Methodology

Percentage Enrollment Transported

Derived by dividing the average number of eligible students reported as transported on the October 2015/February 2016 Automated Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) Transportation Survey by the October 2015 Student Membership reported to PK-12 Education Information Services, Florida Department of Education (FDOE).

- State Average: 35.49%
 Average for Mega Districts (districts with 400+ buses in daily service): 30.89%
 Average for Urban Districts (districts with 200-399 buses in daily service): 42.68%
- Average for Rural Districts (districts with 199 or fewer buses in daily service): 43.34%

Operating Expenditures per Student (annual)

Derived from total transportation expenditures on the 2015-16 Annual Financial Report (AFR) (general and special revenue), including capital projects expenditures for bus purchases, less total expenditures for purchase of buses from all fund sources. This calculation is divided by the total adjusted number of students transported according to the final transportation calculation for 2015-16.

• State Average: \$946.58

Operating Cost per Mile

Derived from total transportation expenditures on the 2015-16 AFR, not including bus purchases (general and special revenue). This calculation is divided by the total annual miles reported by school districts on the District Transportation Profiles Worksheet for 2015-16.

 Average for Mega Districts (districts with 400+ buses in daily service): \$3.93
- Average for Urban Districts (districts with 200-399 buses in daily service): \$3.32

The bus replacement factor is included to normalize, on an annual basis, the impact of differing school bus replacement schedules among districts.
