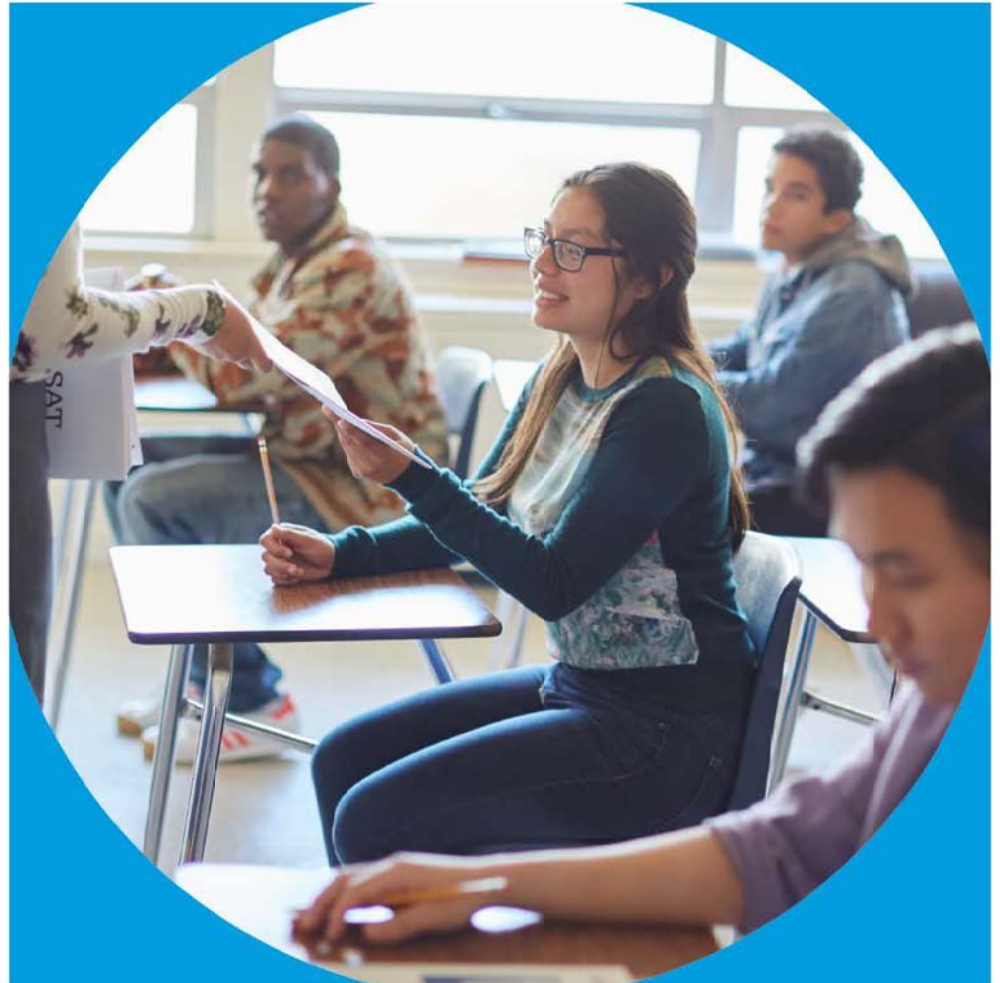

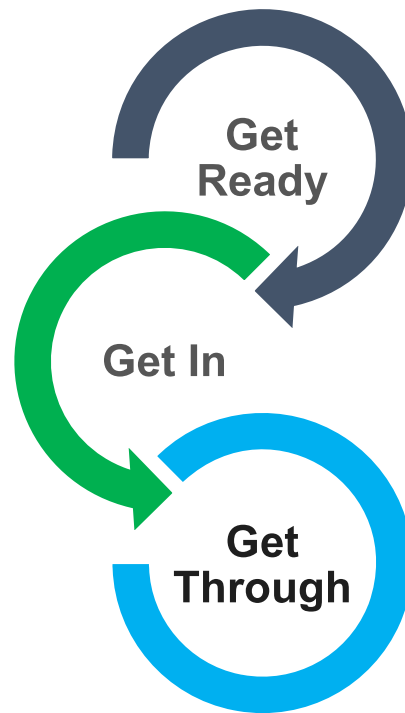

AP Participation and Performance

- 38.9% of U.S. public high school graduates took at least one AP Exam
- 23.5% of U.S. graduates scored 3 or higher
- 55.9% (91,959) Florida public school graduates took at least one AP Exam
- 31.7% (52,189) of Florida graduates scored 3 or higher

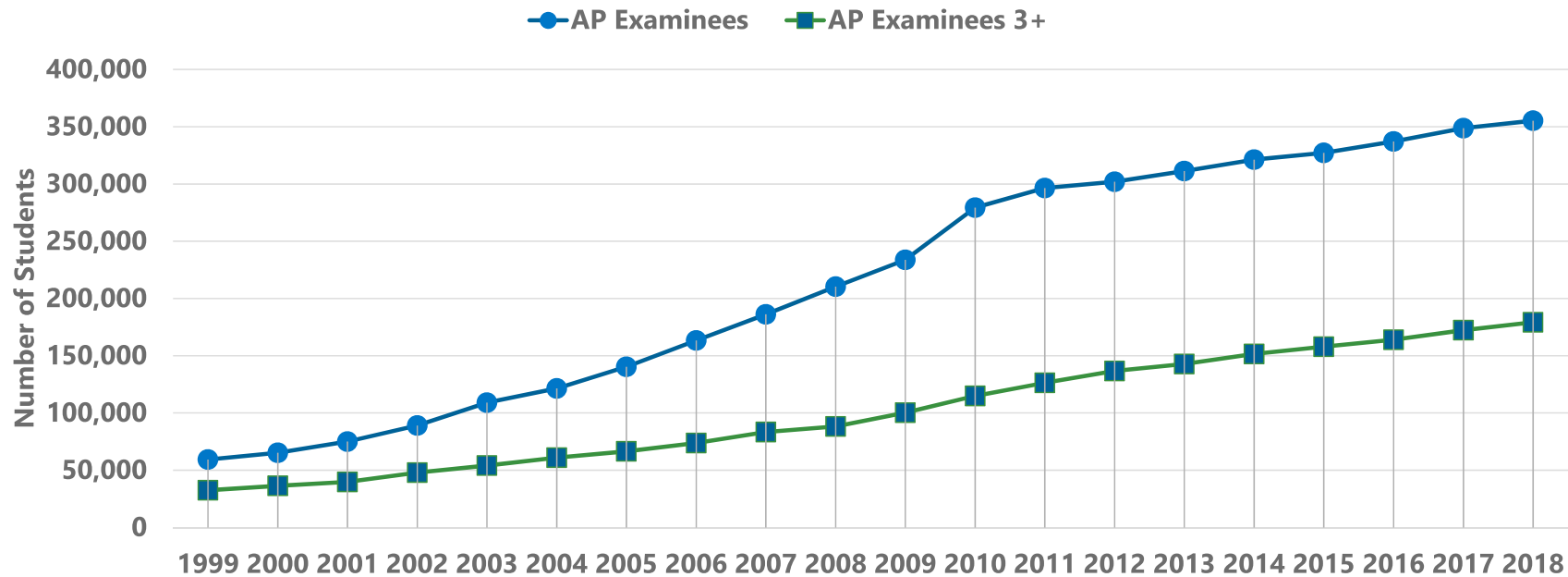

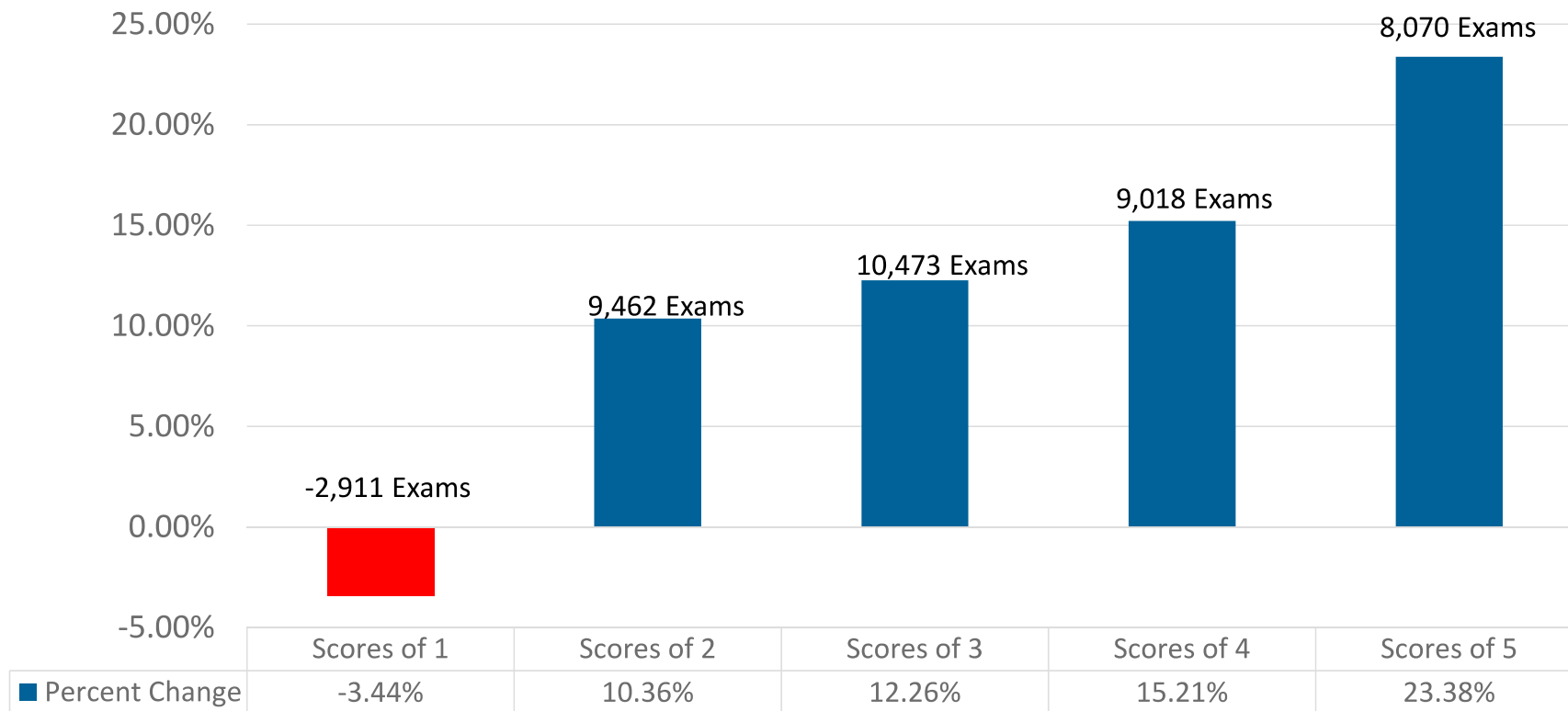
Florida AP Participation and Performance 1999-2018

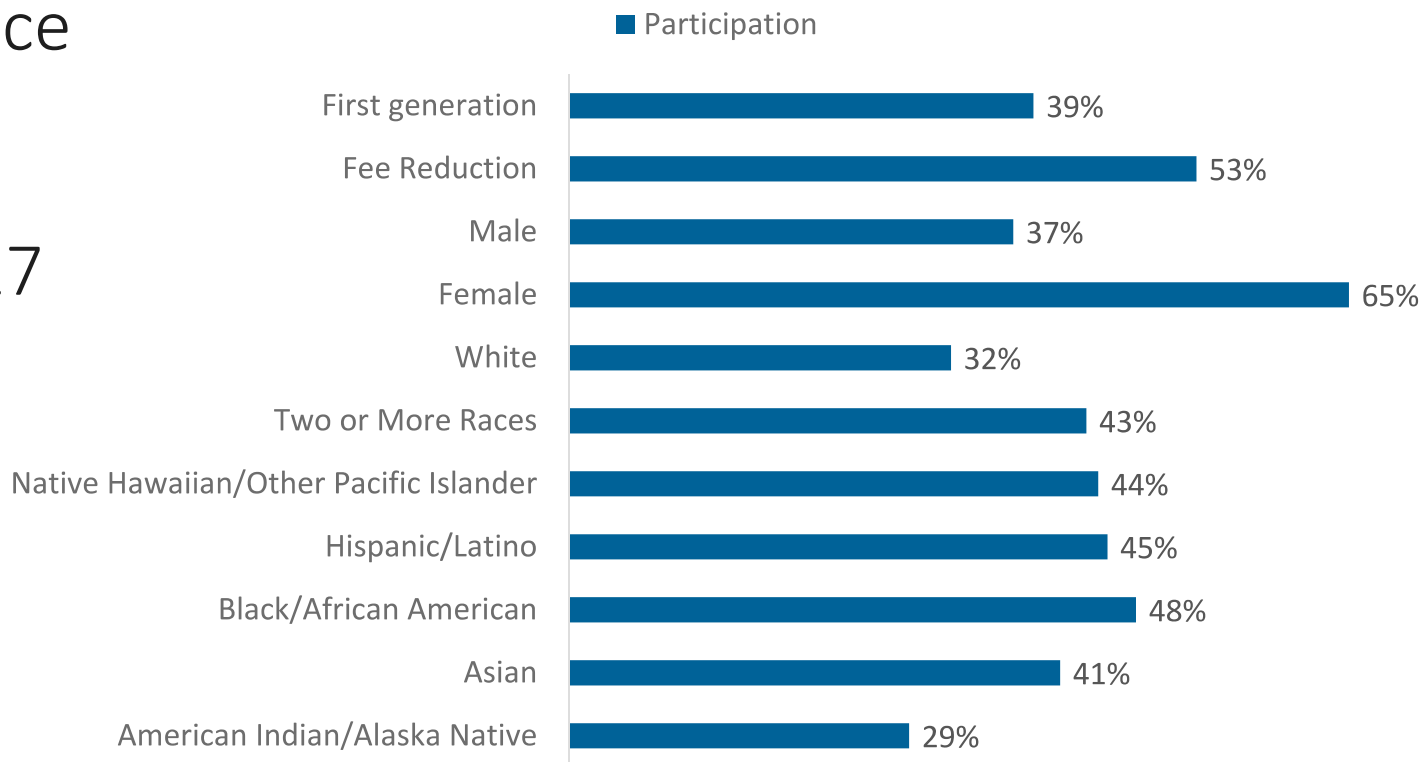

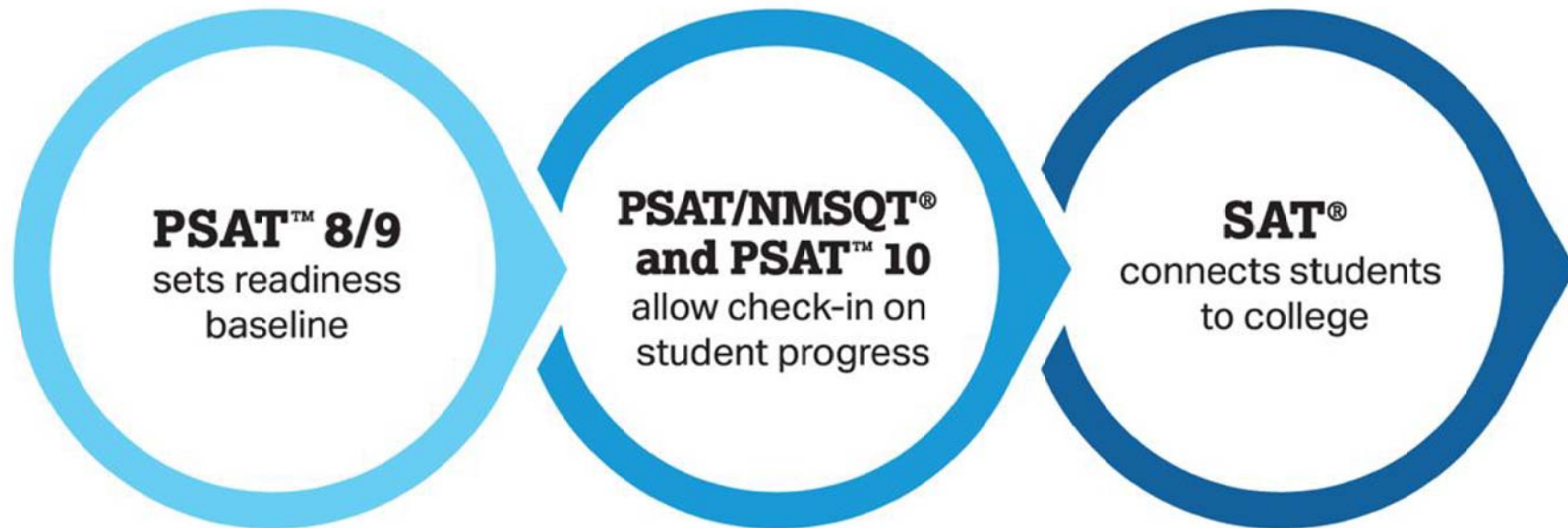

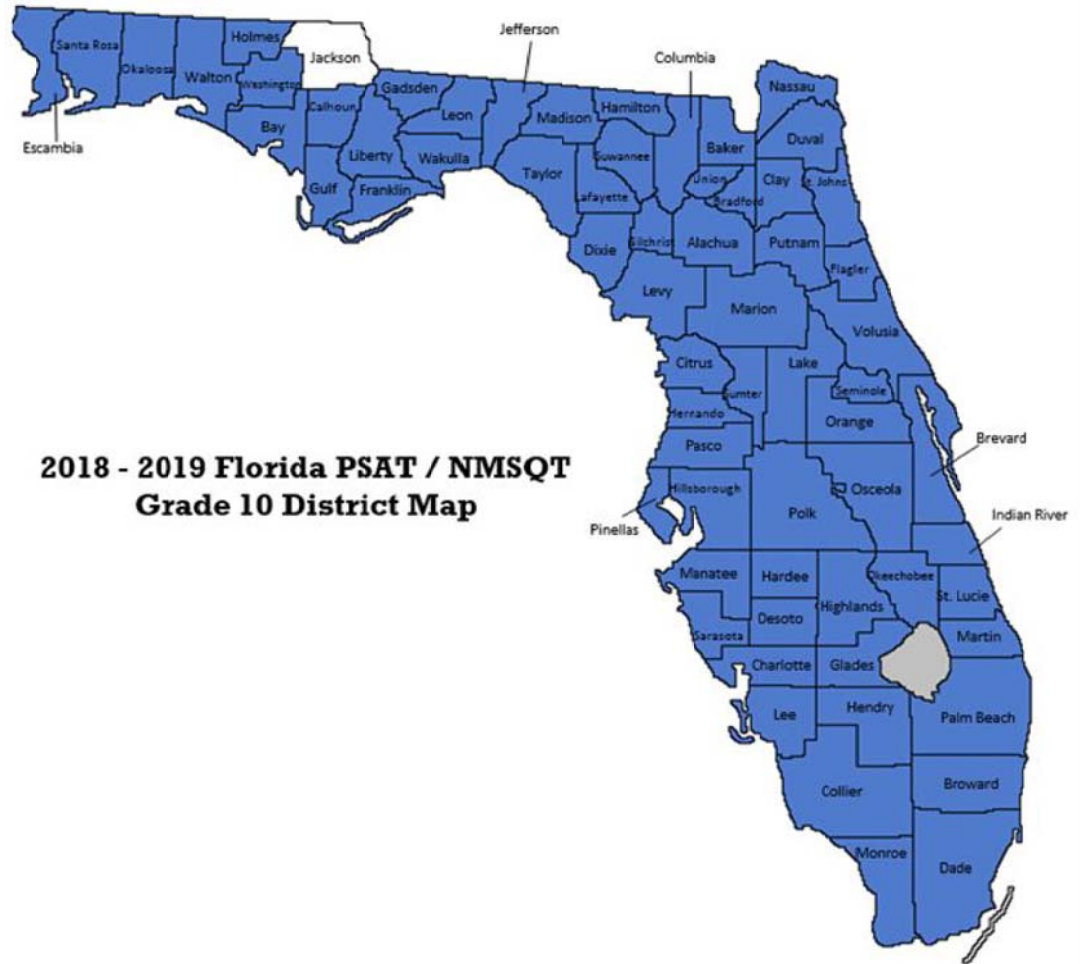

Why do most Florida school districts choose the PSAT for the state funded 10th grade college readiness assessment?

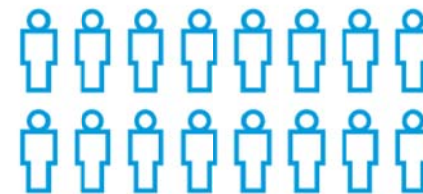
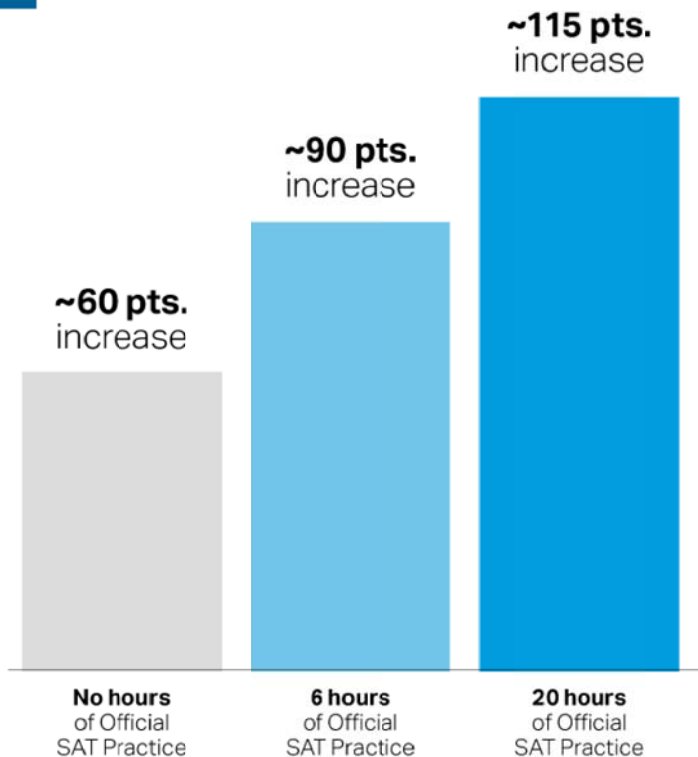

Score Improvements with and without Official SAT[®] Practice

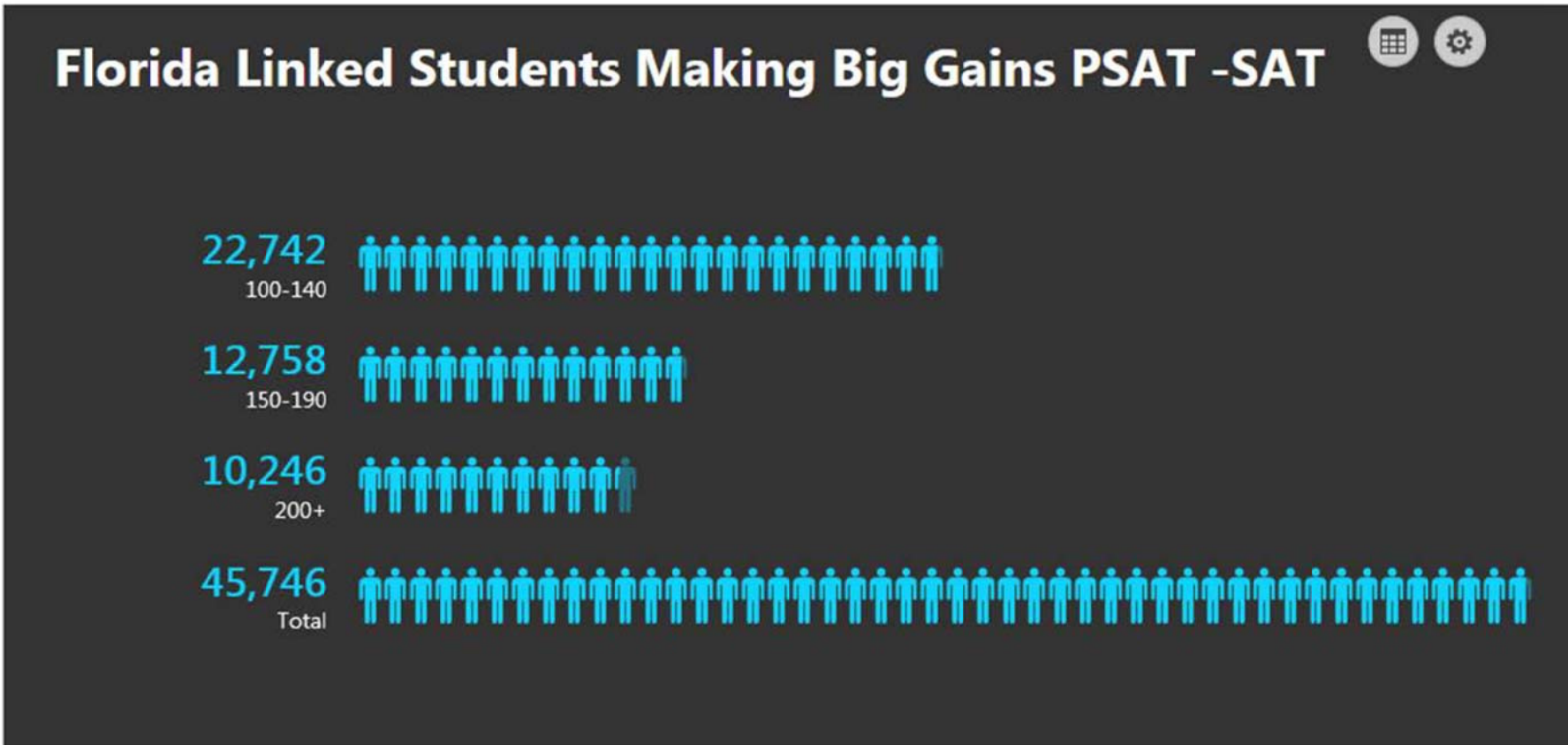

Average number of points gained from PSAT/NMSQT[®] to SAT correlated to hours spent practicing on Khan Academy



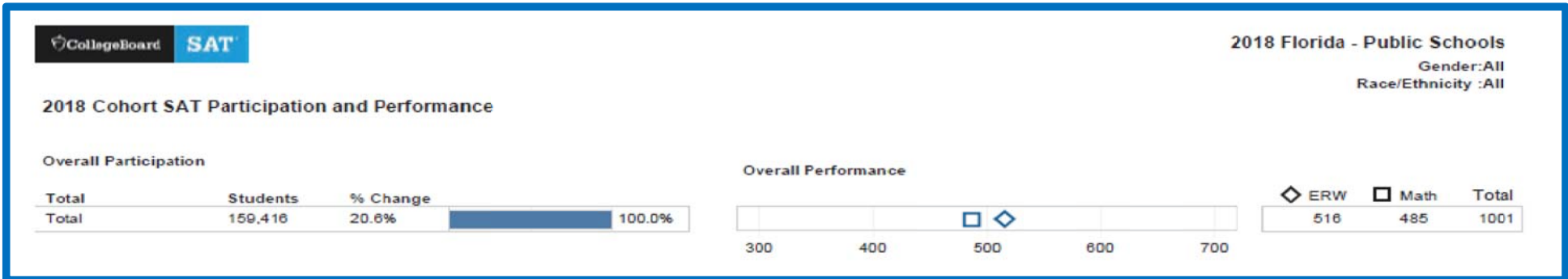
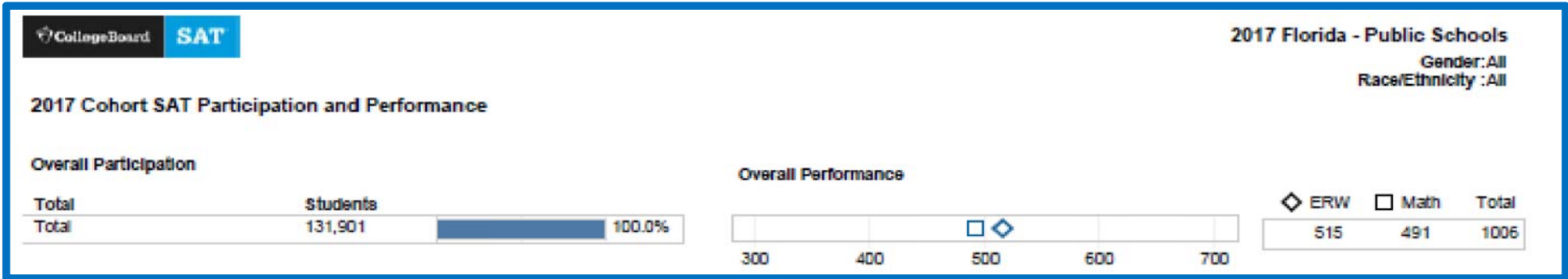
