This report contains private school and student statistics for the September, November, and February payment periods of the 2007-2008 school year.





## McKay Student Enrollment by Gender





## McKay Student Enrollment by Grade Level





## McKay Student Eligibility for Free and Reduced-Price Lunch (FRPL)





## McKay Student Racial/Ethnic Enrollment








