FACT College Algebra Overview

This fact sheet provides information about the Florida Advanced Courses and Tests (FACT) College Algebra for students enrolled in Florida public high schools participating in the 2025–26 pilot course and assessment. Section [1007.35\(6\)\(l\)](#), Florida Statutes, directs the Department to “Partner with the Florida College System institutions and state universities identified by the State Board of Education and Board of Governors pursuant to s. [1007.25\(3\)](#) to develop advanced courses and provide teacher training.” FACT College Algebra is the first assessment to be developed out of this partnership.

FACT College Algebra is aligned with the Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards identified by course curriculum for the Florida Advanced Courses and Tests College Algebra Course (1200550).

FACT College Algebra—Students to Be Tested

All students enrolled in grades 9–12 and completing the FACT College Algebra Course at one of the participating pilot schools must participate in and pass the FACT College Algebra assessment to earn college credit for College Algebra (MAC X105).

Test Administration Schedule

FACT College Algebra is offered during the following test administration window in the 2025–26 school year:

- March 30–May 29, 2026

Test Administration Information

- FACT College Algebra is delivered via a computer-based test (CBT) platform called the Test Delivery System (TDS).
- FACT College Algebra is a fixed-form test (not computer-adaptive).
- FACT College Algebra contains 50–60 multiple-choice, multiselect, and equation editor items and is administered in one 160-minute session in one day. Students who have not completed the test in 160 minutes may continue working up to the end of the school day.
- No computer-based or paper-based accommodations are available for FACT College Algebra during the 2025–26 pilot year. The following accessibility features are available:
 - Zoom
 - Color Contrast
 - Mouse Pointer Options
 - Dyslexia-Friendly Font
 - Line Reader
- The [Test Design Summary and Blueprint: FACT College Algebra](#) provides a map or blueprint for how the assessment is designed. The summary shows the possible number of items, item types, standards assessed within each reporting category, and the representation of each category, in percentages, on the test.
- Students will be provided a CBT Work Folder to use as scratch paper.

Reporting

In accordance with [Rule 6A-10.024](#), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), Articulation Between and Among Universities, Florida Colleges, and School Districts, the passing score on FACT College Algebra is **60%** correct.

The following information will be reported in FRS after the testing window closes and quality assurance activities are complete:

- Student reports will show the percentage of items the student answered correctly, as well as the student's passing status for the assessment.
- School and district staff will see overall percent passing information.

Additional Information

Students with an Individual Education Plan (IEP) or Section 504 Plan, as well as English Language Learners (ELLs), may be eligible for allowable accommodations on statewide assessments.
