#### Restraint Data for September 2025 is Now Available

September 2025 data for restraint incidents submitted to the Involuntary Examination, Restraint, and Seclusion (known as IERS) web application is now available. The data have been posted to the <a href="Program Accountability">Program Accountability</a>, Assessments & Data Systems web page and can be located by scrolling down to the section titled "SWD Restraint Data – SY 2025-26," and selecting the appropriate month. Pursuant to section 1003.573(8), Florida Statutes, "The department shall maintain aggregate data of incidents of restraint and disaggregate the data for analysis by county, school, student exceptionality, and other variables, including the type and method of restraint used. This information shall be updated monthly, deidentified, and made available to the public through the department's website.

#### The Florida Low Vision Initiative (FLVI) Newsletter

FLVI, an IDEA-funded state project, through Florida Supportive Services for Students with Visual Impairments (VIs), is accepting referrals for the 2025-26 school year. Low vision services are also available to students with low vision, prekindergarten four-year olds through eighth grade, who receive direct instruction from a teacher of students with VIs, as documented in the student's individual educational plan (IEP).

#### FLVI participants:

- Receive a no-cost, comprehensive low vision evaluation;
- Are eligible to receive glasses and a wide variety of portable optical aids, when prescribed for specific low vision needs; and
- Receive training in the use of glasses and portable optical aids.

#### FIMC-VI Portal Reminder for Exceptional Student Education (ESE) Directors

The new FIMC-VI Portal is used to participate in the annual federal census of students with VIs and to request no-cost, tangible teaching materials from the American Printing House for the Blind. In order to access the portal, new users must register on the site and be approved by their ESE director or the ESE director's delegate.

If you are an ESE director, please follow the steps below to ensure that your staff are able to access this system and that student identifiable information remains secure. All page numbers below refer to the FIMC-VI Portal User Guide:

- Update the Approval Status of any users as needed (page 34)
- Assign a delegate or staff member who can also approve users in your local educational agency (LEA) (page 41)

On October 13, 2025, a parent from Volusia County connected with the FDOE Hope Florida office seeking support in finding career resources for her 19-year-old son. Her son was diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder at a young age and had recently graduated high school, so the parent's primary concern was getting help to guide her son on the path to employment after graduation.

Following the needs assessment and completion of a care plan, the Hope Navigator assisted the parent with establishing a connection and providing information for resources such as the Center for Autism and Related Disabilities, the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, and Vocational Rehabilitation (VR).

As a result of being connected with the resources the parent was seeking, the parent shared that her son had since started the enrollment process with VR to work hand-in-hand with a career counselor to begin planning a career path. ## **Instructions for accessing LRP trainings**

<u>Instructions for self-registration on the FDOE DirectSTEP® eLearning platform:</u>

- 1. Go to HTTP://FLDOE2022-DS.LRP.COM.
- 2. Read the "Is This Your First Time Here?" section located on the right side of the screen.
- 3. Click the "Create new account" button.
- 4. Create a username (Recommended format: John Sample = jsample).
- 5. Create a password (Recommended format : J#sample1). Please write down your username and password and keep it somewhere secure for future reference. This information will NOT be emailed to you after you register.
- 6. Enter your email address, first and last name.
- 7. Enter the letters/numbers pictured in the reCAPTCHA image. \*If your web browser does not display a reCAPTCHA image, try a different web browser or contact your IT department.
- 8. Click the "Create my new account" button.
- 9. You will receive a confirmation e-mail with a link to the website.

## <u>Instructions for taking a DirectSTEP® eLearning course:</u>

- 1. Log in to <a href="https://FLDOE2022-DS.LRP.COM">HTTP://FLDOE2022-DS.LRP.COM</a> using the username and password you created.
- 2. Select the course you have been assigned to complete.
- 3. Click the course link again (next to the icon of a gold box.)
- 4. Click the "Enter" button to begin taking the course.
- 5. You can use the arrow icons to move through the slides in the lower left hand corner of the slide player.
- 6. When you reach the Final Assessment, you will need to click the "submit" button after you select an answer. You will be directed to a new window which will inform you whether or not you answered each question correctly. You will need to score an 80% or higher to pass.
- 7. When you have completed the assessment, it is important that you click the "Exit Activity" link in the upper right hand corner of your screen to get credit for completing the course and to record your grade.
- 8. Your "Course Completion Certificate" link will now be active. If you are required to print a Completion Certificate, you may do so from this page.
