**SUBJECT:** Credential Review Committee – March 9 meeting follow-up information

On March 9th, the Credentialing Review Committee met to adopt the 2022-2023 Master Credentialing List (MCL). Please see below. The 2022-2023 MCL is effectively the same as the 2021-2022 MCL, which consisted of both the K-12 and postsecondary CAPE lists. The list can be found on page 12 of the attached PDF. While this list still requires CareerSource Florida and State Board of Education approval, it is recommended you plan your academic and course offerings accordingly. As you know, the MCL currently is attached to K-12, district postsecondary, and Florida College System performance funding. It also determines the eligibility of programs attached to the Open Door Grant.

In the coming weeks, we look forward to a submission window for new industry certifications to be added to the 2022-2023 Master Credentialing List. Ideally, these would also inform fall academic and course offerings. If there are certifications that you know to be in-demand, can lead to a high-skill high-wage job, and are not themselves a test or an assessment (as if they were dependent on a specific curriculum), or a mere certificate of course completion, please let me know as soon as possible. Simply email me the certification name/information and certifying entity.
