EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

It is a pleasure to be with you today as a representative of the Council of Presidents. To start I would like to take a second to pick up where my colleague President LoBasso ended last week in saying that your support of our System is critical as we strive to continually improve and ensure that every town, suburb and city in Florida thrives. Just consider that for every dollar spent on the Florida College System the state receives a return of \$2.90.

We accomplish this goal by having a focused vision and a plan to arrive at the goals we set forth. Today you will consider targets for the Department of Education's strategic plan that charts a course of improvement for all Floridians attending a school, technical center or college or receiving services from a provider through Vocational Rehabilitation or Blind Services. This work is important as your goals and targets also inform our strategies and activities at the local level. We are supportive of these efforts as they reinforce the performance funding model that has helped our System receive additional funding it needs to serve all Floridians while also ensuring our colleges are meeting the local workforce demands.

Just one example of how we meet local workforce demands is through our baccalaureate degree programs. Today two proposals will come before you – one focused on data and analytics and the other on Nursing. As I have listened to previous Board meeting these are two topics of continual interest by you and we are doing all we can to start, where appropriate and necessary, baccalaureate degree programs that meet local workforce needs.

It is worth reminding you that baccalaureate degree programs are just a sliver of our offerings. We are also squarely focused on workforce certificates and associate degree programs. We thank you for your continued support funding industry certifications as they play a key role in workplace success. We, as a System, continue to be among the nation's leaders in the number of associate degrees awarded.

Of the 110,000 graduates, half earned an associate in Arts. As a result, nearly half of the juniors and seniors at State University System institutions started with us. A firm focus on
