



Unaccompanied Homeless Youth (UHY) are ...

Youth who do not reside with a parent or legal guardian AND lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence

They may be:

Awaiting foster care placement; sharing housing ("doubled-up" or "couch surfing"); living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, camp grounds, emergency or transitional shelter, in a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train stations or other places not intended for human habitation.

Reasons for Homelessness vary:

- Loss of income; family turmoil, e.g. volatile parent-child relationships; domestic violence; sexual orientation; deceased parents; incarcerated parents; parents returned to country of origin leaving student behind
- SY 14-15: 406 UHY (18% of total BCPS homeless population)

ArtReach After School Care (ASC) Support

- Established 11 years ago in 2004
- Co-administered by Young At Art Museum & HEART
- No Cost Application Process
- Serves up to 60 children K-8
- Mon-Fri: 2:30 6pm
- Transportation

Students Receive:

- Homework assistance, art lessons, warm meal & snacks, up to 4 field trips, holiday activities and art showcase opportunities
- SY 15-16: i-Ready being implemented for the very first time

College Attainment Efforts

- April 4, 2015 First ever HEART College Tour to Fl. West Coast
 - 5 Seniors accepted to Florida Southwestern State College
- July 21, 2015 Region 5 Meeting:
 - State Homeless Education Director; Broward, Palm Beach and Miami Liaisons and FAU, BC, FIU & MDC
 - Direct Contacts established
- July 29, 2015 Letter issued by the United States Department of Education – Office of Postsecondary education clarifying institutions and applicants' roles and responsibilities RE: Title IV dependency determinations for unaccompanied homeless youth (UHY).

^{*}Careful UHY determinations = access to college tuition waivers and financial aid via the FAFSA!
