Restraint Data for February 2025 is Now Available

February 2025 data for restraint incidents submitted to the Involuntary Examination, Restraint, and Seclusion (known as IERS) web application is now available. The data have been posted to the Program Accountability, Assessments & Data Systems web page and can be located by scrolling down to the section titled "SWD Restraint Data – SY 2024-25," and selecting the appropriate month. Pursuant to section 1003.573(8), Florida Statutes, "The department shall maintain aggregate data of incidents of restraint and disaggregate the data for analysis by county, school, student exceptionality, and other variables, including the type and method of restraint used. This information shall be updated monthly, deidentified, and made available to the public through the department's website."

Best Practices for Inclusive Education (BPIE) Assessment for Students with Disabilities (SWDs) Reminder

The BPIE assessment is an internal process designed to facilitate the analysis, implementation and improvement practices for SWDs who are served in regular classes. Section 1003.57, Florida Statutes, requires that once every three years, each school district and school complete a BPIE assessment. Florida Inclusion Network (FIN) facilitators are required to assist school districts in this process. The results of this process must be included in each school district's ESE policies and procedures. School BPIE assessments should be completed prior to the end of the school year.
