Rule 6A-5.079, F.A.C.

- Supports students to increase resiliency skills.
- Aligns with statewide resiliency initiatives.
- Provides framework for school counselors.
- Developed with stakeholder workgroup.
- Satisfies House Bill 1557 (2022) requirements.



Rule 6A-5.079, F.A.C.

After the 2022 Legislative Session, House Bill 1557 became law.

- By June 30, 2023, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) shall review and update, as necessary, school counseling frameworks and standards; educator practices and professional conduct principles; and any other student services personnel guidelines, standards or frameworks in accordance with the requirements of this act.
- Student support services training developed or provided by a school district to school district personnel must adhere to student services guidelines, standards and frameworks established by the FDOE (section [s.] 1001.42[8], Florida Statutes [F.S.]).



Rule 6A-5.079, F.A.C.

- This rule sets forth Florida's expectations for effective school counselors and forms the foundation for school counseling:
 - preparation programs
 - educator certification requirements
 - professional learning; and
 - evaluation systems.



Student Support Pathways for Resiliency

- On March 22, 2023, First Lady Casey DeSantis announced the development of four pathways for additional student support and mentorship.
- Florida's school counseling standards connect to existing resiliency initiatives, by providing training for caring adults such as moms, dads, volunteers, and athletic coaches to support students facing day-to-day challenges.
 - Resiliency Coach
 - Resiliency Endorsed Educator
 - School Counseling Apprentice
 - School Counseling Mentor
