




AP Participation and Performance

- 38.9% of U.S. public high school graduates took at least one AP Exam
- 55.9% (91,959) Florida public school graduates took at least one AP Exam
- 23.5% of U.S. graduates scored 3 or higher
- 31.7% (52,189) of Florida graduates scored 3 or higher







Florida AP Exam Performance 2014-2018








Why do most Florida school districts choose the PSAT for the state funded 10th grade college readiness assessment?



Score Improvements with and without Official SAT® Practice




16,000 students saw gains of 200 points or more.


