Identification of Economically Disadvantaged Students for Perkins Postsecondary Allocation Formula

Criteria for Classification as Economically Disadvantaged

Florida has approval for an alternative formula on the identification of economically disadvantaged students. Students with following indicators are classified as economically disadvantaged:

- Recipients of Pell Grants
- Participants in the Job Training Partnership Act Program replaced in future years with participants receiving services above the core level in Title I of the Workforce Investment Act
- Recipients of Student Education Opportunity Grants
- Participants in a federal vocational work-study program
- Recipients of Temporary Aid to Needy Families (TANF)
- Recipients of Food Stamps
- Recipients of Welfare Wages
- Recipients of Florida State Assistance Grant for Career Education

Identification of Career and Technical Education Students

For community and state colleges, career and technical (CTE) students are identified using the following criteria:

- Data Element 2005 Program of Study Level = AS Degree (code 1), Vocational Certificate (2), Linkage (7), AS Certificate (8), AAS Degree (A), Applied Technology Diploma (D), or Awaiting Limited Access (3), AND
- Data Element 2002 Program of Study CIP Cluster is equal to a vocational CIP (values 01-07, 11-17), AND
- CTE Course Enrollment <u>OR</u> A&P course enrollment if Program of Study Level = AS or AAS Degree (1, A). For PSAV students only, course records from the prior year are checked since a PSAV course is only reported when the course begins.

OR

- Data Element 2005 Program of Study Level = General Freshman (4), AND
- Data Element 2001 Program of Study Award Type = AS Degree (2), AS Certificate (3), Vocational Certificate (4), AAS Degree (A), Applied Technology Diploma (D), <u>AND</u>
- Data Element 2002 Program of Study CIP Cluster is equal to a vocational CIP (values 01-07, 11-17), AND
- CTE Course Enrollment <u>OR</u> A&P course enrollment if Program of Study Level = AS or AAS Degree (1, A).
 For PSAV students only, course records from the prior year are checked since a PSAV course is only reported when the course begins.

For districts, career and technical students are identified using the following criteria:

Cost Reporting Code is equal to 351, 352, 353, 354, 355, 356, 357, 359, 364¹

District data reporting does not include a separate program and course record. All students reported must have instructional hours in the database.

Economically Disadvantaged Student Reports

All students identified as CTE Students who are also flagged as economically disadvantaged on at least one of the indicators listed above are included on the MIS reports, created by CCTCMIS and used for the postsecondary allocations. Economically disadvantaged CTE student counts used for the allocation are unduplicated to the LEA and student.
