INTRODUCTION

Beginning with the 2012-13 school year, the name of Florida's statewide writing assessment changed to FCAT 2.0 Writing because of two primary changes to the assessment: (1) the increased scoring expectations that were implemented in 2012 and (2) an increase of 15 minutes for responding to the writing prompt implemented in 2013.

The FCAT 2.0 Writing assessment was administered in February 2014 to students in grades 4, 8, and 10, and the student responses were scored following the administration. Prior to the scoring session, Florida educators who serve on the Writing Rangefinder Committees read student responses and selected papers to represent the range of quality allowed within the established criteria for each score point on the rubric. These papers were used to train the readers for the holistic scoring of the 2014 FCAT 2.0 Writing responses. Each anchor set (scoring guide) included a student response and an annotation to explain why it was assigned a particular score. This provides the basis for developing a common understanding of the scoring criteria. A skilled scoring director and scoring supervisors were responsible for training, assisting, and monitoring readers throughout the training and holistic scoring process. All scoring was monitored by Florida Department of Education staff.

It should be noted that the nature of holistic scoring addresses the writing elements of focus, organization, support, and conventions as an interrelated body of evidence. These elements are not scored separately or analytically. Structure of Anchor Sets

The released 2014 FCAT 2.0 Writing Anchor Sets for grades 4, 8, and 10 contain examples of responses used as training materials for the 2014 writing assessment. Personal information has been removed or fictionalized to protect the identity of the student. For spring 2014, only one type of prompt per grade was administered for FCAT 2.0 Writing; thus, for each tested grade, one Anchor Set was used.

Description of Prompt for Grade 8: Writing to Explain (Expository)

When people think about Florida, they often think about beaches, sports, or certain animals.

If you had to choose one thing that best represents Florida, what would it be?

Now write to explain the thing that best represents Florida to you.

Anchor Paper 1 (page 1 of 1)**Score Point 1**

I think oranges best represent florida because florida grows a lot of oranges. The warm climate allows the oranges to grow. The oranges best represent florida because they grow commonly in florida from the warm climate.

Oranges grow a lot in Florida because of the warm climate. Oranges grow a lot in Florida because of the rain.

Anchor Paper 1**Score Point 1**

- The writing minimally addresses the topic of why oranges best represent Florida, but the brevity of the response makes it difficult to identify a focus. A loosely related idea provides little insight (*Oranges grow a lot in Florida because of the rain*).
- List-like details reveal a lack of organization. The writing lacks transitions, and no conclusion has been attempted.
- Support consists of a series of repetitive statements explaining why oranges grow in Florida (*The warm climate allows the oranges to grow. The oranges best represent florida because they grow commonly in florida from the warm climate*).
- A lack of sentence variety produces a monotonous rhythm. Conventions errors occur in basic capitalization (*florida*) and spelling (*alot*).

Anchor Paper 2 (page 1 of 1)**Score Point 1**

I choose one thing about in florida. It's Sport's it is bout more than 5 million people that love the fashion about games. Anchor Paper 2**Score Point 1**

- The writing minimally addresses the topic (*I choose one thing about in florida, It's Sport's*). Scattershot details reveal a lack of focus.
- The paper is an incoherent listing of related ideas, and little evidence of an organizational pattern is apparent.
- Attempts to extend support fail to clarify the topic, as limited word choice obscures meaning (*They watch it on t.v even baseball to cause they see that all the other's have talent in things that best for florida*).
- Gross errors in sentence structure impede communication (*And, when people have a game that's coming up like wade, and lebron micheal Jordan that's on the heat team they is the famous people that's play's basketball*). Frequent and blatant errors occur in the basic conventions of mechanics, usage, and spelling.

Anchor Paper 3 (page 1 of 1)**Score Point 1**

I love the Florida Gators. Because the Florida Gators are the best team in Florida. It represents Florida because most people in Florida love the Gators. Anchor Paper 3**Score Point 1**

- The writing addresses the topic of why the Florida Gators represent Florida. A loosely related anecdote blurs the focus (*One time Last year I went to Florida Gator Game with my MoM. That day I was very sick*).
- The response contains a few basic transitions that do little to promote a progression of ideas (*Some People even Like the Mascots. Also some people even Like the cheerLeaders. That's why I Love the Florida Gators*).
- Little development of support is apparent, and vague details limit understanding of the topic (*Most People In Florida Love the Gators. Most People In Florida Love the Gators because that may be their favorite team or maybe they just Like the Gators*).
- Some errors occur in the basic conventions of mechanics, usage, and spelling.

Anchor Paper 4 (page 1 of 1)**Score Point 2**

Anchor Paper 4**Score Point 2**

- The response is related to the topic of why oranges best represent Florida. General statements weaken the focus (*In florida oranges have a very big part in life hear. Oranges are one of the biggest qualities Florida has*).
- Basic transitions suggest a limited attempt at organization. The writing establishes few connections between sentences, however (*There is even a place called orange county. If you look at the back plate of a car from Florida it has an orange on it*). The concluding sentence summarizes the three main ideas in the response (*thay are in large quantity thayre a big part of life and can only be found in Florida*).
- Attempts to extend support provide little clarity (*In no other state can you eat an orange straight from the tree. That is one of the reasons i think oranges represent Florida best. Another reson is because Florida makes money selling oranges*). Word choice is limited and vague.
- Errors in basic conventions occur, including misspellings of commonly used words (*bigest, reson, actualy, thay*).

- The writing is related to the topic of how beaches best represent Florida. Extraneous material diverts the focus (*when you go in the water some times crabs pench you. They also leave a mark*).
- In spite of paragraphing, the response contains little evidence of an organizational pattern. A hasty, inadequate conclusion points to a sense of incompleteness (*In conclusion floridas beaches is such a beatiful place to take a vaction with your family*).
- Vague and repetitive statements fail to clarify the topic (*Because, you would Just love all of the amazing things it has to ofere for you. It is Just very amazing and Beautiful*). Limited word choice hinders understanding.
- Errors in basic conventions occur, including incorrect punctuation, capitalization, and spelling.

Anchor Paper 6 (page 1 of 2)

Score Point 2

I think sports best represents Florida. We have some good football teams. We also have some great basketball teams. Last we have some very good baseball teams.

- The response is focused on how sports best represent Florida.
- Rudimentary transitions begin each topic sentence (*One Sport, Another sport, The last sport*), and the overreliance on the formulaic organizational pattern results in a stilted quality in the writing.
- Support is inadequate, consisting of list-like details (*One team we have is the Miami Marlins. Another Great team is the Tampa Bay Rays*). Repetitive phrasing creates a false impression of substance (*One sport, One good team, Another sport, One team*).
- Overuse of simple sentence structure produces a predictable reading experience (*We have some good football teams. We also have some Great Basketball teams. Last we have some very good Baseball teams*). A few errors occur in the basic conventions of mechanics, usage, and spelling.

Anchor Paper 7 (page 1 of 2)

Score Point 3

Anchor Paper 7**Score Point 3**

- The writing establishes a focus through a descriptive opening (*Salty air surrounds you. Fresh breezes Run through your skin, and the suns warmth beats down on you*).
- Body paragraphs contain related ideas, but an absence of transitions obscures the connection between them. A simple conclusion summarizes the ideas in the response (*Beaches are warm, like Florida. Beaches are peaceful, like Florida, And beaches are beautiful like Florida*).
- An attempt to extend support strengthens the expository purpose. List-like details, however, only slightly advance the topic (*waves swooshing a splashing making such a peaceful sound. Palm tree's swaying back and forth sounding like beautiful rain sticks. Soft sand stuck between your toes*). Word choice is adequate but occasionally vague.
- There is little variation in sentence structure. Knowledge of the conventions of mechanics and usage is usually demonstrated, and commonly used words are usually spelled correctly.

- The writing is generally focused on the topic (*The first thing I think of when I think or see the word Florida? Sports, duh*).
- An organizational pattern is attempted through the use of an introduction, three body paragraphs, and a conclusion. Formulaic transitions introduce each paragraph (*First, Secondly, Last, In conclusion*).
- Some support is included, but details are often general (*we have a variety of well known players. Teams for swimming, basketball, volleyball and many more. Even though The Florida Gators are a college team, if you're good enough you could get easily drafted by the professional league*).
- The paper generally follows the conventions of mechanics, usage, and spelling.

Anchor Paper 9 (page 1 of 2)

- The organizational pattern includes a brief introduction, three body paragraphs, and a concise conclusion. Internal transitions promote cohesion among sentences (*From Neptune, to Ponte Vedra; If you want to see the Atlantic Ocean; but to see the Gulf*). The progression of ideas between paragraphs is less effective.
- Some support is included, but missed opportunities for further development prevent the reader from gaining more than a cursory understanding of the topic (*We went to the beach almost every weekend. We could not get enough! Beaches are a great place for surfing. Many surfers come to Florida for the Beaches*).
- The writing contains some attempts to vary sentence structures (*Whenever my Grandma travels down to see us, we take her to the beach to find shells. The Shells are her suvaneers from Florida*). Knowledge of the conventions of mechanics and usage is usually demonstrated, and commonly used words are usually spelled correctly.

- Adequate depth and specificity of support, including word choice, enhance the reader's understanding of the topic (*These boatrides are both educational and fun, in the center of the boat there is a glass floor; this glass floor allows you to explore the world that is submerged without getting wet. You will see many great things frome colorful fish to beautiful coral reefs*).
- Sentence structure is somewhat varied, and the paper generally follows the conventions of mechanics, usage, and spelling.

- A basic introduction lays out a conventional organizational pattern that is followed up in the body paragraphs. A succinct conclusion contributes to some sense of completeness (*Whether your at a beach, themepark, or icecream parlor Florida has the best weather for anyone to go outside, to be active! How could you ignore the luxurious weather of Florida?*). The second body paragraph features a thorough description of theme parks (*Florida is known for its theme parks! There's universal, island of adventures, Disney, animal kingdom, etc. Each one has its own unique style. Theme parks are perfect for warm days in Florida! Personally, I think island of adventures is the best. The best ride is the Hulk. It sounds scary and looks scary but it's not. The Hulk is a green rollercoaster with loops and turns*). Support in the following paragraph lacks similar depth. The writing contains some precise vocabulary (*foamy waves, polka dot towel, voiceover*). Overall, however, word choice is adequate (*nice trip, really fun, the best*).
- The paper generally follows the conventions of mechanics, usage, and spelling.

Anchor Paper 12 (page 1 of 2)

- The writing is generally focused on the topic (*The thing that I think best represents Florida is the beaches we have here*).
- The apparent organizational pattern includes an introduction and three body paragraphs followed by an awkward conclusion that essentially describes the writing process (*I've told you the thing I think that best represents Florida. The thing I chose was the beach. I gave three specific reasons*).
- Support, including word choice, is adequate, but development is uneven. The first body paragraph contains little more than a list of activities. The third body paragraph, however, explores its subject in greater depth (*In the summertime in Florida it can get really hot. When there is that specific extremely hot day people go straight to the beach or pool. Over the summer it's the best time for people to get tans and have fun in the water. Doing different activities while in or on the water. For example riding on a boat fishing, surfing, and getting on Jet Ski's*).
- There is some variation in sentence structure. Although some errors occur, the paper generally follows the conventions of mechanics, usage, and spelling.

Anchor Paper 13 (page 1 of 2)

Score Point 5
