Lake County Middle School Saw a 67 Percent Decrease in Violent Behaviors

Congratulations to the IDEA funded state project, Florida's Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports, for their incredible work supporting Lake County's Cecil E. Gray Middle School in Groveland. They were named the 2023-24 Bronze-Level Florida Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports System Model School. Restraint Data for August 2024 are Now Available

August 2024 data for restraint incidents submitted to the Involuntary Examination, Restraint, and Seclusion (known as IERS) web application are now available. The data have been posted to the Program Accountability, Assessment & Data Systems web page and can be located by scrolling down to the section titled "SWD Restraint Data – SY 2024-25," and selecting the appropriate month. Pursuant to section 1003.573(8), Florida Statutes, "The FDOE shall maintain aggregate data of incidents of restraint and disaggregate the data for analysis by county, school, student exceptionality, and other variables, including the type and method of restraint used. This information shall be updated monthly, deidentified, and made available to the public through the FDOE's website."

Tip of the Week

Ensure Parents Understand Prior Written Notice (PWN)

At the first individual education plan team meeting, clearly communicate to parents that prior written notice is issued after the meeting to document the team's decisions. Explaining procedural safeguards such as PWN can facilitate productive, efficient, and streamlined meetings while enabling parents' meaningful participation. (Special Ed Connection®)
