

# APPRENTICESHIP STATE EXPANSION (ASE) MINI-GRANT LAUNCH

Through a partnership with the Florida Association for Career and Technical Education (FACTE) and CareerSource Florida, the Florida Department of Education is releasing approximately \$1.5 million dollars in federal ASE Grant Funds. With a focus on capacity building, outreach to underrepresented populations and removing barriers faced by apprentices to persist and complete their training, these mini-grant programs aim to support an overall strategy to help Florida become number one in the nation in workforce education by 2030.

## KEY GRANT INFORMATION

### MINI-GRANT #2 PARTICIPANT SUPPORT GRANT

Total Funding Available: Minimum of \$1,085,000 with individual program awards up to \$700 to support apprentices.

### TWO ROUNDS OF FUNDING

- Round 1: \$700,000 in funding to support 1,000 apprentices. Applications will be made available through [Grants.ApprenticeFlorida.com](https://Grants.ApprenticeFlorida.com) beginning April 22, 2021. The deadline for submission is May 13, 2021
- Round 2: \$385,000 in funding to support 550 apprentices will be released in late Summer of 2021

**Grant Scope: Funding is provided to Registered Apprenticeship Programs to remove barriers apprentices may face to persist and complete their Registered Apprenticeship Program.**

- Eligible applicants are Registered Apprenticeship Programs with apprentices fully registered with the Florida Department of Education on or after July 1, 2019.
- The registration date of the program is not an eligibility factor for this funding.
- Grant Performance Period: Date of award through June 30, 2022
