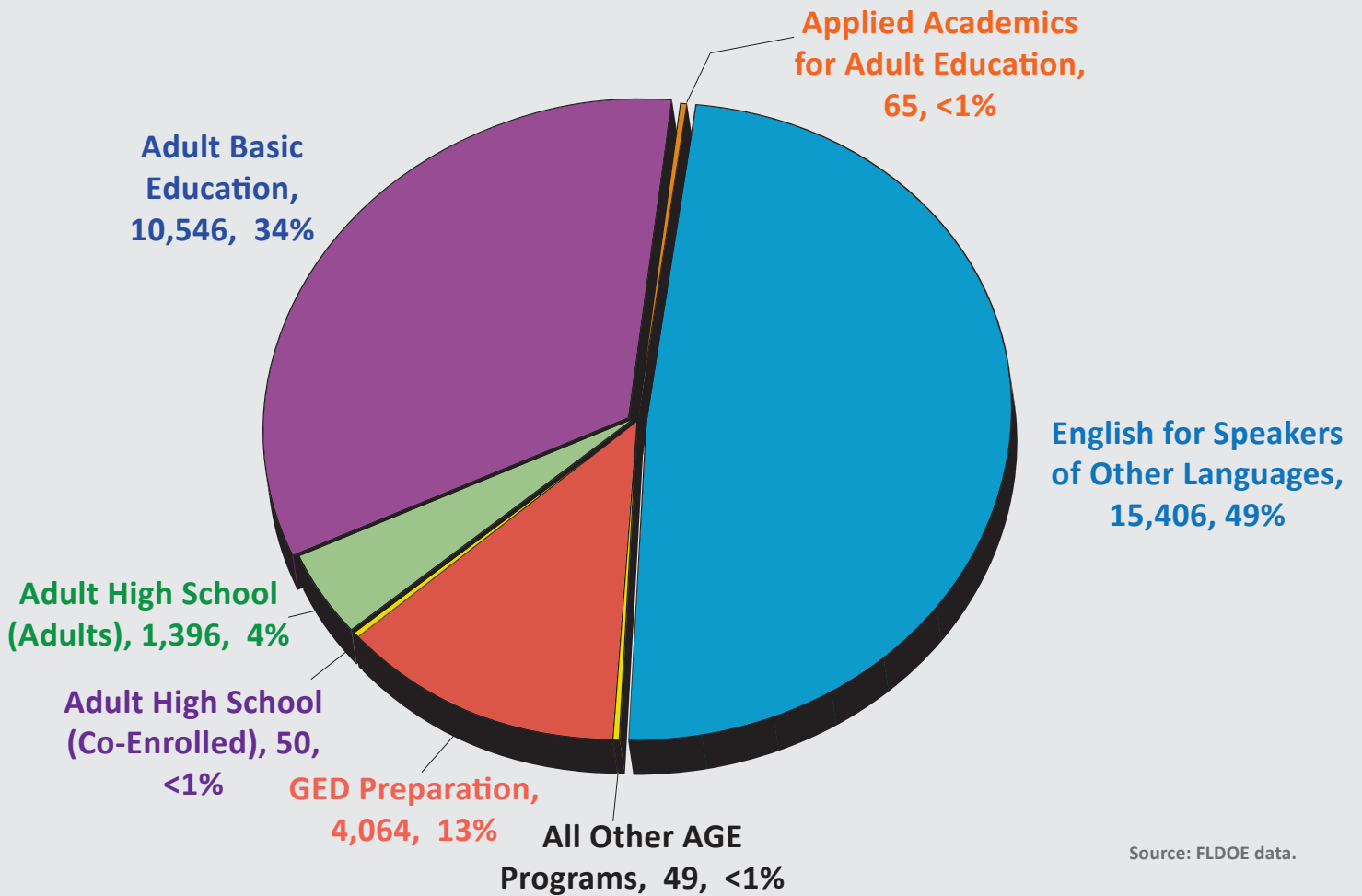

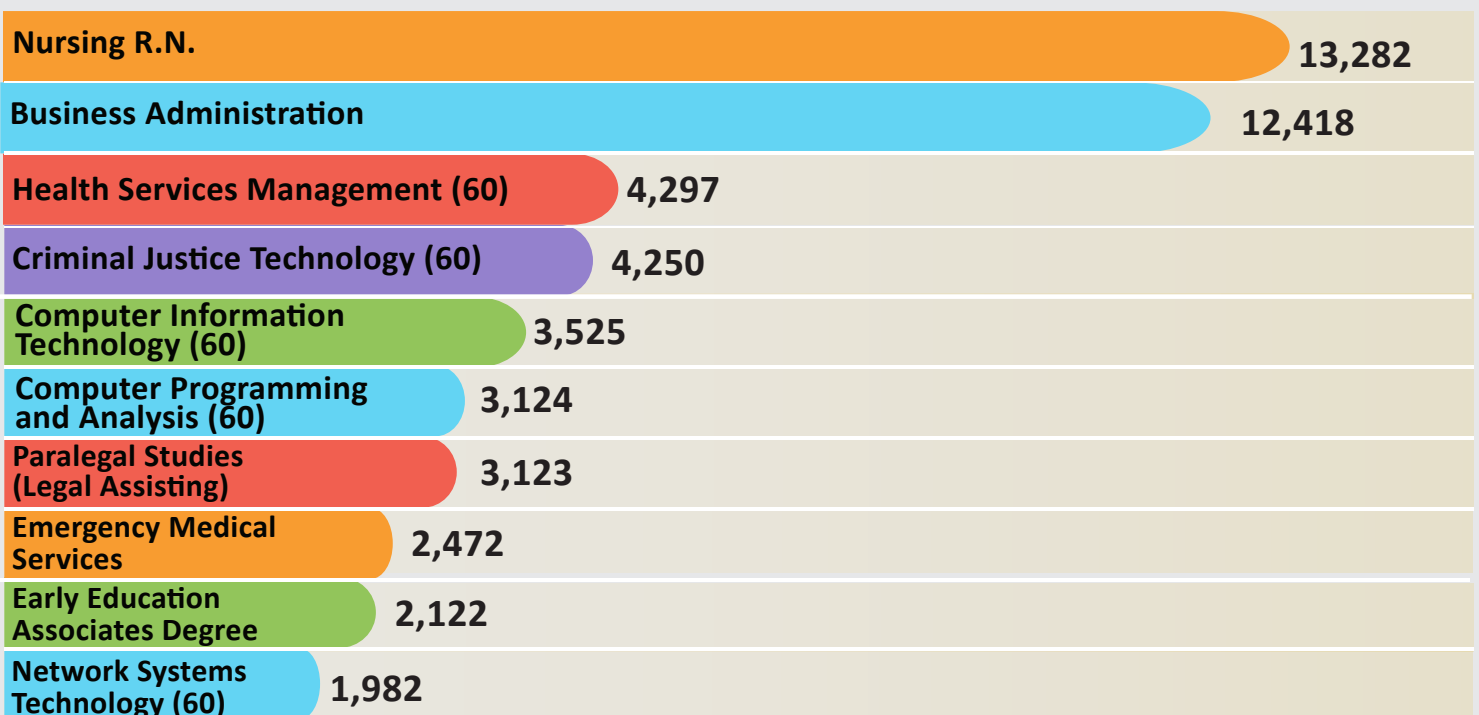

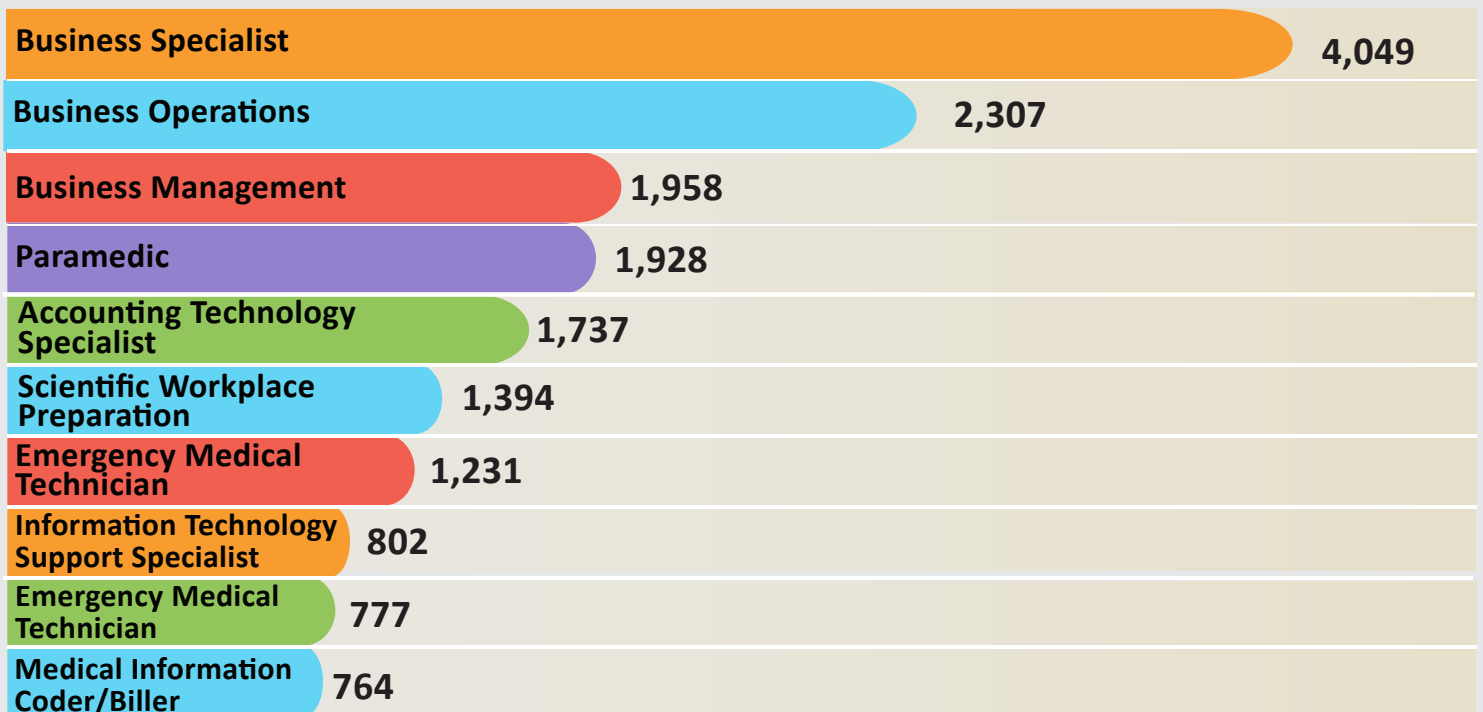
BREAKOUT: STATEWIDE FLORIDA COLLEGE ADULT GENERAL EDUCATION HEADCOUNT BY PROGRAM²

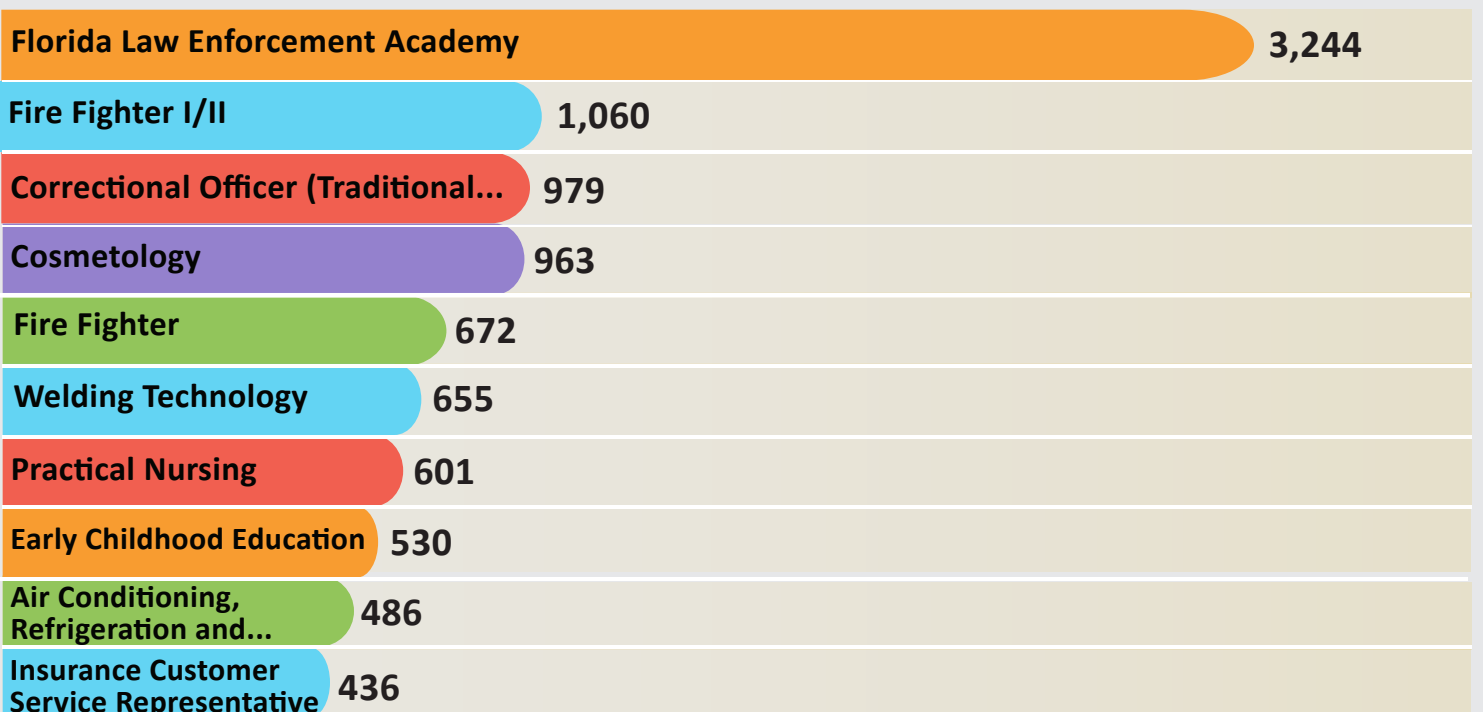

TOP TEN FLORIDA COLLEGE CAREER CERTIFICATE PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS



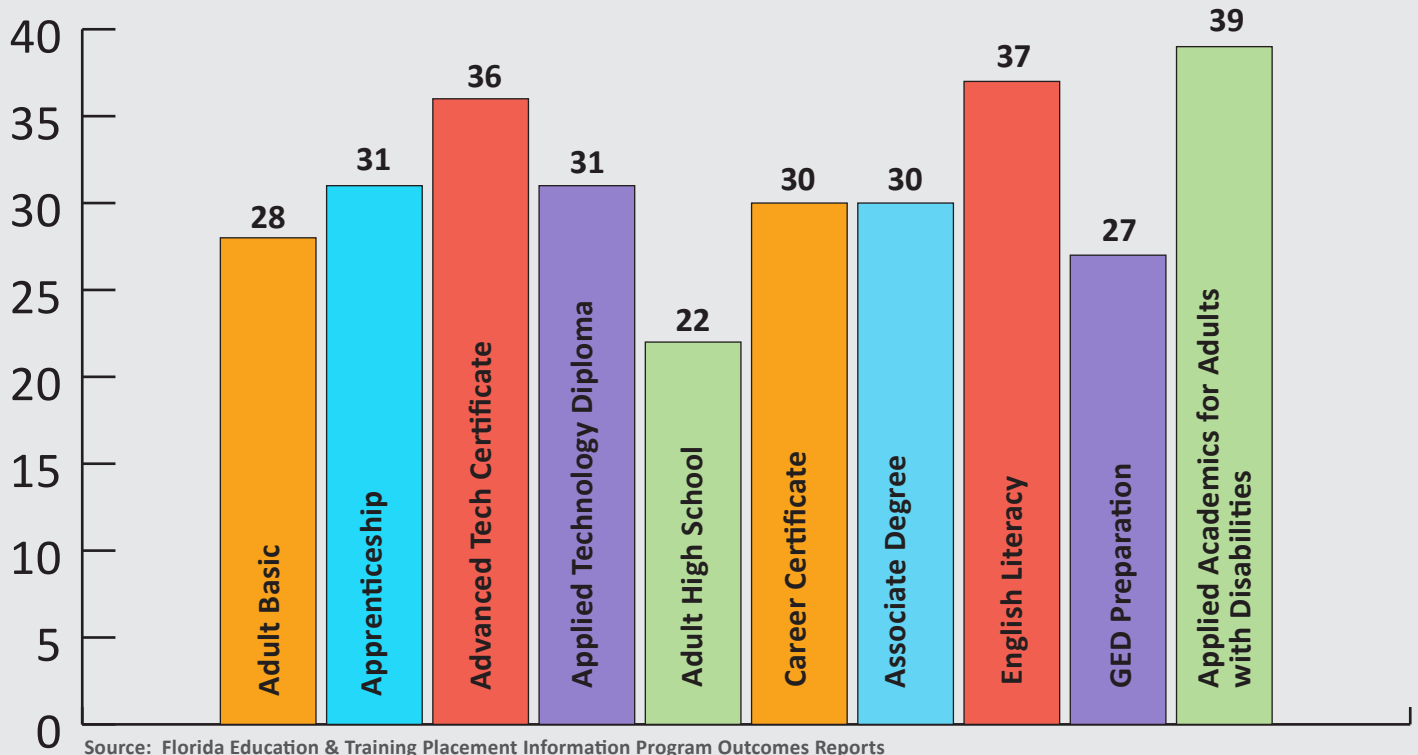
