KEY FACTS AND FIGURES

OVERVIEW:

- KIPP Team and Family, Inc. (formerly known as KIPP New Jersey) is the Schools of Hope operator and non-profit charter management organization for the KIPP Miami schools.
- KIPP Miami currently operates two schools in North Miami housed within the Miami-Dade College Campus—one elementary school named KIPP Royalty; and one middle school named KIPP Courage.
- Those two schools enroll over 1,250 students in grades K through 8.
- Plans are underway to open an additional 3 schools in Miami that would roughly double our total enrollment in the city: 1 Elementary, 1 Middle, and 1 High School, with construction of a new building beginning soon.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS:

- 99% students of color
- 100% qualify for F&RL
- 11% English as a second language
- 12% receive SPED services
- 16% of adults have a college degree in the predominant zip code where our students reside.

STUDENT PERFORMANCE:

- **Letter Grades:** KIPP Miami earned a C on the state report card, as it has for the last three consecutive years.
- **Student Performance in Math and ELA:** Over the last three years, KIPP Miami has posted significant year-over-year learning gains that have not yet registered in a higher letter grade, but we expect them to register soon.
 - Over that time, student proficiency in ELA has increased by 11 percentage points and math proficiency increased by 17 points. See Fig. 1.




Figure 2. KIPP Miami - Performance by State Reporting Category

 - Our learning gains scores have been high over the past 2 years and our data indicates that when families choose and stay with KIPP, we have been able to close learning gaps and move students to on grade level performance. See Fig. 2.
- **Early Literacy Scores:** KIPP Miami's youngest students are demonstrating a mastery of literacy on the national DIBELS assessment that bodes well for future performance.
 - KIPP Miami students are outperforming the national average for all test takers on the DIBELS assessment—in both absolute proficiency and growth. See Fig. 3.

FUTURE GROWTH:

- KIPP has also submitted a Notice of Intent to open 5 new schools of hope in Orange County by 2028; the NOI was submitted in August and is in the period of local BOE review.
- At full scale, the network of KIPP schools in Orlando would serve over 2,500 students in grades K-12, primarily in the Holden Heights, Washington Shores, and Parramore communities.

SUMMARY:

- After some early struggles that included opening schools during the pandemic, KIPP Miami's performance has hit a steady upward trajectory over the last three years.
- If it continues at a similar pace, we expect this performance trend to soon earn us a B or higher on the state's accountability system.
