#### **District Actions for Transformation Network**

- Hired 24 of 46 new principals using a Behavior Based Interview Model.
- Hired a new Middle School Region Superintendent with a proven track record for transforming turnaround schools.
- Launched the Transformation Fellows Program, in partnership with our university partners, to recruit college students into classrooms to support acceleration and literacy.
- Incentivize highly effective and effective teachers through "additional pay" as a recruiting tool into network schools.
- Implemented a single pathway for core curriculum through a district Framework for all turnaround schools with a priority focus on differentiated small group instruction.
- Strategically utilize proven supplemental curriculum to support standards mastery in the core content areas to include the use of i-Ready, Achieve 3000, EnVision and SIPPS.
- Frequently progress monitor student outcomes through diagnostic assessments, formative assessments and informal classroom check-ins resulting in 6-week action plans per cycle.





#### **Transformation Network: Assurances for Turnaround Schools**

#### **Leadership Capacity**

- Regional Superintendent weekly school support visit for instructional monitoring through observation, data analysis, and action planning.
- Design and facilitate monthly professional learning communities to build instructional and leadership capacity of principals and assistant principals.
- Strategically align support to schools in coordination with BSI.

#### **Support Capacity**

- District content coaches (Reading, Math, Science, Civics) engage weekly in common planning and data analysis to build teacher content knowledge.
- Provide customized professional development using triangulated data from action plans, observations, & progress monitoring.
- Leverage community support to provide mentoring, tutoring, mental health and other needs.

#### **Teachers Capacity**

- Implemented a Summer Learning Series focused on standards acquisition and building content knowledge for all 3300 teachers in the network
- Engage in weekly planning sessions, focused on the B.E.S.T standards, to customize and individualize student work.
- Provide incentive pay for effective, highly effective qualified teachers using VAM. (UNISIG Teacher Bonus)

### **Just Elementary Instructional Actions**

#### **Evidence of Improvement:**

- V Leadership team to aggressively monitor instructional progress to assign, coach, and provide feedback to teachers and support staff.
- Common planning with BEST standards focusing on tiered instruction and reviewed weekly to set instructional lesson focus.
- V Small group guided instruction for all students based on performance on standards-based assessments.
- ∨ iReady and Achieve 3000 are used to design individual learning paths related to the needs of each student.

#### **Implementation Plan**

- Implementation of a 150 Literacy Block to include reading, writing, foundational skills and targeted small group instruction.
- Weekly walk-throughs and administrative coaching on specific deficiencies based on PM 1, 2, 3 outcomes.
- Weekly collaborative planning with embedded data cycles.
- Distributive leadership focusing on SEL and partnership with Frameworks to include jobembedded coaching, PD, and demonstration classrooms along with Parental Workshops.
- Steven Covey Leader-In-Me to promote ownership and positive culture.



# Focus Areas & Next Steps



#### **Areas of Focus & Next Steps**

- Target district support based on progress monitoring data from F.A.S.T to maximize efforts in strengthening identified areas of need.
- Prioritize the implementation of data-driven, targeted small-group instruction across all schools in the Transformation Network.
- Incorporate strategies to scaffold learning when re-engaging students with deficiencies while working toward mastery of grade-level standards.
- Continuously utilize formative data to prioritize critical standards to maximize student achievement.
- Ensure the appropriate students are targeted and personally invited to Extended Learning Programs (ELP) to include after school and Saturdays.



#### **Expanding & Sustaining Strategies**

All sites will promote and implement:

- Saturday Academy Acceleration and PM 3 Preparation
- Before-During-After School Tutoring Provide extended learning opportunities for before, after and summer school programs to provide differentiated instruction and/or enrichment opportunities through core curriculum and target resources.
- Cultivate partnerships to support students and families through community resources, collaboration, and in-kind donations.
