SUBJECT: 2015 Florida Illegal Passing of Public School Buses Survey Results

Earlier this year, school bus operators throughout the state participated in a survey to record incidents of passing school buses in violation of section 316.172, Florida Statutes. This survey documented the number and type of incidents (i.e., vehicles passing from the front or rear, and from the right or left, of school buses) and whether the incidents took place in the morning, midday or afternoon. The survey findings suggest the most common illegal passing of a school bus occurs from the front and on the left side of the bus, during either the morning or afternoon.

Attached to this memorandum are the survey results, totaled by district and state. Please review the results with your school bus operators, school bus operator trainers, district administrators, law enforcement agencies, traffic engineers, community traffic-safety teams, parents, students and local media representatives to raise awareness about illegal passing of school buses and help reduce this problem in your school district.
