

Part 1: Students Enrolled in Secondary Job Preparatory Programs

According to section 1003.01(4)(b), Florida Statutes, job preparatory programs offer "instruction in the competencies that prepare students for effective entry into an occupation, including diversified cooperative education, work experience, and job-entry programs that coordinate directed study and on-the-job training."



Part 3: Career and Professional Academies and Industry Certification

According to section 1003.493, Florida Statutes, Career and Professional Academies are research-based programs that integrate a rigorous academic curriculum with an industry-specific curriculum aligned directly to priority workforce needs established by regional workforce boards.

- Registered academies: 1,511 (high school); 56 (middle school)
- Students enrolled in academies: 185,414 (high school); 1,982 (middle school)
- Students who earned at least one industry certification: 38,209
