## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The rule identifies test scores on common placement tests, including SAT, ACT, PERT, ACCUPLACER and FCAT, used to demonstrate readiness to perform college-level work, per section 1008.30, Florida Statutes. The College Board created a new version of ACCUPLACER, called the Next-generation ACCUPLACER, that replaced the Classic ACCUPLACER as of January 2019. Florida was one of the states for whom the College Board granted an exception through January 2020 to continue using the Classic ACCUPLACER.

Scores for the Next-generation ACCUPLACER are not in the current rule. Additionally, scores for the FCAT reading that expired March 2017 and scores for the SAT critical reading and SAT mathematics that expired March 2016, respectively, need to be removed.

The proposed revisions to the rule include: 1) the addition of interim standard scores for the Next-generation ACCUPLACER, 2) the removal of the expired standard score for FCAT reading, and 3) the removal of old SAT scores prior to 2016.
