

## Approval of Action Item #7 – Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program

Rule 6A-20.028, Florida Administrative Code



## House Bill 461 – Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program, Student Service Requirements

- Allowed students graduating in the 2022-23
  academic year and thereafter, to use 100 paid
  work hours to satisfy the volunteer service hour
  requirements for each of the four awards in the
  Bright Futures Scholarship Program.
- This change expands scholarship eligibility and access to postsecondary education opportunities, particularly for students who may have to work throughout school to support their family.



## **Proposed Amended Rule**

- Amends each section in the rule referencing volunteer service hours to also include paid work hours.
- Specifies that volunteer hours and paid work hours are separate paths to satisfy the service hours eligibility requirement and they cannot be combined.
- Removes unnecessary language which restates
  Florida statutes describing test score
  requirements and language defining the Bright
  Futures CAPE award eligibility.
