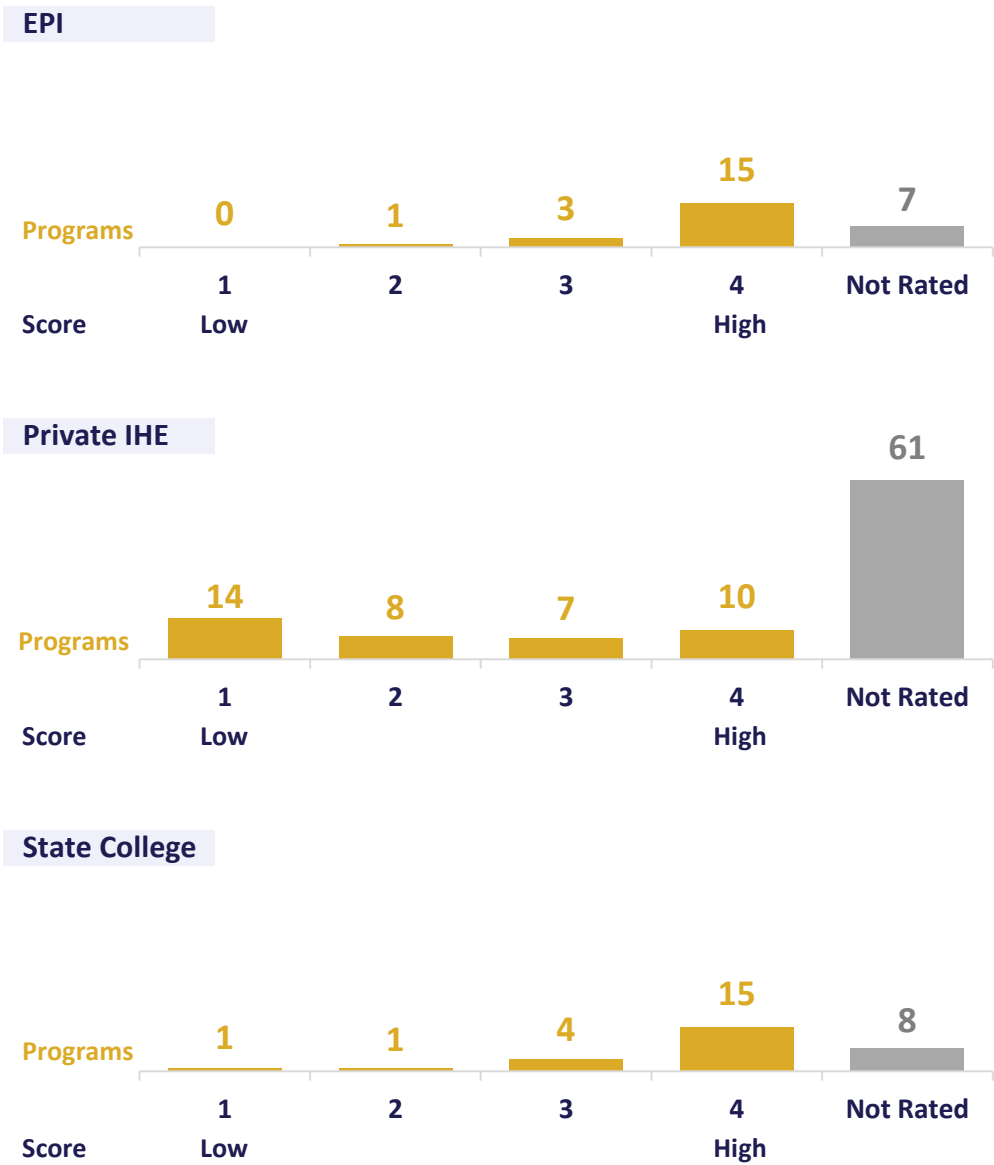
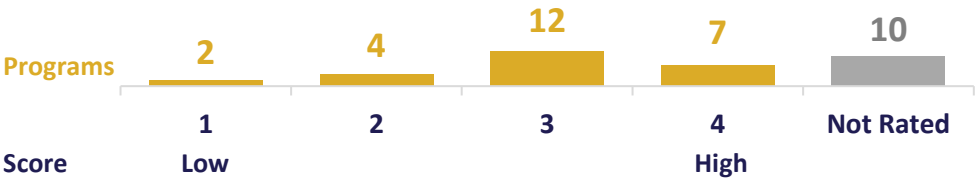




Exhibit 24

Initial teacher preparation programs at private colleges and universities account for almost a quarter of programs not receiving a rating on this metric.

Performance Metric 2—Retention Rate

Retention rate is defined as the average number of years that program completers are employed in a full-time or part-time instructional position in a Florida public school district at any point each year in a five-year period following initial employment in either of the two subsequent academic years after program completion.

Retention rate is an important complement to placement rate, in that it goes beyond looking at whether new teachers get hired to evaluating whether they stay in the classroom. Nationally, new teacher attrition is a chronic concern, particularly in high-needs schools. While there are certainly factors beyond the quality of preparation that impact teacher turnover, research has shown that some aspects of the education and preparation that beginning teachers received are significantly associated with their attrition.

Only 180 out of 325 programs (55%) received a retention rate score for 2021. All but five rated programs received a score of 3.0 or 4.0. The average retention rate score was 3.28, down slightly from 3.4 last year.

Average Retention Rate Score 2014-2021

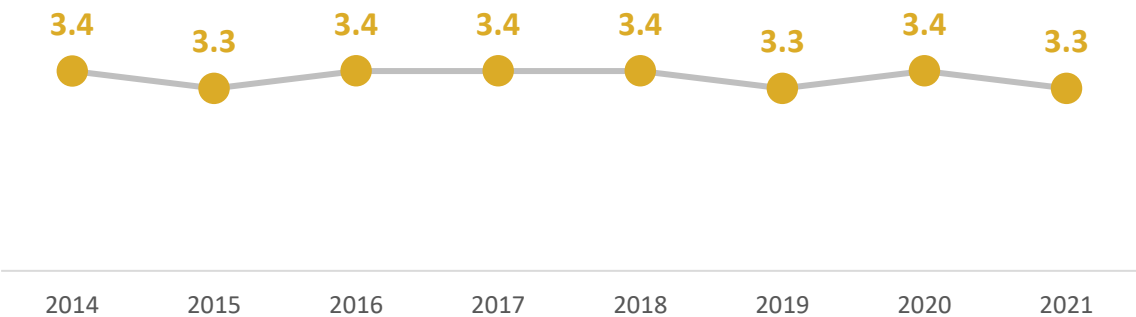

Distribution of Retention Rate Scores

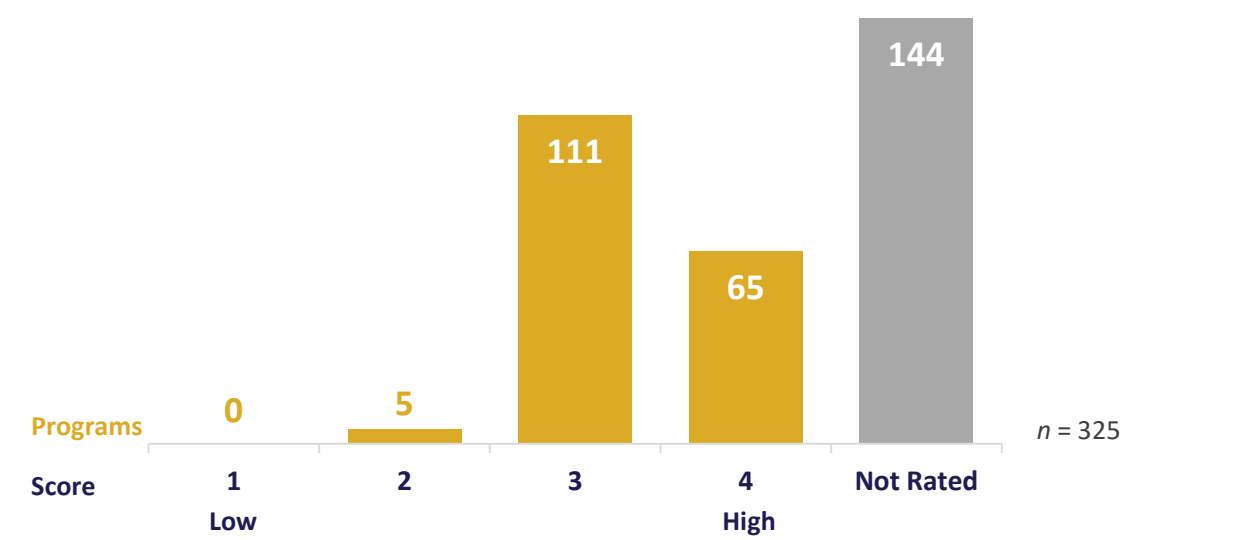

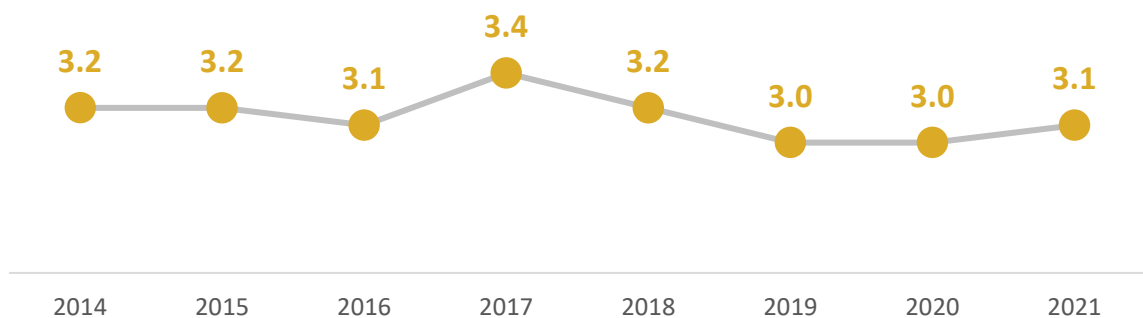

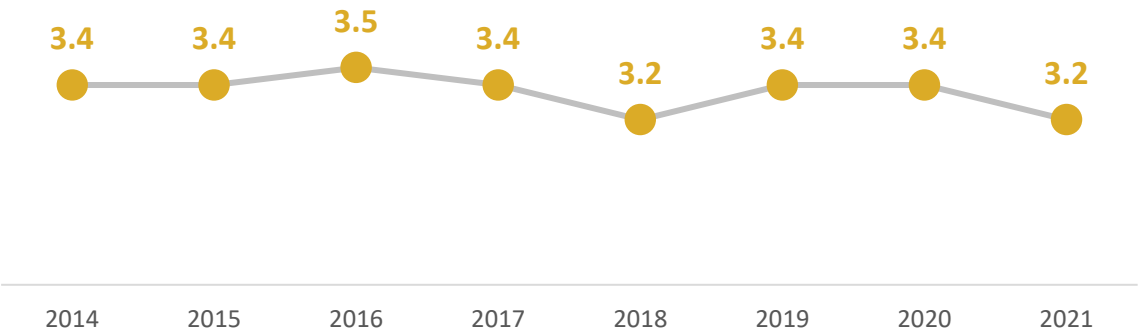

**Average Score for Retention Rate by Program Type**

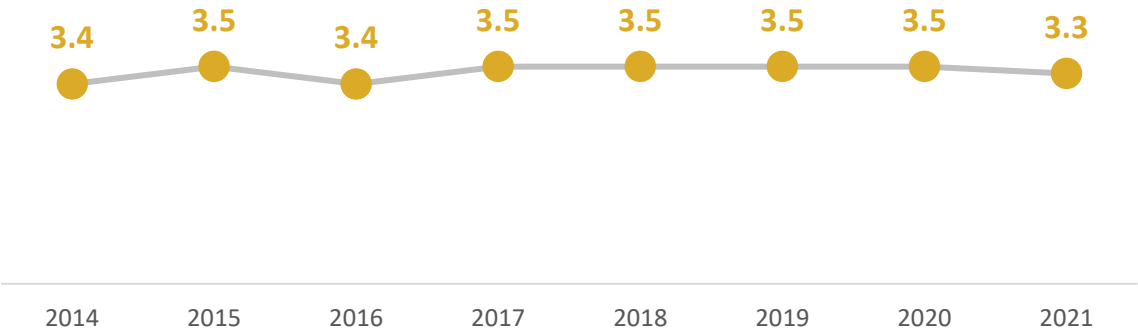

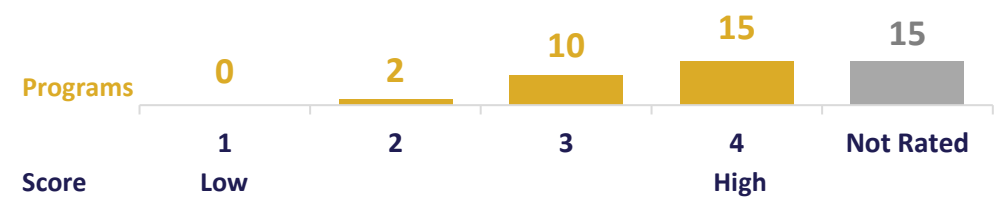
EPIs lag behind other programs in terms of average retention scores. EPIs score highly on placement, presumably because many candidates are already teachers of record. Yet, their retention scores are lower. Only two EPI programs, Daytona State College and Santa Fe College, received a 4.0 rating on this metric.



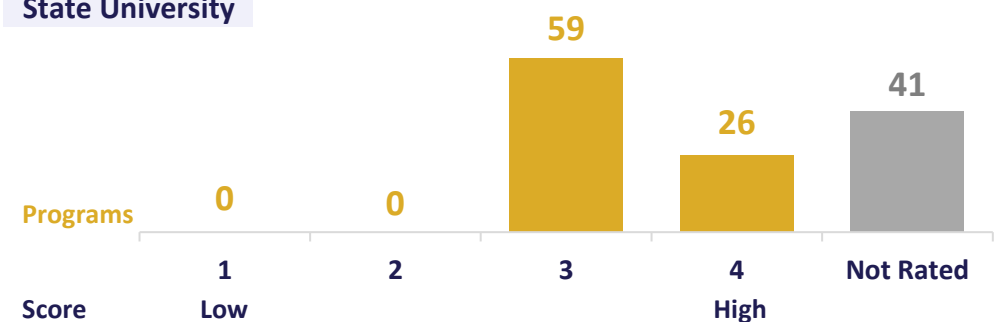

Even with the slight downward trend on this metric in 2021, Florida continues to have a much lower rate of new teacher attrition than nationally,<sup>14</sup> which generally indicate that 8% of teachers leave the profession every year with younger teachers and those early in their careers the most likely to leave. The Florida Department of Education should continue to monitor teacher retention data to assess whether this downward trend continues and what actions might be needed to recruit, prepare, and retain teachers through these challenges.

High performance ratings on this metric do not appear to result from a low bar in scoring. To earn a score of 4.0, programs must have average retention among their completers of 4.5 out of five years, which appears to set a rigorous standard.

The available data for this metric indicate that very high percentages of new teachers continue to work in Florida public schools after five years, suggesting that Florida preparation programs do an excellent job preparing teachers who continue to teach in the state. However, data on retention rate continue to be unavailable for many programs, which if included might result in a distribution that more closely resembles the national narrative about new teacher attrition.

As suggested in the 2020 report, the Florida Department of Education should consider further exploration of available data to determine whether some programs have been particularly

successful preparing teachers who are retained in their initial positions, rather than teachers who have had multiple positions in different schools and/or districts. Additionally, further analyses to identify specific components of programs that have successfully produced teachers who remain in the profession might also be useful to other teacher preparation providers in Florida and nationally. This deeper analysis would be helpful to the broader field, considering that the data seem to indicate that Florida has successfully addressed an issue that continues to be a national challenge. Further exploration of the lower performance of EPIs and PDCPs compared to other programs should also be considered, since the current performance of these programs is unexpected considering that these candidates hold teaching positions when they begin their preparation programs.

### **Performance Metric 3— Performance of PK–Grade 12 Students on Statewide Assessments**

This metric evaluates the extent to which program completers achieve learning gains for their students once they are new teachers in the classroom. Performance of new teachers' students is assessed through the student learning growth formula that is outlined in Section 1012.34, Florida Statutes.

The teacher preparation program accountability system looks at new teacher classroom performance through three specific lenses: student learning gains as measured in this indicator; student learning gains for specific student subgroups (see Performance Metric 4); and overall teacher evaluation results, which include classroom observations and student learning performance, as well as other measures used by districts (see Performance Metric 5).

Student learning growth scores are calculated through a value-added model (VAM), designed to measure the amount a teacher contributes to student learning. Florida's VAM model calculates a score for each teacher that reflects the average amount of learning growth of the teacher's students above or below the expected learning gains of similar students in the state.

Program scores for this metric are based on the performance of students assigned to in-field program completers from the previous three-year period who received a student learning growth score from the most recent academic year for which results are available. The scores of all such program completers are averaged. The score for this metric takes into account both the average student learning growth score and the confidence interval, which considers the margin of error associated with that score.

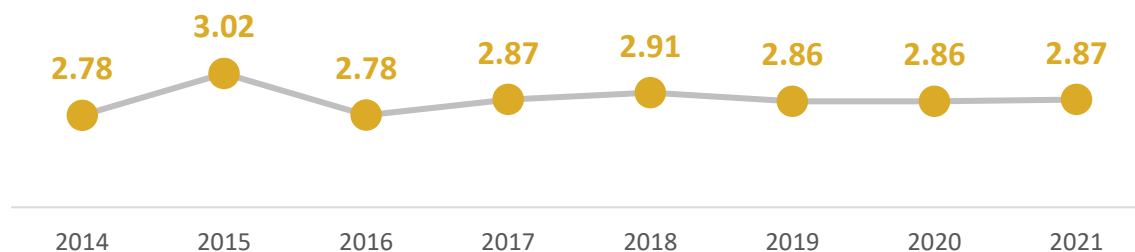
Not all initial teacher preparation programs will have student learning growth scores. Only programs whose completers teach courses that have associated statewide assessments in English language arts (grades four – ten), mathematics (grades four – eight) and algebra 1 will have the scores needed to evaluate this performance metric.

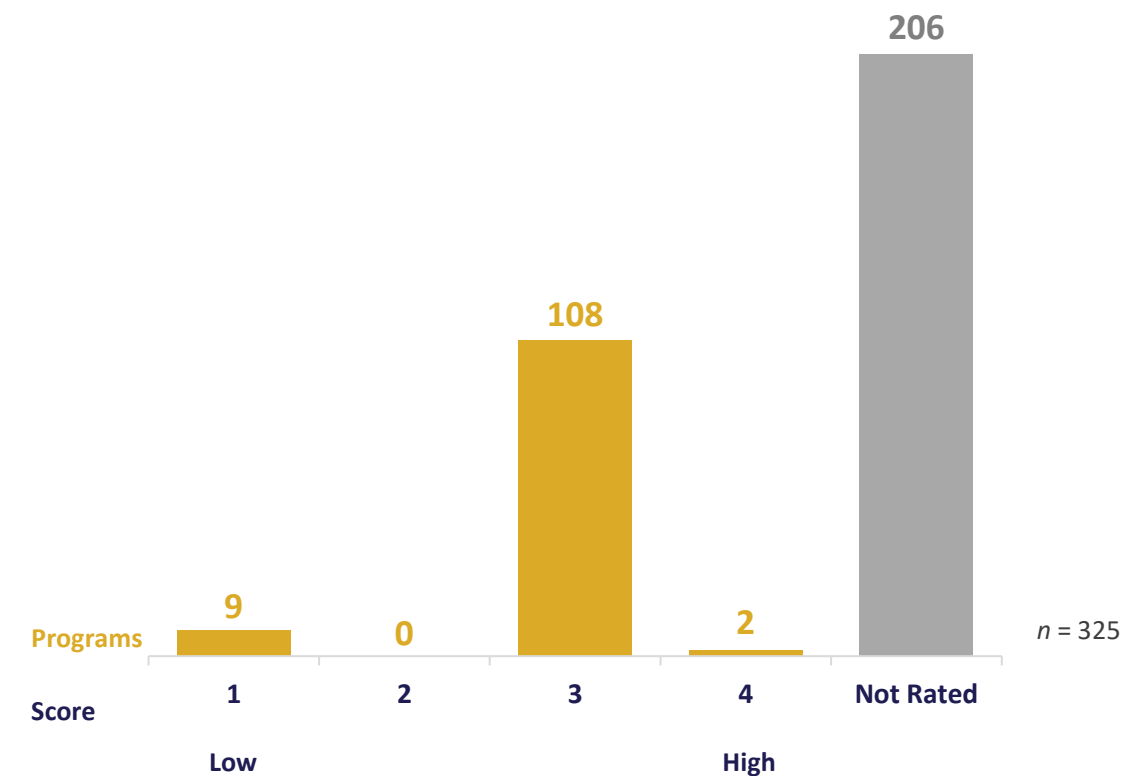
**Just 119 of 325 (37%) programs received a score for student learning growth for 2021. The average program score for performance of students on statewide assessments was 2.87, slightly higher than the average of 2.86 last year.**

**Distribution of Performance by Students on Statewide Assessments Scores**



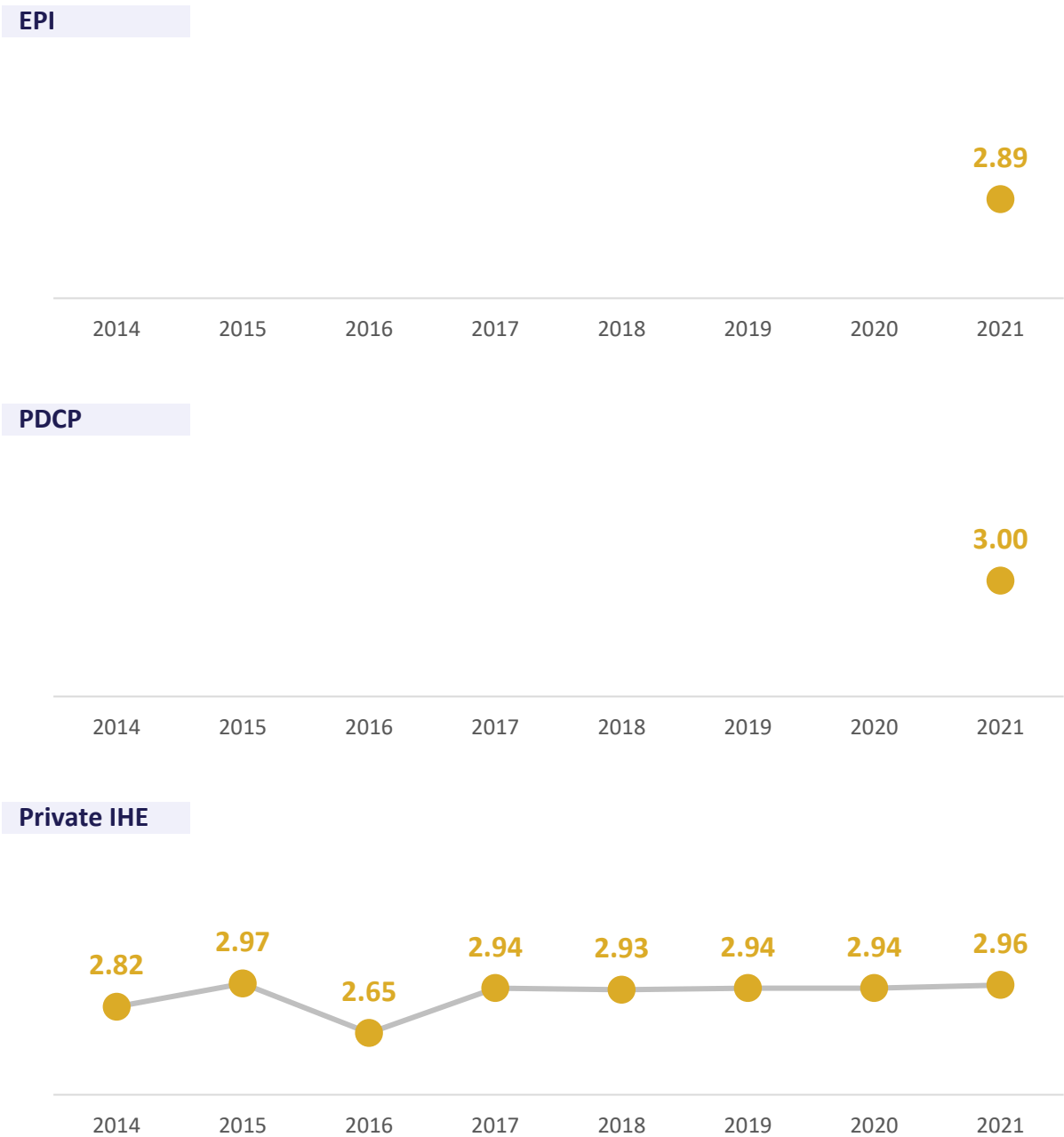
Most of the 193 initial teacher preparation programs that are not rated are in subject areas where there are no statewide assessments. Twenty of these programs are in subject areas including English and mathematics where corresponding statewide assessment data would be expected, although new teachers from these programs may be teaching grade levels in which no such assessment is given, or programs may not have the required minimum of two completers to receive a score on this metric. Of particular concern is that only one program primarily focused on exceptional student education has a score for this metric, even though students with disabilities are expected to meet the same standards as typical students, and all but a small percentage of students with disabilities are expected to take statewide assessments.

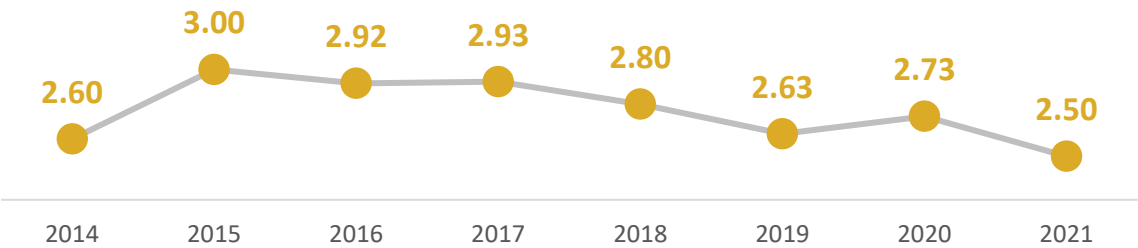

**Average Score for Student Learning Growth by Program Type 2014-2021**

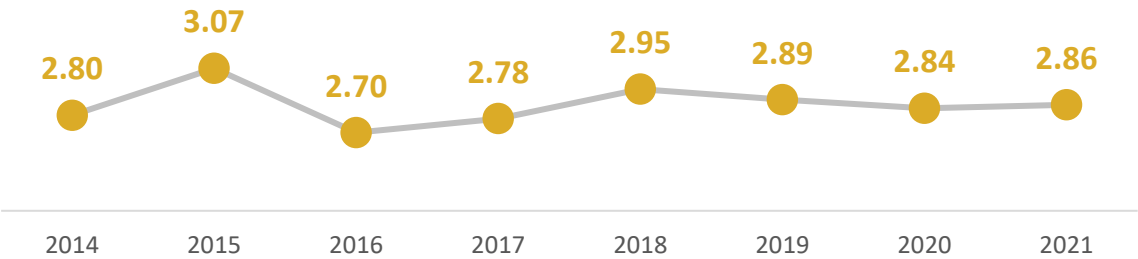

Distribution of Student Learning Growth Scores by Program Type

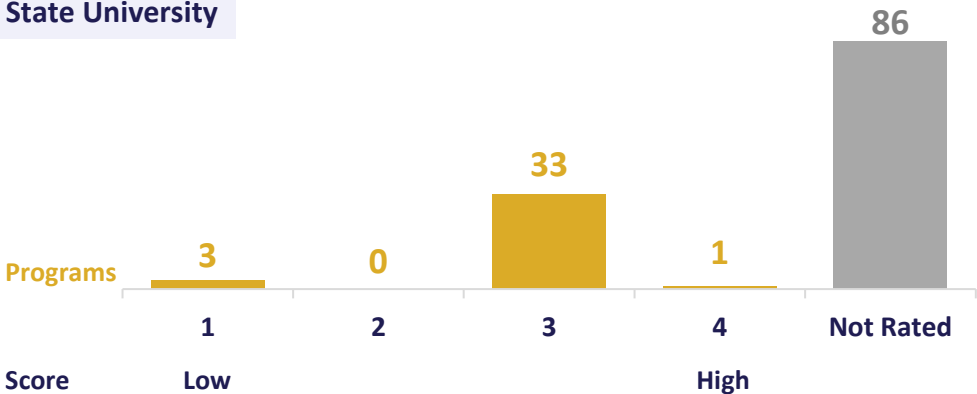

Performance Metric 4—  
Performance of Student Subgroups on Statewide Assessments

This metric considers a different aspect of teachers’ contributions to student learning, specifically the performance of student subgroups. The intent is to measure how well the teacher preparation program prepares new teachers to work with a diverse population of students in a variety of settings in Florida schools, including economically disadvantaged students, students from major racial and ethnic groups, students with disabilities, and students with limited English proficiency.

To calculate the learning gains of students by subgroup, teacher VAM scores are calculated and disaggregated for the following categories: Caucasian, African American, Hispanic, Asian, Native American, Multi-racial, students eligible for free or reduced lunch, students with disabilities, and English language learners. Unlike the previous metric, scoring for the performance of student subgroups is not based on actual VAM scores. Rather, this metric considers the average student learning growth results by each subgroup as compared to the statewide average for these subgroups for all program completers with VAM scores. These percentages are compared to the statewide percentages to determine the number of subgroups that met expectation or exceeded the statewide average to arrive at the program score.

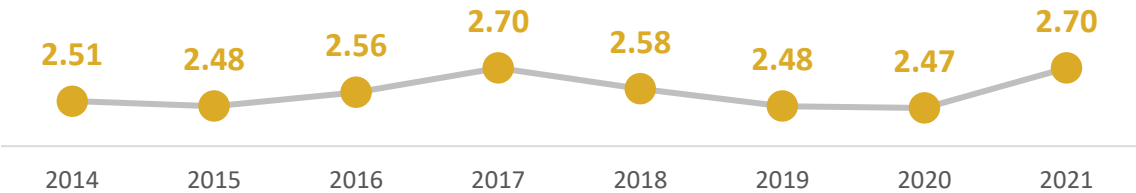

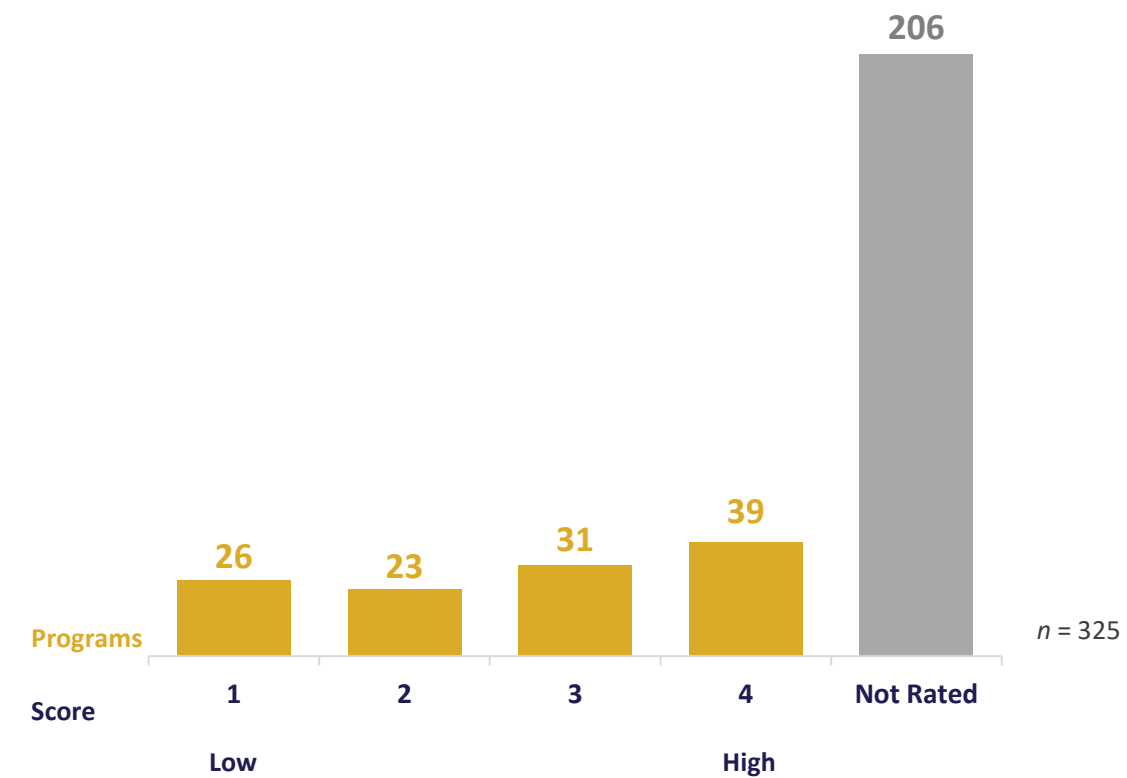

Distribution of Subgroup Student Learning Growth Scores by Program Type

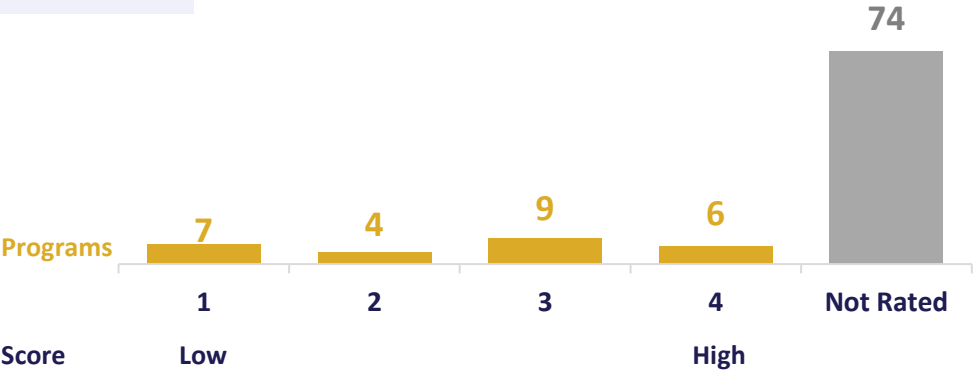

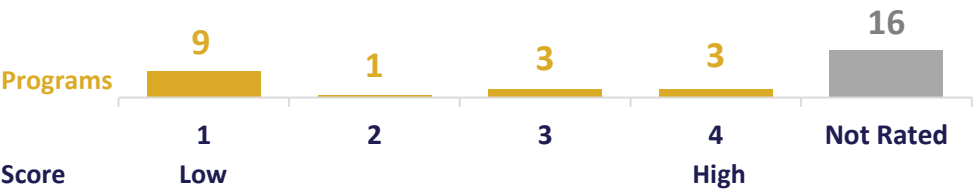

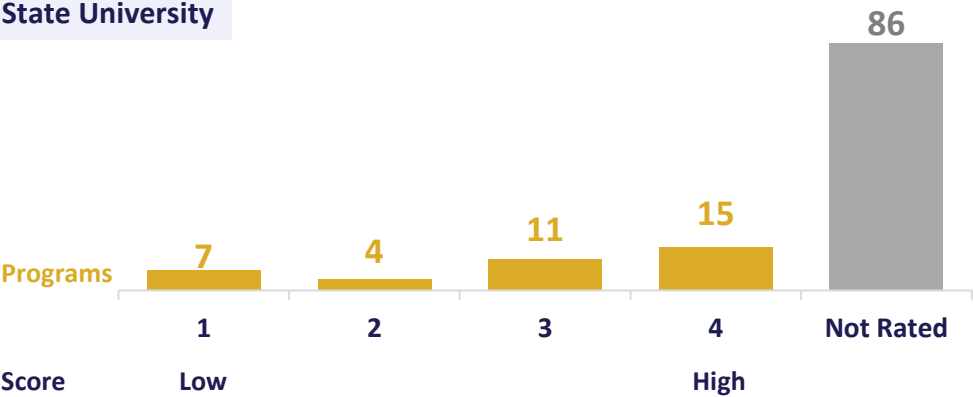

Performance Metric 5—Teacher Evaluations

This metric considers the results of annual teacher evaluations from the most recent academic year for program completers from the previous three-year period. Florida requires that all teachers receive an annual evaluation that results in a rating of highly effective; effective; needs improvement (for teachers teaching more than three years) or developing (for teachers with experience of three years or less); or unsatisfactory.

Local districts develop their own teacher evaluation systems consistent with state law and guidelines. Growth or achievement data for the teacher’s students and observation of instructional practice must each comprise at least one-third of the evaluation. Other measures can be added at each charter school or districts’ discretion. The inclusion of this metric, in addition to the metrics looking solely at student learning gains, is important for two reasons. First, this metric allows for consideration of other factors used by districts to evaluate teacher performance, including classroom observations. This metric also allows consideration of performance for many more teachers who do not teach grades or subjects associated with statewide assessments. Scoring for this metric is based on the percentage of teachers receiving highly effective and effective ratings.

Average Teacher Evaluation Score 2014-2021

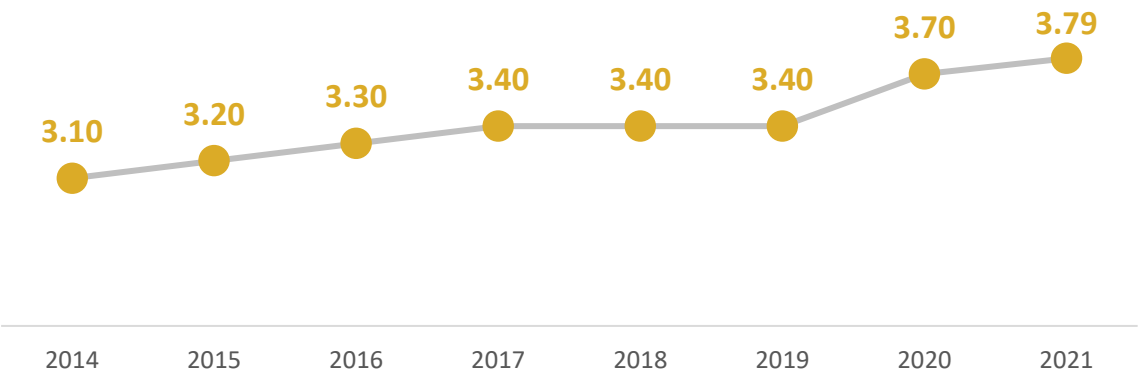
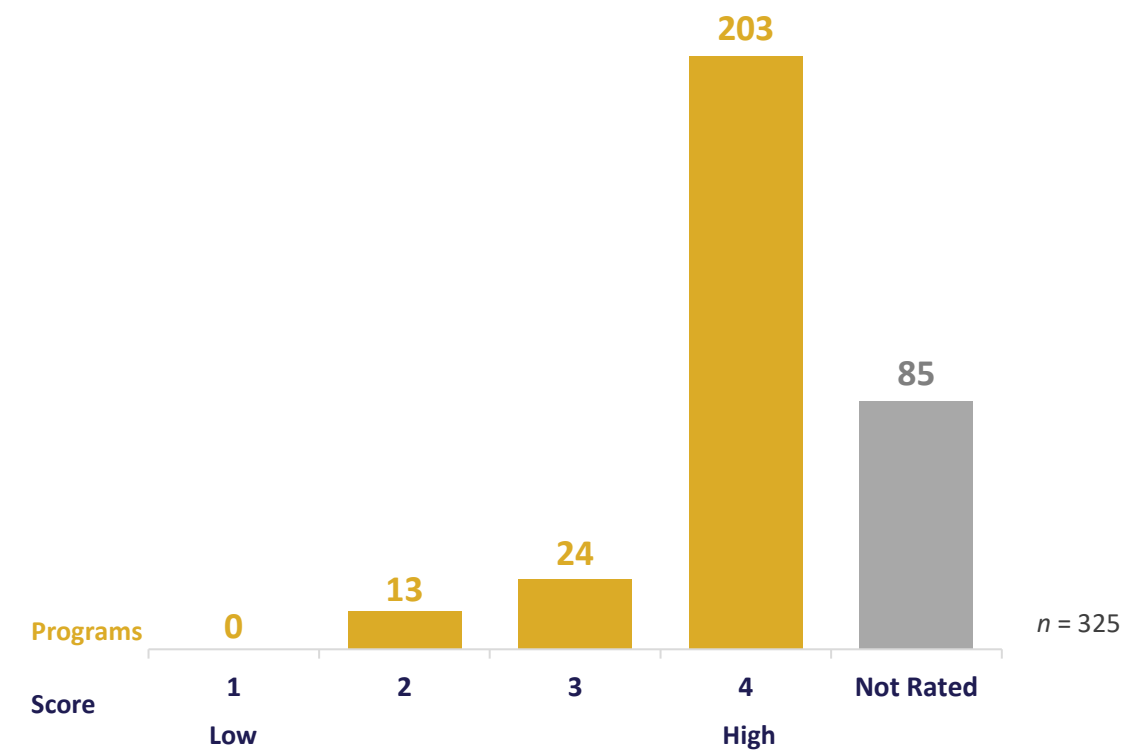

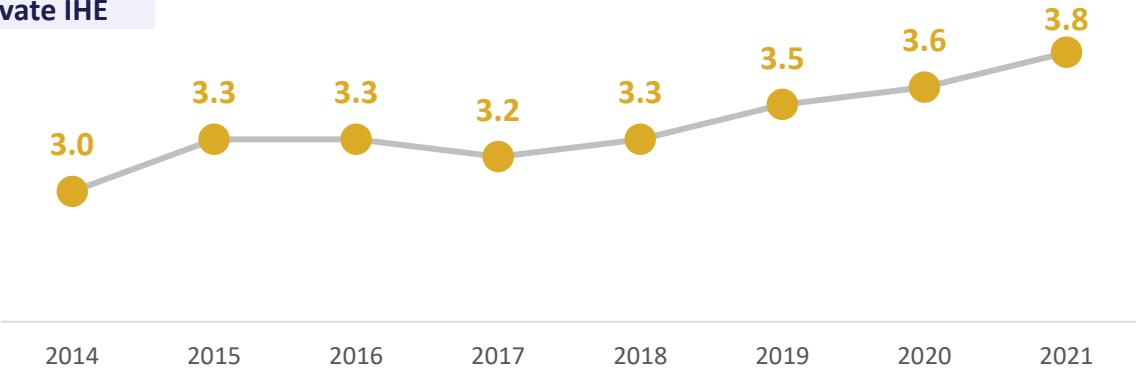

Important context for analyzing this metric is that nearly all teachers in Florida receive an effective or highly effective rating on their evaluation. State data show that over 98% of teachers received a rating of effective or highly effective. Given the lack of differentiation among the underlying data, the high program scores are not surprising. The state may want to consider whether programs scoring less than a 3.0 are in need of technical assistance or intervention.

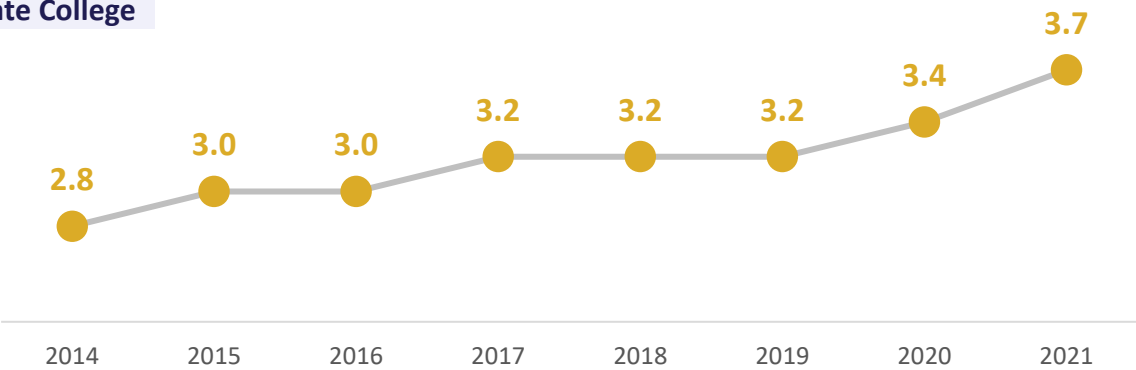

Average Score for Teacher Evaluation by Program Type 2014–2021



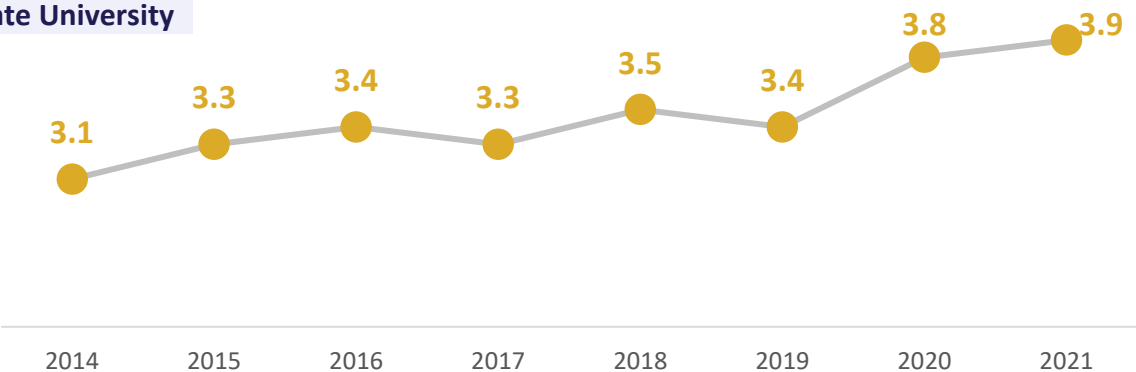

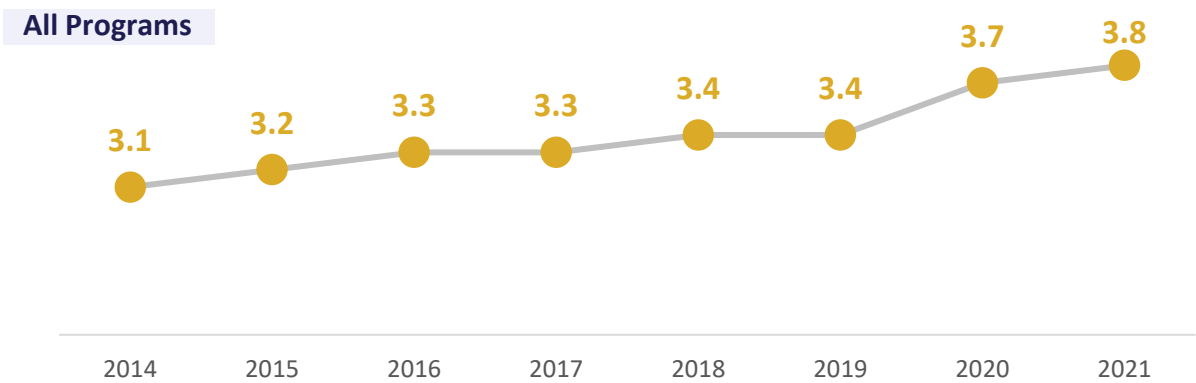
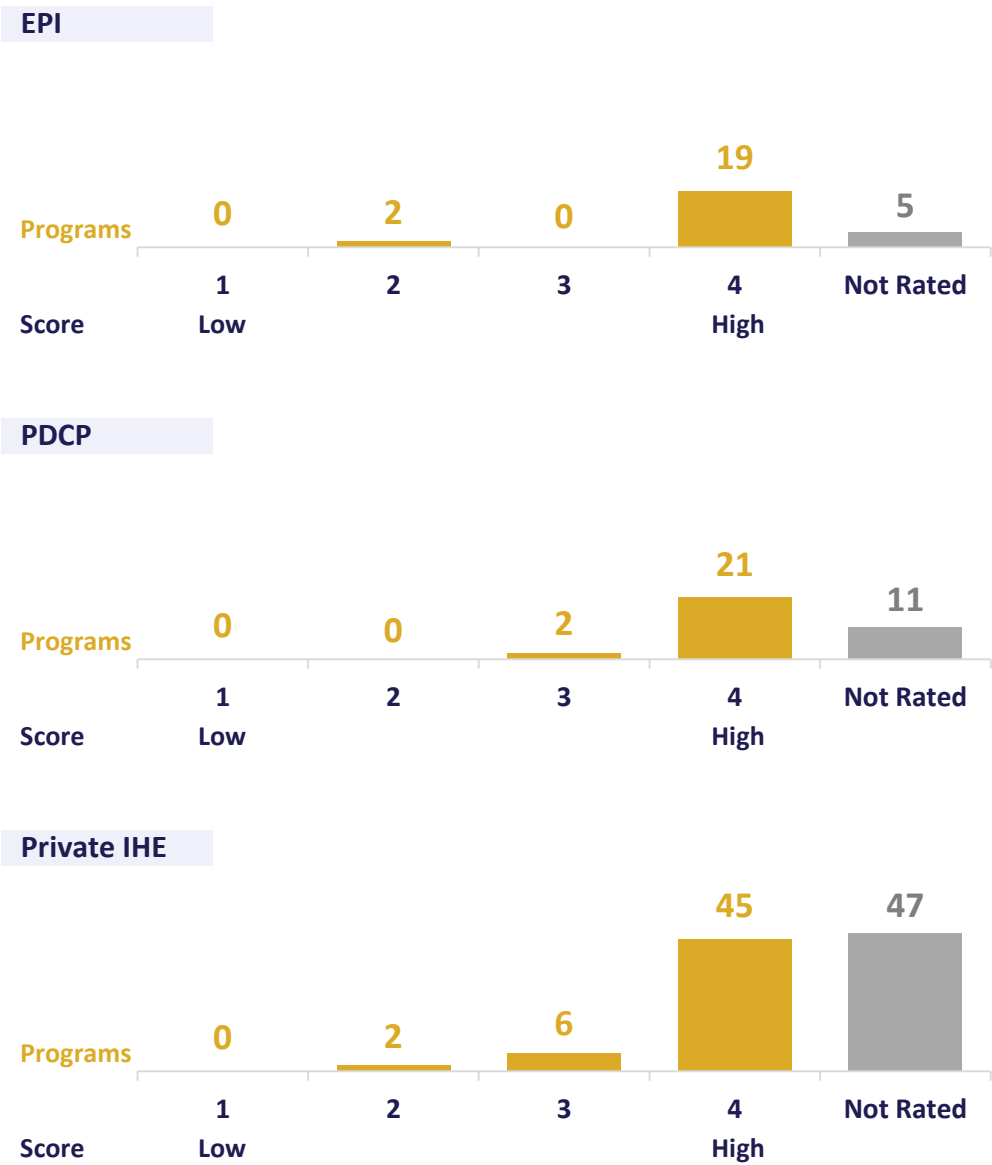
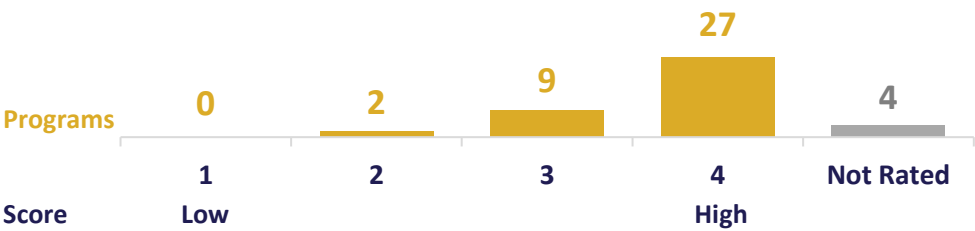


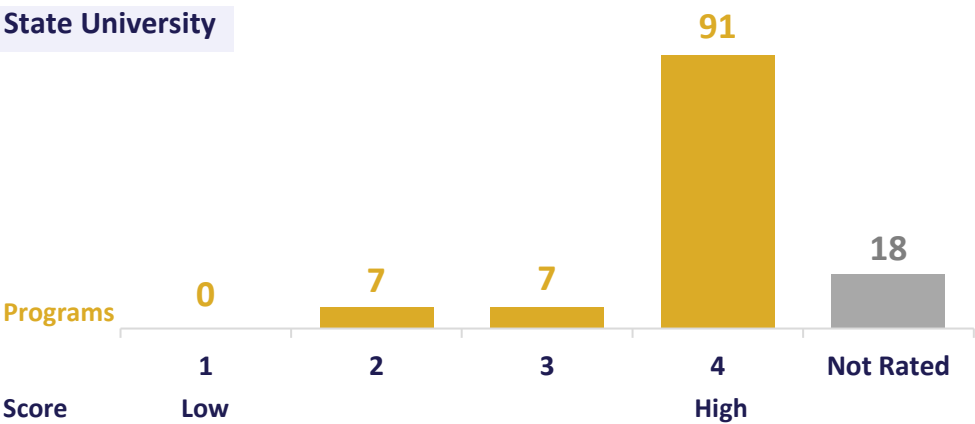

## Bonus Metric

### Critical Shortage Areas

The final metric in Florida's teacher preparation accountability system considers whether programs are producing teachers in critical shortage subject areas. Since by design many programs are not preparing teachers for these subject areas, this metric is not used to evaluate all programs as the other performance metrics are. Instead, eligible programs can earn bonus points that impact their summative scores and rankings.

Critical teacher shortage areas are determined and published each year by the State Board of Education in accordance with Rule 6A-20.0131, Florida Administrative Code. For the school year 2018 – 2019, the following were identified as critical shortage areas, in rank order:

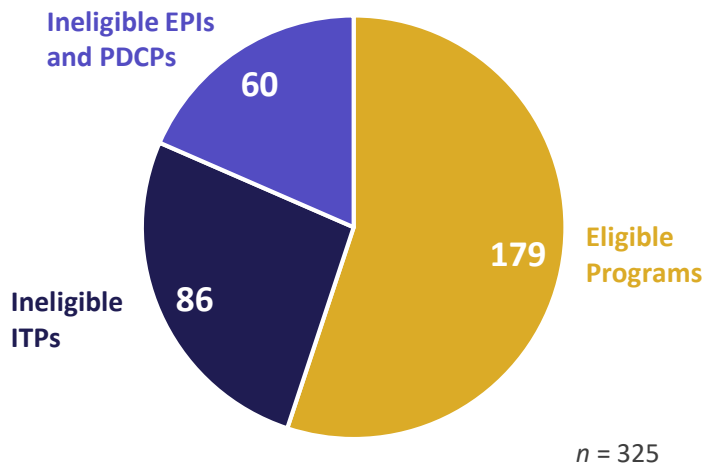
- Science-General
- English
- English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)
- Exceptional Student Education (ESE)
- Mathematics
- Reading
- Science-Physical

Based on these identified areas, 179 of the 325 programs analyzed were eligible for the critical teacher shortage area bonus. To earn the bonus, eligible programs must have a minimum of two program completers and increase the number of program completers compared to the prior year.

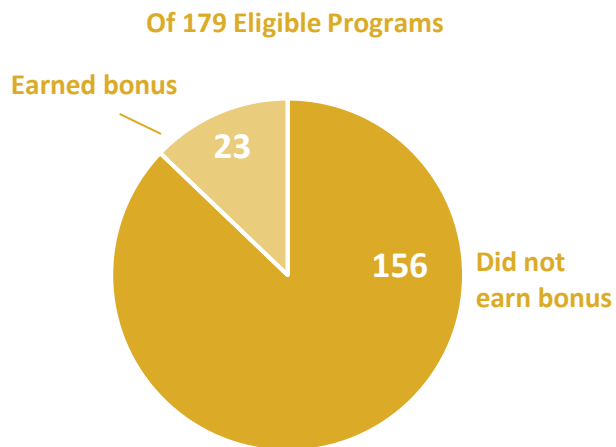
#### FINDING

**23 out of 179 eligible programs (13%) received the critical teacher shortage bonus.**

Combining multiple programs into a single unit of analysis for accountability purposes makes it challenging to accurately understand whether teacher preparation programs are helping to address chronic shortages. For instance, treating ‘science’ as a broad shortage category may mask important differences among science disciplines and reward programs and institutions that are doing little to contribute to the production of new teachers in key shortage subjects, such as Physical Science in 2018 – 2019. Further, there is no differentiation in the scoring for this metric that accounts for programs that produce significantly greater numbers of new teachers or the percentage increase relative to overall program size. Including such a differentiation might encourage programs to increase their efforts to produce new teachers in these critical shortage areas. Only four programs receiving the bonus this year increased their teacher production by ten or more teachers; six produced just one more teacher than the previous year.

#### **FINDING**

**Five out of the 23 programs (22%) that earned the critical shortage area bonus received low scores for teacher placement.**

Five of the programs that received the critical teacher shortage area bonus received a score of 2.0 or lower on the teacher placement metric, which means the employment rate of their new teachers is in the bottom third of similar programs in the state.

One possible explanation is that school districts are unaware of the availability of new teachers from these programs, which may be located in different parts of the state than those from which particular districts typically recruit new teachers. Perhaps completers from these programs are recruited or seek employment out of state, in which case the state may want to consider strategies to keep these much-needed new teachers in Florida. Another possible explanation is that school districts do not consider teachers from these programs well prepared for the classroom. A closer look at what can be done to get these teachers to the Florida schools that need them may be in order.

The critical teacher shortage area bonus is currently not applicable to EPIs and PDCPs. Because those programs by design may include teachers of varying grades and subjects, a separate set of business rules may be needed to determine their eligibility and production of teachers in shortage areas.

# CONSIDERATIONS

Florida's current teacher preparation accountability system is in dire need of changes and should be modernized to meet the needs of schools and Florida's PK-12 students and families. This section of the report offers suggestions for Florida's consideration to further advance the architecture of its teacher preparation program accountability system and the value and usefulness of the information it provides with the goal of improving the quality of teacher preparation to improve outcomes for Florida's PK-12 students. Florida should act with urgency to review these considerations with the goal of improving teacher quality. There are undoubtedly tradeoffs and issues of context, capacity, and resources that come into play as the state reflects on the feasibility of these ideas.

## **1. Increase the number of programs that can be ranked by addressing the causes of unscored metrics and reevaluating the number of subscores required.**

This report only includes rankings for 105 out of 325 programs. While the number of ranked programs has increased in 2021 with the availability of student learning data for EPIs and PDCPs in 2021, the total number of ranked programs continues to be limited with the requirement that programs have student learning data to be ranked.

As recommended in the 2020 report, the state may want to consider allowing programs for which a VAM score is not available to be ranked with only three subscores, giving additional weight to the teacher evaluation metric as an alternate measure of student learning for those programs. Had this 2020 recommendation been implemented in 2021, 72 additional programs would receive rankings, significantly increasing the total.

Additionally, the 2021 rankings support the 2020 recommendation that the Florida Department of Education consider identifying and addressing the causes of why large numbers of programs are not scored. Seventy-nine programs in this year's analysis have zero subscores, 17 more than last year. Some of these may be new or very small programs, but the state should continue to identify inactive programs and remove them from data files so they do not reflect negatively on the system as a whole. When performance data are missing for particular programs, the state might consider including the explanation in its public reporting, so that it is clear if the cause is an expected exclusion or something else that needs to be corrected or addressed. For example, a straightforward designation could be used to indicate whether programs are not rated because they are too small, had another legitimate reason for exclusion, or failed to report data. If programs repeatedly fail to provide required data to the Florida Department of Education, the state should consider if a negative impact on their APPRs may be warranted.

## 2. Consider alternative weighting formulas based on evaluation data quality, rigorousness, and differentiation between programs.

As noted in the 2020 report, all performance metrics continue to be treated equally in the calculation of summative scores even though some indicators may provide higher quality data than others and some clearly provide more differentiation among programs than others. Additionally, the metrics are not consistently rigorous. For example, while the retention rate rubric appears to be quite rigorous, requiring a minimum average retention rate of 3 years to earn a score of 3.0, the student learning subgroup measure only requires teachers to have positive learning results with 50% of the student subgroups to earn a 3.0 on the student learning subgroup measure. As noted in 2020, the Florida Department of Education may want to consider whether these metrics should be equally weighted in the summative scores even if there are legitimate reasons for some metrics to be based on less rigorous expectations.

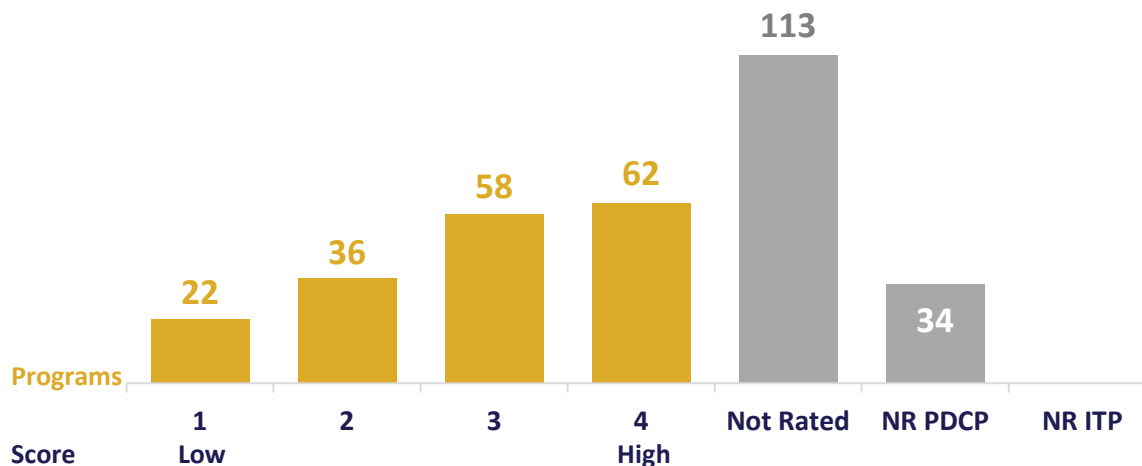
The Florida Department of Education may also want to consider alternative weighting formulas for programs that will never have certain metrics, such as those requiring student assessments. As noted in 2020, for programs in grades or subject areas that do not have statewide assessments, weighting the teacher evaluation metric more heavily might increase these programs' emphasis on teachers' classroom performance. Even with relatively little differentiation among teacher performance based on teacher evaluation results at present, the differentiation in program ratings on this metric in 2020 and 2021 suggests that it might be important for identifying outliers, especially for programs for which there are no other metrics that reflect the performance in the classroom of program completers and their students.

As discussed earlier, further exploration of certain metrics through available data might provide helpful information to Florida teacher preparation programs and the field nationally, even if these data are not used for accountability purposes. For example, while there has been a slight

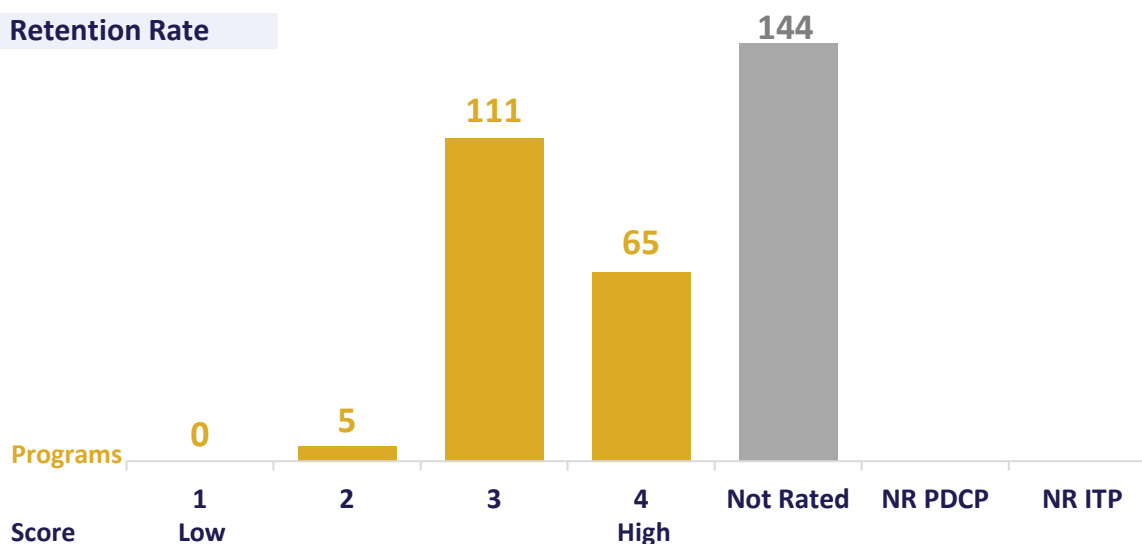
downturn on the retention metric in 2021, the continuing high level of performance on this metric suggests that further analysis is warranted on whether new teachers continue to be employed in the same positions or change positions within or across schools or districts over their first five years of employment. Understanding what some programs may do that contributes to new teachers thriving in a variety of settings or in helping teacher candidates to identify which environments that suit them best could provide a substantial contribution to the field on an issue that continues to be a challenge nationally.

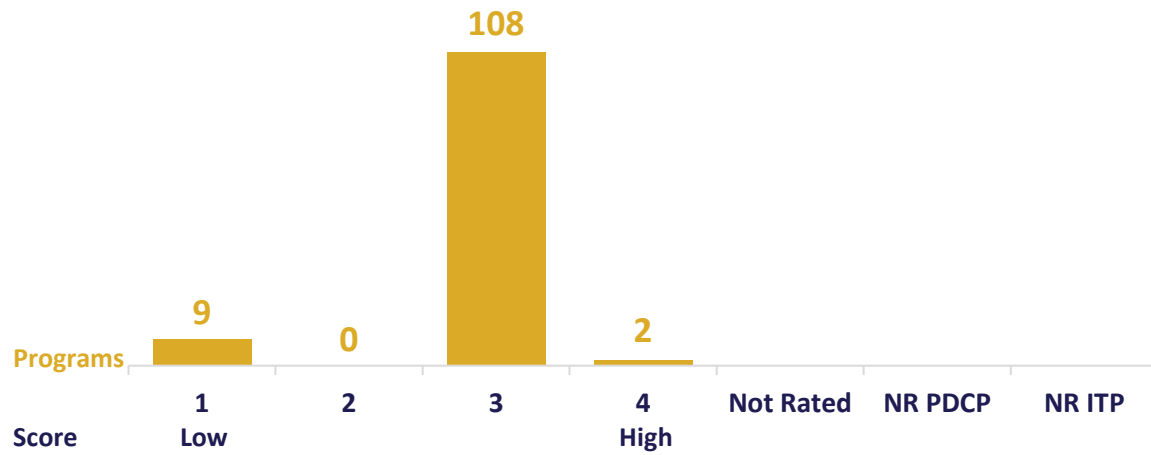
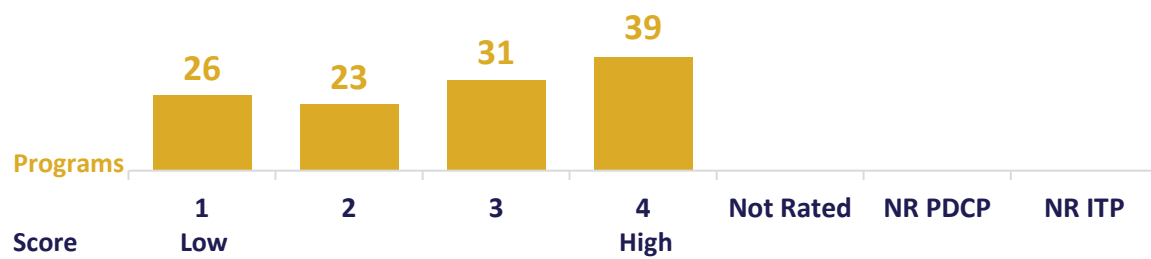
#### Exhibit 54 Distribution of Performance Metric Scores

##### Placement Rate

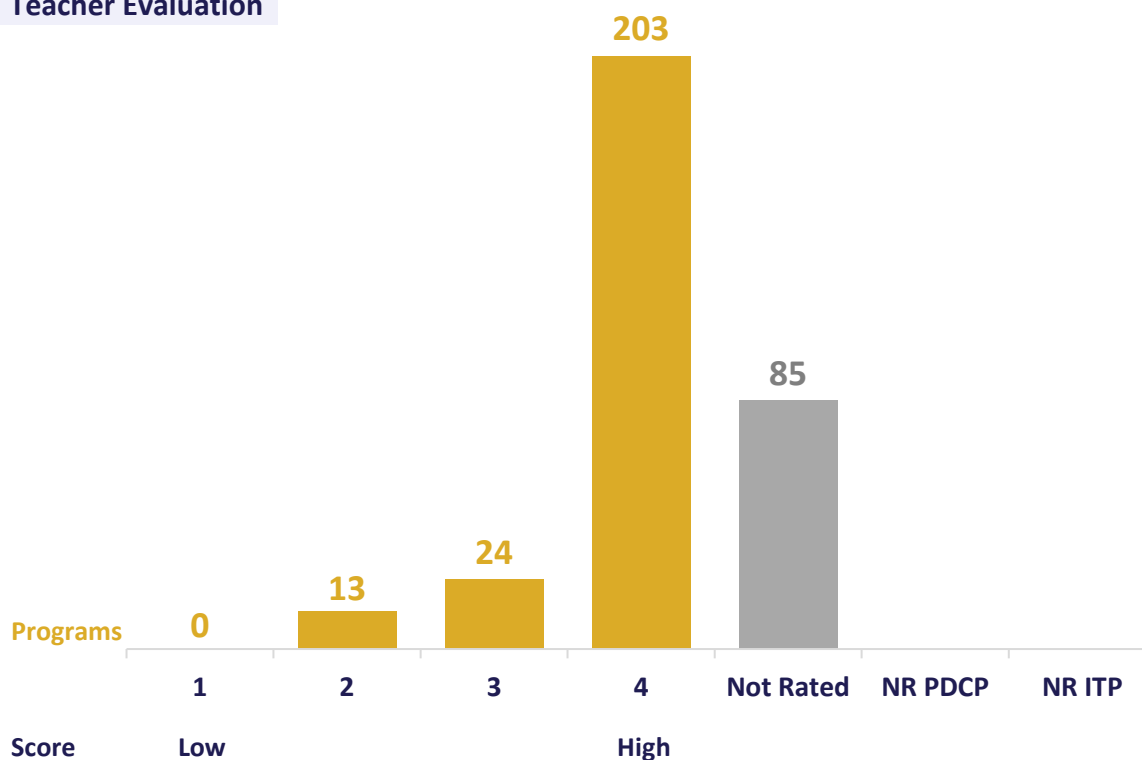


##### Retention Rate

### 3. Rethink the application of the critical shortage area bonus metric to ensure it is meeting the objective of incentivizing and rewarding the production of the most needed teachers.

The critical teacher shortage area metric is awarded only as a bonus so that it can only raise a program's overall score, as it is the state's intention to reward programs that produce teachers in shortage areas and not to penalize programs that do not. While this is a sound approach, the metric as presently applied does not actually reward those Florida programs that produce the most critically needed teachers. To earn the bonus, programs must show an increase in the number of teachers produced compared to the previous year. However, as currently defined, programs need only increase the number of teachers produced in critical shortage areas by one over the previous year, which does little to help the state's shortage issues. For both 2020 and 2021, many recipients of the bonus show very modest increases. In 2021, 83% of the bonus recipients produced fewer than 10 additional teachers. Meanwhile, programs that are graduating many more teachers in critical shortage areas but have not increased their numbers from the previous year do not earn the bonus. To solve this issue, Florida may want to consider developing a rubric for this metric similar to those of the other metrics that allows for a range of points to be earned so that both overall production and increase in production can be rewarded more meaningfully.



#### 4. Modify teacher preparation program accountability system business rules to make the resulting data more meaningful.

As noted in the 2020 report, several changes might be made to the business rules used in calculating some of the metrics that would strengthen the reliability and usefulness of the data. First, while the system is designed to rate and rank providers at the program rather than institution level, the practice of aggregating discrete programs so that programs with smaller numbers of completers can be included negates this program level accountability for the aggregated programs. In 2021, 73 of 398 programs, or 18%, are aggregates of multiple programs. While it may not be feasible to do away with all aggregations as recommended in the 2020 report, the Florida Department of Education should consider developing a very narrow set of criteria under which aggregations are permissible. While some combining may be necessary to maintain the anonymity of program completers in very small programs, the state should consider adopting a reasonable minimum “*n*” to apply for making these determinations that provides the proper balance between protecting candidate anonymity and providing public accountability.

Second, rounding summative scores to the hundredths rather than the tenths place would allow for more illustrative comparisons. With only a 4-point scale, rounding to a single decimal place masks potentially meaningful differentiation between programs. It is likely there would be far fewer ties in the ranking tables if an additional decimal place was presented. It is also likely that in some cases rounding to only the tenths place nullifies the impact of the critical teacher shortage area bonus metric.

#### 5. Develop and disseminate model surveys with a set of required items for all programs to meet the new accountability requirement, facilitate implementation, and maximize comparability across programs.

Satisfaction surveys of program completers and their employers were carried out for the first time during the 2020 – 2021 school year, with programs submitting their survey templates, completed forms, and summary findings to the state. The Florida Department of Education should consider tracking trends in response rates and survey content, independent of their forthcoming recommendations to the state board about how survey results should be incorporated in the continued program approval process and formula.

**Response Rate.** It appears that programs are currently permitted to set their own response rate targets. It is advisable for the state to set a benchmark response rate based, in part, on the distribution of 2020 response rates. Florida Department of Education could also consider implementing score weightings that reward higher response rates. The state might also consider consequences for programs not meeting the response weight benchmark and accompanying technical assistance required to support their improvement.

**Survey Content.** An analysis of 2020 survey forms and responses should be undertaken to determine if the data are valid, comparable, and appropriate in meeting the state’s accountability interests. The state might consider building a survey template that includes a set of questions all programs are required to use based on the state’s priorities for data to be collected through the survey. These required items might be based on items used by programs in 2020 or include newly developed items to ensure integration of state priorities that may not have been represented in program surveys. This template could also allow for providers to add optional items to address their specific provider or program priorities or needs. Prior to finalizing the content for such a template, it will be critical for the Florida Department of Education to determine their specific priorities for collecting survey data.

**Analysis of Results.** Before adding the survey data as a performance metric in the teacher preparation accountability system, the Florida Department of Education will need to determine whether to factor individual data points in the survey or a holistic rating into the APPR metrics. It may be best to wait to make these decisions until a survey with a set of comparable required items has been administered for two or three years and data from these survey administrations can be analyzed to set baselines and targets for response rates and individual and summative responses that can inform this new metric.

Additionally, the Florida Department of Education will need to determine how to best include the action plans providers are required to submit in response to the survey findings. The Florida Department of Education will need to determine whether these plans will factor into scoring either at the time of submission or in future years to verify whether follow-up actions were taken and the results they produced. Finally, as noted in the 2020 report, the Florida Department of Education should consider including PDCP programs in the survey requirement and metric as their programs could use the survey results to better understand candidate experiences and improve their programs.

## **6. Continue to develop a dissemination strategy that ensures these findings reach the intended audiences.**

Florida’s commitment and dedication of resources to the development and implementation of its teacher preparation program accountability system are commendable. However, a dissemination strategy that extends beyond the specific delivery requirements of the authorizing statute and that can help to maximize the reach and impact of the findings should be considered if the goal of the accountability system and reporting is, in fact, to inform important stakeholders, including local school districts and prospective teacher candidates. While the Florida Department of Education’s new user-friendly website that provides direct links to more information about individual programs is a step in making the data more easily accessible to these stakeholders. Components of a dissemination strategy that ensures that all stakeholders, especially programs, school districts and prospective teachers, as well as policymakers and funders, are aware of and can access this excellent new resource might

include requiring each provider to link from their program websites to the teacher preparation accountability data for the program on the Florida Department of Education's website and sharing highlights from this report through social media, infographics, or blogs. Additionally, the Florida Department of Education might consider providing updates to district superintendents and human resource officers that include highlights related to the top programs or providers for specific certification areas. These types of updates might be especially helpful in increasing awareness and placement of new teachers completing programs in critical shortage areas in Florida public schools.

# FLORIDA TEACHER CERTIFICATION EXAMINATIONS

Teacher candidates in Florida are required to pass assessments that measure their competency in general knowledge, professional knowledge, and content area knowledge as a condition of certification. Program completers’ success in passing these assessments is an additional variable that helps shine a light on the quality of preparation provided by programs and the effectiveness of the teachers they produce.

Exhibit 55 identifies the full set of assessments offered as part of the Florida Teacher Certification Exams (FTCE). Appendix H provides complete data for the assessments in wider use, including the program subject areas ranked in this report. For each teacher preparation program, first attempt and best attempt pass rates, number of examinees, and mean score are reported for each offered assessment. In addition, aggregate results for examinees who are not affiliated with particular preparation programs are reported.

There is a significant volume of available FTCE data, a comprehensive analysis of which is outside the scope of this report. Instead, the following section focuses on the FTCE Elementary Education subtests.

Before considering those data, there are some general observations and related suggestions that apply to most FTCE data. Florida reports pass rates for both first-time test takers and best attempt (i.e., the percentage of test takers who ultimately pass). The Florida Department of Education may want to consider also including the average number of attempts, which would provide important context for the best attempt data. The first-time pass rate provides some of this context, but the average number of attempts would provide even more.

For most assessments, the number of examinees not affiliated with a particular program far exceeds the number of examinees from preparation programs, and in most cases, the pass rate for non-program examinees is considerably lower. While it may be desirable for the state to have pathways that allow those who can demonstrate their subject area expertise to have a fast track to the classroom, especially in shortage areas, there may be unintended consequences associated with making the assessments so widely available. In particular, the large number of non-program examinees makes the average pass rate for a specific assessment not especially meaningful without looking at the breakdown between program and non-program test takers. A low average pass rate could result in the perception that a particular assessment is too difficult or the cut score too rigorous, when a closer look at the data tells a different story. It may also be helpful to take a closer look at the non-program examinees. It is possible that a percentage of these test takers are licensed teachers seeking to add a certification or endorsement in another subject area, and the pass rate for non-program examinees may be even lower if already certified teachers were removed from that group.

In addition, pass rate data for the professional knowledge and general knowledge examinations are only reported at the institutional level. There may be significant differences in passing rates across programs that cannot currently be ascertained. Further, it precludes any analysis across assessments for specific programs. It is not currently possible to see if there are programs that are stronger in content preparation but have considerable weaknesses in pedagogy, or vice versa; either case would be important to know for programs' continuous improvement and potentially of interest to prospective teachers, hiring school districts, and policymakers as well. The Florida Department of Education might consider breaking these data out in the future.

## Elementary Education

The FTCE in Elementary Education includes four subtests: Language Arts and Reading; Social Science; Science; and Mathematics. Exhibit 56 shows the elementary education programs with 100% pass rates for either the first or best attempt, along with the corresponding 2021 APPR score and corresponding program rank in this year's report. No state university programs had subtests with 100% first attempt and/or best attempt pass rates.

It should be noted that while the FTCE and APPR data used in this year's report are from roughly the same timeframe, there may be variance in program cohorts and the comparison between pass rates and APPRs is provided for informational purposes only. In addition, it should also be noted that the number of test takers varies across programs from the single digits to over 900, and it may be less challenging for a small program to achieve a perfect pass rate.

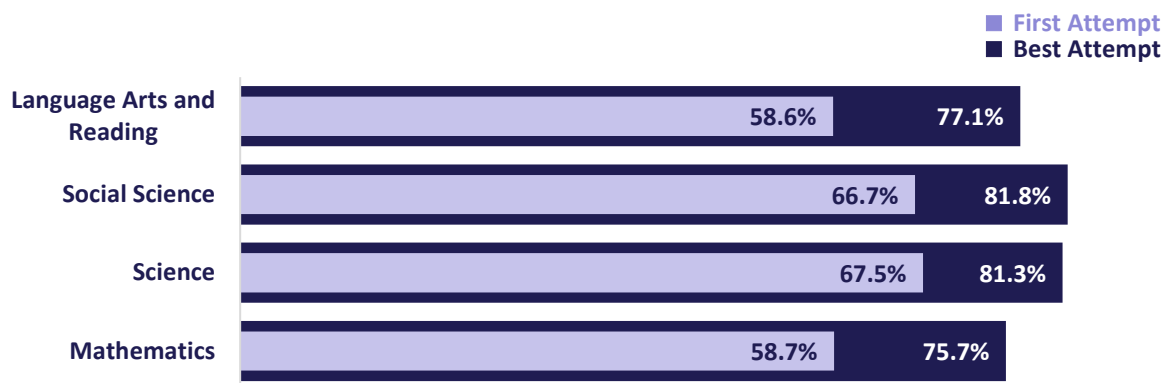

Looking at performance on each of the subtests, the science subtest has the highest pass rate for first-time test takers, with 67.5% passing the first time, and the social science subtest has the highest overall pass rate, with 81.8% of examinees ultimately passing.

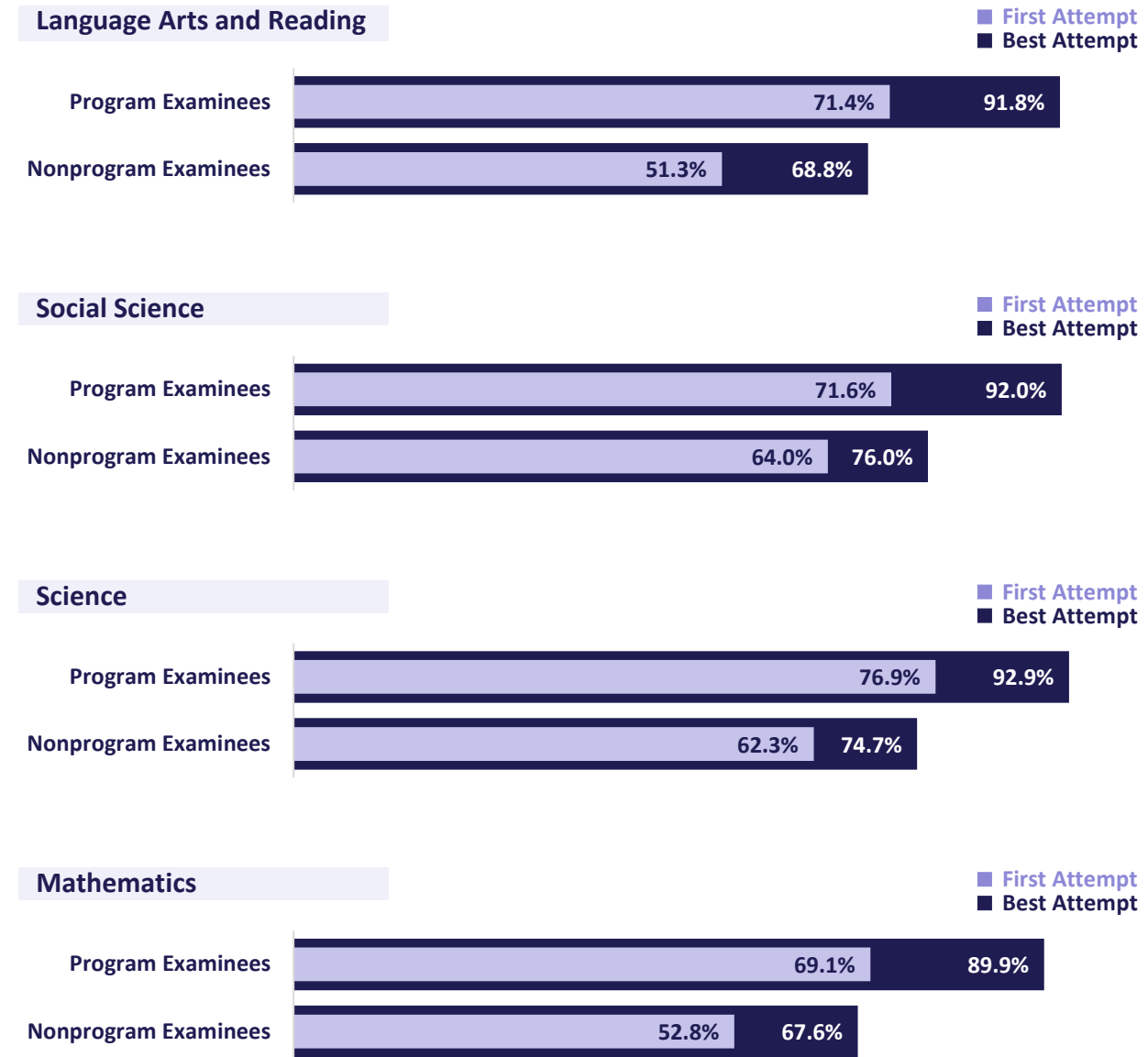

However, as noted above, looking at pass rates without distinguishing between program and non-program examinees may mask important differences. Exhibit 58 shows the results for each subtest comparing these two groups of examinees. As noted above, non-program examinees have considerably lower pass rates than program examinees; the gap is even wider for best attempt pass rates. It would be particularly interesting to identify the number of attempts non-program examinees are making, given that considerable resources are expended on unsuccessful attempts. There may be additional information that could be provided by the Department to help potential examinees who are not enrolled in preparation programs to determine whether they are ready to take the assessment.

**for Program and Non-Program Examinees**

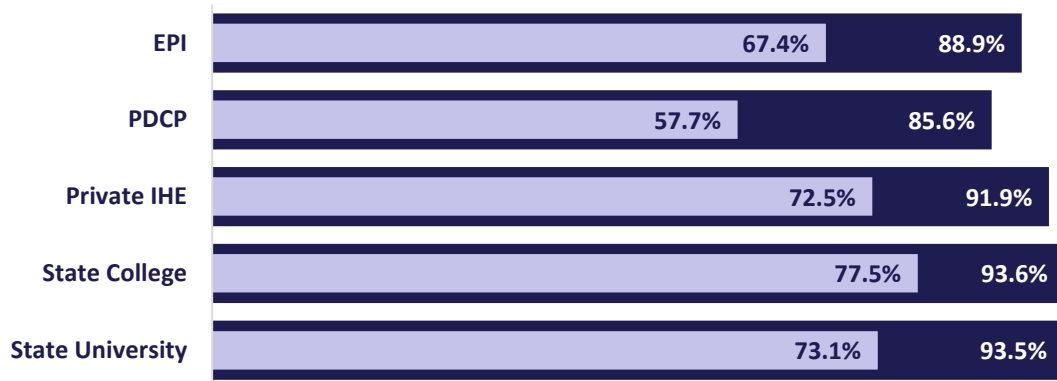

## APPENDIX B

### PROGRAM AGGREGATIONS

Florida's teacher preparation accountability system is designed to evaluate program-level, rather than institutional-level performance. Although the state aims for program-level accountability, it does combine together data from certain programs to increase the amount of available data. For example, in certain cases graduate and undergraduate programs are combined, discrete science programs such as biology, chemistry, or physics are combined, and discrete world language programs (e.g., French or Spanish) are combined.

The following programs are identified by the Florida Department of Education with the same program code for the purposes of producing the APPR and thus were considered as a single program in the analyses in this report.
