EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Students seeking admission to Florida College System (FCS) institutions are required to provide documentation of a high school diploma or its equivalent. In Florida, students earn a State of Florida High School Equivalency Diploma by successfully passing the 2014 GED® Test. Currently, there is not a mechanism for admission of prospective students entering FCS institutions from out of state who have a state-recognized high school equivalency diploma that was earned via alternatives to the GED® Test.

The proposed new rule will provide reciprocity to students entering FCS institutions with a state-recognized equivalent to a high school diploma that was earned via passing scores on the High School Equivalency Test (HiSET), the Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC) or California High School Proficiency Exam.
