SUBJECT:	Civic Literacy Competency – Rule Development Workshop

The Department of Education plans to initiate rule development to amend Rule <u>6A-10.02413</u>, <u>Civic</u> <u>Literacy Competency</u>, Florida Administrative Code. This amendment is designed to add the *U.S.* <u>Citizenship and Immigration Services Naturalization Test – Civics (U.S. history and government) with</u> <u>supplemental questions</u>, also known as the Florida Civic Literacy Test, as an option by which students can demonstrate civic literacy competency. This proposed amendment aligns the rule with the Board of Governors regulation and presents a low-cost option for students.

This semester, school districts across the state are voluntarily piloting the same assessment in response to Governor DeSantis's directive to Commissioner Corcoran to implement <u>a new civic literacy</u> requirement for high school students. The proposed rule amendment will also specify that high school students who pass the Florida Civic Literacy Test during the 2019-20 school year as part of the civic literacy exam pilot will have demonstrated postsecondary civic literacy competency.
