Goals of the Florida Education System Section 1008.31, Florida Statutes

- 1. Highest student achievement, as indicated by evidence of student learning gains at all levels.
- 2. Seamless articulation and maximum access, as measured by evidence of progression, readiness, and access by targeted groups of students identified by the Commissioner of Education.
- Skilled workforce and economic development, as measured by evidence of employment and earnings.
- 4. Quality efficient services, as measured by evidence of return on investment.




Metric 1: Student Achievement on Florida Assessments




Metric 2: Continued Achievement Growth on Florida Assessments


Metric 4: High School Graduation Rate Percent of students graduating with a standard diploma Metric 5: High School Graduation Rate Plus

Percent of graduates who completed one or more accelerated courses or certifications








Goal 2: Seamless Articulation and Maximum Access

Goal 3: Skilled Workforce and Economic Development

Metric 1: Postsecondary Employment Rate

Percent of program completers from these sectors who are in employment: Florida College System, District Postsecondary, Vocational Rehabilitation, and Blind Services Metric 2: Initial Wages

Annual average initial wages earned by program completers from these sectors combined over time: Florida College System, District Postsecondary, Vocational Rehabilitation, and Blind Services





National Benchmark Updates

- Advanced Placement (2018):
 - 1st state in participation
 - 3rd state in performance
- National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) Average Scale Score (2017):
 - Moved from 10th to 5th in Grade 4 Reading
 - Moved from 32nd to 25th in Grade 8 Reading
 - Moved from 18th to 7th in Grade 4 Math
 - Moved from 42nd to 34th in Grade 8 Math
- Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence (2019)
 - Both winners from Florida: Indian River and Miami Dade
