*PROVISO LANGUAGE (HB 5001, General Appropriations Act, Section 197)

SECTION 197. Contingent upon the Department of Financial Services receiving and depositing into the General Revenue Fund the second distribution of the state's allocation from the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (Public Law 117-2), the following nonrecurring appropriations from the General Revenue Fund are authorized for the 2021-2022 fiscal year for the purpose of responding to the negative economic impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency:

DEFERRED BUILDING MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

The nonrecurring sum of \$843,725,327 from the General Revenue Fund is appropriated to the Department of Education to invest in deferred maintenance needs of Florida College System institutions and state universities. Each college shall submit to the State Board of Education, and each university shall submit to the Board of Governors, a list of maintenance, repair, and renovation projects totaling its allocation. Eligible projects include those which improve air quality to reduce the risk of viral and environmental health hazards; correct critical life safety issues; improve water, sewer, utility, parking, or roadway infrastructure; improve energy efficiency; mitigate environmental deficiencies; ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act; or ensure compliance with building codes. The State Board of Education for colleges, and the Board of Governors for universities, shall provide a consolidated list of projects to the Legislative Budget Commission no later than August 15, 2022, for approval. Upon approval of the project lists, the Department of Education shall submit budget amendments for the release of funds pursuant to chapter 216, Florida Statutes. Funds shall be allocated as shown above.
