2016 Authorizer Report

Office of Independent Education and Parental Choice Florida Department of Education

Summary

School districts throughout Florida received 75¹ charter school applications by the statutory deadline of August 2016², continuing a steady decline in new charter proposals to districts that first began in 2012. The number of new applications submitted to districts in this most recent cycle, for instance, is down 46 percent from 2015 and 62 percent from 2014.

Even with fewer applications to review, however, districts approved 41 percent of the proposals they received last year – the same rate of approval seen in 2015. That statewide average masks wide variation in approval rates between districts (*see Findings below*), but it remains the case – as manifest in recent years – that the majority of charter school applications in Florida failed to win approval. Those applications not approved were either denied by their local school board during a publicly noticed meeting or were withdrawn from consideration before the school board acted.

Despite fewer applications, Florida's charter school sector continues to expand. When the 2016-17 school year ended, there were 654 charter schools that served 283,755 students. While that number of new schools represented a modest increase from 2015-16 (when there were 652 charter schools) the number of students served at charters increased 5 percent during that same time period. Moreover, the number of students served at Florida's charter schools has increased 58 percent from the 179,940 reported as enrolled in 2011-12.

Findings

The biggest still account for the most. About half of the 75 charter applications statewide were submitted to four of Florida's largest districts – Miami-Dade (16 applications); Palm Beach (8); Orange County (8); Hillsborough (6).

Approval rates remain the same this year as last year: As recently as 2014, just 25 percent of charter school applications were approved by their local school boards. That changed in 2015 and, now, in 2016, when districts approved a more generous 41 percent of all applications they received.




Figure 1. History of charter school application approval rate

Approval rates vary widely between districts: The 41-percent approval rate statewide masks wide variation between district authorizers. In Miami-Dade County, for instance, the district approved 56 percent of the 16 applications it received, while Palm Beach County approved just 13 percent – or just one – of the eight applications it received. Many of the state's small to medium-sized districts (including Bay, Charlotte, and Osceola counties) approved most if not all of the relative handful of applications they received.

Virtual charters. Only two applications for virtual charter schools were submitted – one to Clay County, and another to Hillsborough County. The applicants withdrew their proposals before their respective district school boards could take action.

Relatively few draft applications. Despite a law enabling applicants to submit a draft application to their school districts for feedback on any material deficiencies, districts received just eight drafts by the statutory deadline of May 1. All but one were later submitted as final applications by August 1 (and three of those final applications were denied by local school districts).

Authorizer development and accountability

The State of Florida once again was the recipient of a sizable grant through the federal Charter Schools Program initiative. The Department was awarded a \$71 million share of this competitive award, in part, through its proposals to enhance charter school authorizing and accountability. Starting in 2016, and going into 2017, the Department has undertaken the following efforts, with more planned in the pipeline of this three-year grant project:

Performance framework: The Department, in collaboration with authorizers, operators, and national experts, is working to develop a statewide charter school performance framework that will provide authorizers, schools, and the public with a standardized set of objective measures to evaluate the academic, financial, and organizational performance of regular (including virtual) and alternative charter schools. Upon completing the framework, the Department will develop a delivery mechanism to allow authorizers, operators, and the public to view each charter school's performance on the measures included in the framework.

Authorizer accountability: The Department, in collaboration with authorizers and national experts, is working to develop a statewide system of authorizer accountability. This will include several in-person meetings with stakeholders.

Florida Leaders in Authorizing: This fellowship program will provide select, high-potential leaders within the Florida authorizing community an opportunity to strengthen and hone their skills in authorizing. The Department aims to partner with the Florida Association of Charter School Authorizers (FACSA) to create this leadership initiative. Participants will have the chance to build their capacity as well as the authorizing community through a train-the-trainer model, in which participants will be expected to disseminate information through FACSA.

Targeted training and support. Through a partnership with the National Association of Charter School Authorizers (NACSA) the Department is planning a series of trainings for authorizers during the next year that will dive deeply into the Florida Principles and Standards of Quality Charter School Authorizing. Additionally, the Department, also through a partnership with NACSA, has helped to train school districts on the best practices of interview techniques so that they can better assess an applicant's capacity to open and operate a high-quality charter school.
